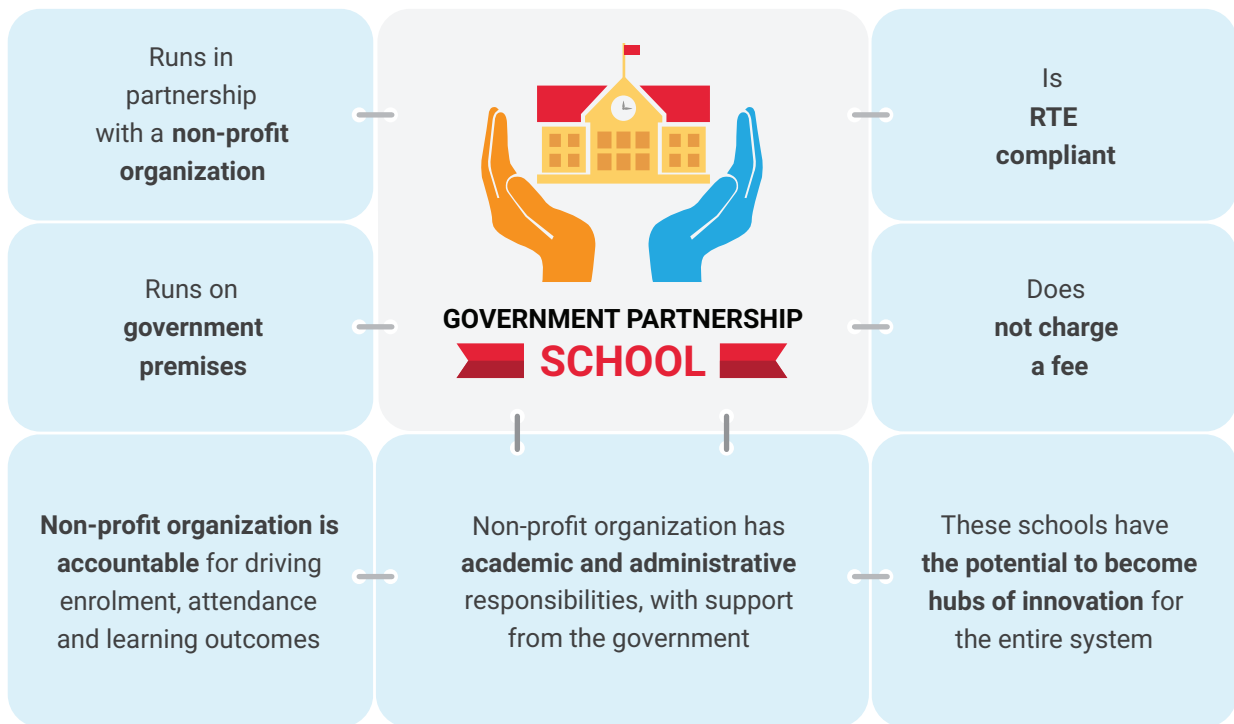

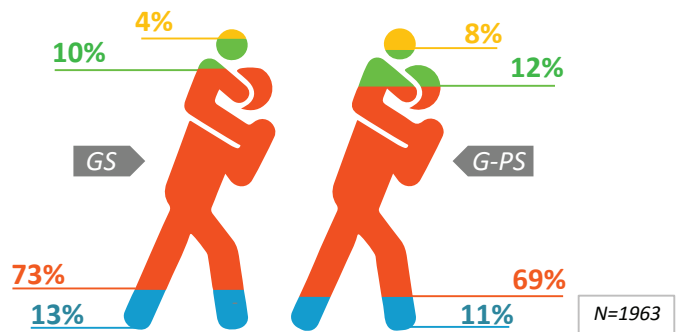
Government-Partnership Schools and Government Schools serve EWS families with similar demographic profiles

