2016 ... Are two-time PSA Edy Award winners ... Won Team USA's Team of the Month three times ... Are three-time World medalists (2011, 2016, 2017).

Maia and Alex were born in New York City and Boston, respectively ... Currently reside in Ann Arbor, Michigan where they graduated from Huron High School (Ann Arbor) in 2009 and 2012 ... both are currently students at the University of Michigan ...
