Vaishno Devi

All year long people flock here to take the blessings of Goddess Durga. The temple houses three natural rock formations which are worshipped by the pilgrims. Tirumala Venkateswara Temple

Raised by the fourth Sikh Guru, Ramdass Sahib Ji, it is the most popular Sikh pilgrimage site in the country. The most famed and sacred part of the Golden Temple complex is the Hari Mandir that features a stunning golden edifice at the center of a large body of water. The Gurudwara has witnessed many events in the history but it still stands high with pride. People come here to soothe their worldly tensions in its peaceful aura mingling with spirituality.

Sarnath

Sarnath is situated just 12 km from the city of Varanasi. It is a known religious site for Buddhists where they come to meditate and connect with the almighty. It is believed that after receiving enlightenment in Bodhgaya, the Buddha went to Sarnath. There he taught what he learned and the event was marked as "the turning of the wheel of the Dharma". Though most of the ancient buildings at Sarnath were ruined by the Turks, one can still find the ruins the Dharmekh Stupa here which impresses everyone with their beautiful work. Also, the Ashoka Pillar at Sarnath is a great attraction that charms travelers with its interesting carvings and legendary history.

Moinuddin Chishti

Moinuddin Chishti is a much popular and visited dargah located in Ajmer. Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti was a renowned Sufi saint in Indian Subcontinent. Today not only Muslim pilgrims, but Hindus and Sikhs also pay visit to this holy destination. It is believed that that dargah makes everyone wishes come true.