Most parents are educated up to Class 10

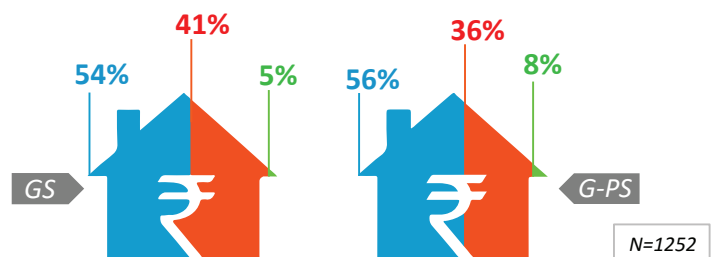

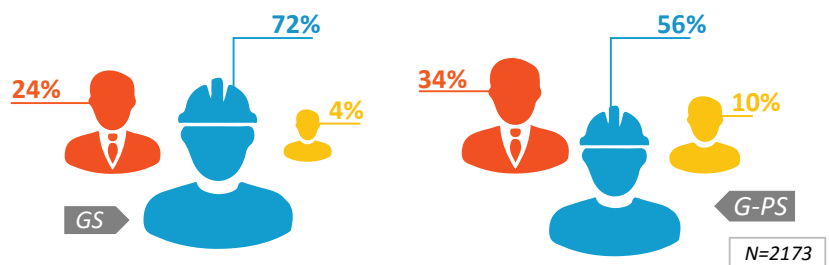

The gap in learning outcomes increases in higher standards (Grade 5 v/s 3). Hence, it is important for a long term focus and commitment to see positive impact



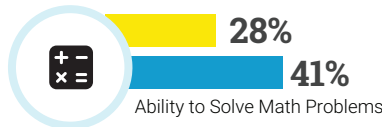
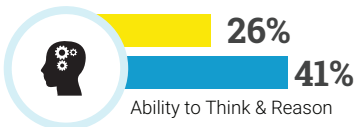
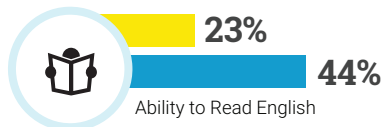
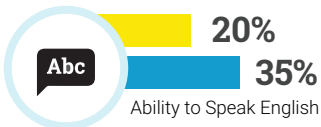

1. The scores above have been assessed using the Indian Progressive Assessment Scale (IPAS) which measures student knowledge against grade appropriate benchmarks. It also allows for the measurement of increase in knowledge across grades through a scaled scoring system for each subject.

Parents of G-PS are more satisfied despite spending the same. Hence, G-PS are in high demand

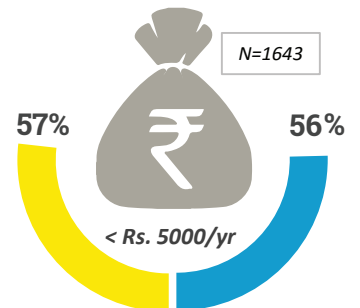

Government-Partnership Schools receive between **1.5 to 3** times the **number of applications** as compared to the capacity of the school

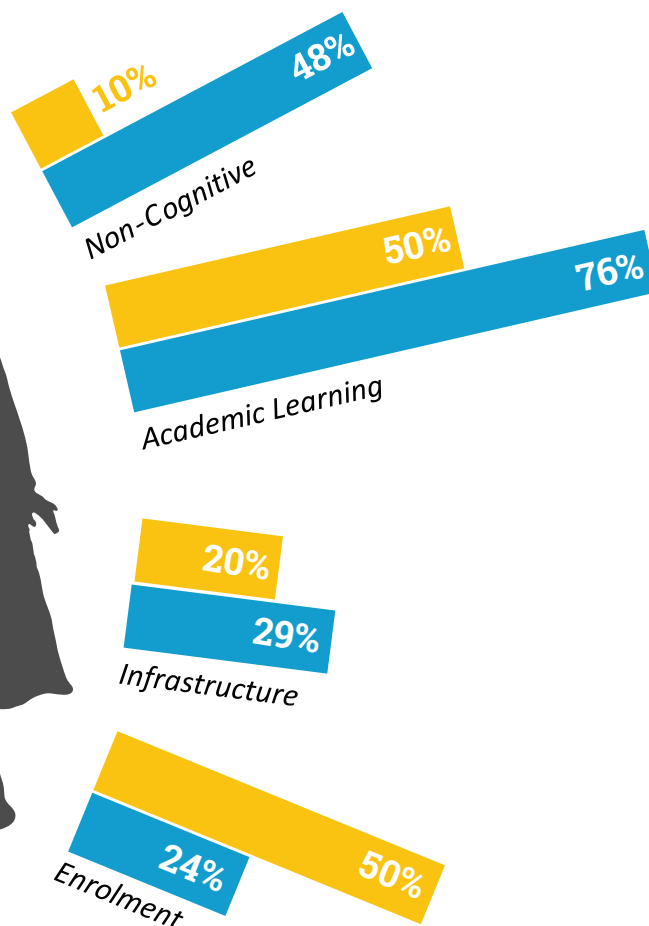
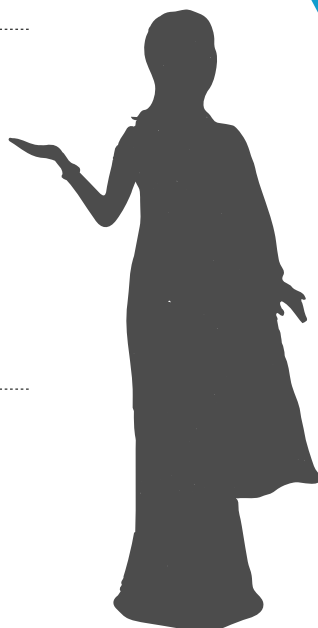

