Study 11

Read 3 John 1-8

Central Teaching- Show hospitality worthy of God to brethren, even strangers, who are walking in the truth.

Key Verse- 4

Ten things this passages says-

- 1. John loved Gaius in truth.
- 2. He prayed that Gaius would prosper and be in good health in all respects.
- 3. He prayed that Gaius' health would prosper as his soul prospered.
- 4. Brethren spoke well of Gaius, because he was walking in the truth.
- 5. John's greatest joy came when he heard his children were walking in the truth.
- 6. Gaius was acting faithfully in everything he accomplished towards the brethren; especially towards strangers.
- 7. Those he had ministered to testified to Gaius' love before the church.
- 8. We should treat those we are showing hospitality to in a manner worthy of God.
- 9. People who are truly serving the Lord are doing it for His Name, not their own gain.
- 10. When we support men who are motivated by truth, we are fellow workers in that truth with them.

What does this passage teach us about God?

He loves in truth.

He desires us to pray for physical, as well as spiritual well-being.

He rejoices when we speak well of each other.

He rejoices when we walk in the truth.

He is faithful.

He is not a respecter of persons. Brethren and strangers alike receive equal treatment.

He rewards those in supporting roles (such as hospitality) in the ministry, as well as those out in the forefront.
