Elden World is a map that's based on Elden Ring. It will eventually have more than twenty dungeons, castles, special bosses and strong enemies to fight. This map will also recreate the beautiful, treacherous Lands Between.

PlanetMinecraft says that the project is currently at 40%. However, you can download a demo right now to see it in action. The screenshots show an Erdtree and what looks like Margit, Fell Omen, as well as one of the frightening large wondering mausoleums. The gameplay experience seems more focused on the Elden Ring's appearance than the actual gameplay. However, you can always fuse the map with the Elden Ring modpack we wrote about a few months ago.

Theoretically, the two together will make Elden Ring the most immersive experience, aside from the game itself. It's always nice when projects come together. Once it's all over, we look forward to seeing how rich the Elden World map is.
