

Handheld Vacuums - Cleaning Your Home More Efficiently

Handheld vacuums are an all-time favorite of many consumers, but do they actually deliver? The truth is that some hand vacs simply don't live up to their hype. However, even the best models come with an unfortunate downside. Namely, they can be quite heavy and difficult to use. That's why it's important to know which features are important when you buy a hand vacuum cleaner, especially if you're buying it online.

If you're looking for a lightweight vacuum that you can easily manipulate while standing up, you'll probably prefer cordless handheld vacuums. Cordless handheld vacuums are almost always less expensive than their corded cousins, and have enough suction power to remove most dirt without too much effort. The least expensive ones, such as a Black+ Decker Dustbuster, will cost around \$50, while top-level cordless vacuums, such as the Black+Decker Max Flex can go as high as \$1000.

Of course, most cordless canines come with a standard, cord-free cord. In fact, the only drawback of cordless is that it means you'll need to carry the unit with you wherever you go, and that could get a bit annoying. Thankfully, there are plenty of good cordless dustbenders on the market, including the Hitachi Dustbuster and the Trilobite MaxSonic. These two models have powerful motors and a powerful cleaning power, which means you can clean more areas with one hour of battery time.

Another feature you should look for in cordless handheld vacuum cleaners is a cordless attachment. Attachments usually attach to the canister, so you can use it wherever you like. For example, you can attach it to a belt loop on your pants or shirt, or even to the belt loop in your office chair. And since cordless vacuum models are now much more affordable, an attachment is certainly worth the extra investment.

Handheld vacuums can also be used to clean crumbs off couches, tables, chairs, floors, stairs and other surfaces. This can be a great way to avoid clutter from building up again, or to prevent the formation of new clutter. One of the problems with regular vacuuming is that crumbs tend to cling to the inside walls of your cleaner, which can make it difficult to access the bottom of furniture. Handheld vacuums eliminate this problem because they have crumbs collectors built right into the attachments.



Pet hair also tends to become tangled in your regular vacuum cleaner's hose. But using handheld vacuums to vacuum pet hair and dander can be much easier and less damaging to your carpet or rug. You simply pick up the wand of your cleaner, and start dragging it down the length of your carpet, and it will keep moving in a circular pattern. That will remove a lot of the pet hair, along with the crumbs that tend to accumulate on the floor.

The best models have a power cord that is at least 12 inches long, so that the cord can reach all the way to the back of the cleaner. And most of the time, the power cord should be plugged into an outlet, rather than being run through a power cord. here This makes it much easier to reach all of the controls, whether you want to vacuum or sweep. Power corded handheld vacuums often have special attachments that you cannot get with a cord-operated model.

In addition to being much easier to use, Handheld Vacuums also do a better job of actually cleaning your carpets and rugs. Most models have brushes that are shaped in the form of a vacuum cleaner, but they also have a powerful suction that allows them to pick up much more debris than a regular vacuum cleaner would. But even the best hand held vacuums still have a long cords that make it hard to reach behind furniture. Some of the newest cordless ones have rechargeable batteries, which allows you to clean more areas if you have more carpets or rugs to clean. The cordless cleaners are also much lighter than their corded counterparts, which makes it easier to move them from one room to another. All of these features, combined, make them an excellent choice for anybody who is looking for a way to clean their home without having to use a bulky power cord.
