

Maternal & Newborn Care Enhanced Skills Program Competency Based Learning Objectives

- 1. Conduct preconception counselling involving complex issues including thrombophilias, prior back and abdominal surgeries, cardiac issues, diabetes, hypertension, obesity, and psychiatric disorders
- 2. Manage antenatal patients including counselling, investigation and potentially treatment of thrombophilias, thyroid disorders, gestational hypertension, gestational diabetes, fibroids, VBAC, previous surgeries, depression, hematologic disorders.
- 3. Manage antenatal patients including counselling regarding screening tests, and techniques to monitor and assess maternal and fetal wellbeing including early risk assessment, screening and ultrasound/biophysical profile.
- Manage patients requiring induction of labour for the following indications: post dates gestational diabetes, gestational hypertension/pre-eclampsia, abnormal fetal surveillance, oligohydramnios, SGA, VBAC, intrauterine deaths, advanced maternal age
- Manage labours including those complicated by gestational diabetes, gestational hypertension/pre-eclampsia, SGA, oligohydramnios, failure to progress, atypical and abnormal fetal heart rate monitoring
- 6. Perform vacuum assisted delivery (forceps delivery if appropriate)
- 7. Demonstrate 5 techniques to deal with shoulder dystocia
- 8. Manage a post partum hemorrhage including discussion of 4 possible medical therapies
- 9. Distinguish causes of antepartum hemorrhage and initiate management
- 10. Diagnose and initiate management of a cord prolapse
- 11. Repair a second degree tear, vaginal and peri-urethral tears.
- 12. Diagnose a third/fourth degree tear, and demonstrate steps involved in repair
- 13. Demonstrate the surgical skills required to assist at a caesarean section
- 14. Diagnose and manage post partum complications including infection, DVT/PE, depression
- 15. Perform neonatal resuscitation including indications of respiratory depression, meconium aspiration prevention
- 16. Assess, diagnose and initiate management of the ill newborn including potential sepsis, hypoglycemia, respiratory distress syndrome, meconium aspiration, and issues relating to late preterm infants
- 17. Assess and manage abnormal breast feeding patterns
- 18. Demonstrate a frenotomy
- 19. Demonstrate interprofessional communication and collaboration
- 20. Demonstrate triage skills and management decisions regarding antepartum and intrapartum care in context of rural setting, including consideration of transport from and to other care settings
- 21. Design a new maternity clinic for a rural/regional center, considering referral base and patient recruitment strategies, model of care, physician workload management, interprofessional collaboration with at least one discipline and financial reimbursement of providers.
