## The 'Minecraft Earth' Beta Begins Its Global Takeover This Month

We haven't seen much talk about Minecraft Earth in a while. It's an augmented reality version of Mojang's game that turns the world into a playground of your own blocky creations. The company promised that an alpha version of the game would be out in the summer. Now, with a new trailer of the game, the company says it will launch on iOS within the next two weeks. Android will follow "soon thereafter."

The iOS-first launch isn't surprising since we first got a peek at live gameplay during WWDC last month. The trailer gives a lot more information about the game. However, pessoa.info looking at the Apple demo to find out if you have any questions.

You'll have to sign up here for the free game. According to the FAQ, your device should be running iOS 10 or Android 7. Access to the game is limited because they are adjusting load to servers. However, you must be active to play. If you do not play for seven consecutive days, a different player will be able to take your place. You'll need an account with Microsoft or Xbox Live account to register after which once you've signed up there's nothing else to do except wait, and then get ready to build.