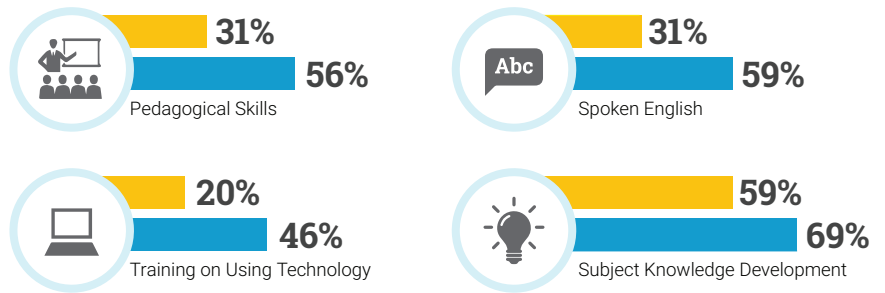

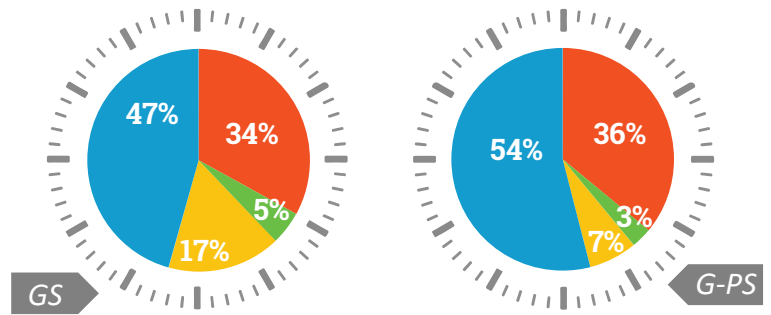


Percentage of Teachers Trained in the Last Two Years

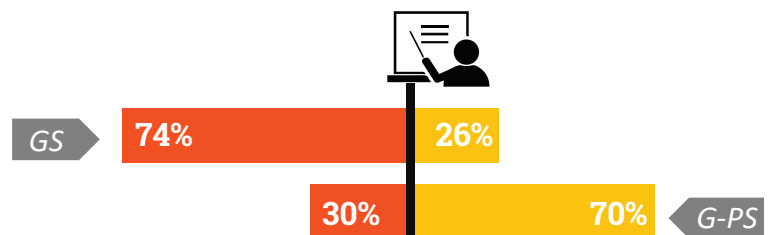


Split of Time on Various Activity Types (% Time, Grade 3)

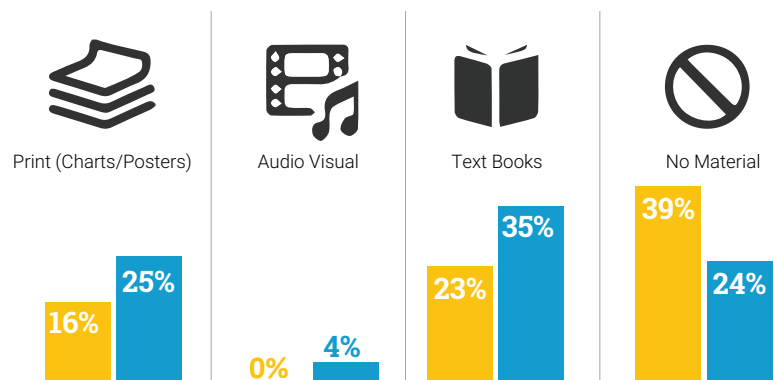
