Eliot Higgins' fight for the prerogative of interpretation



of the events leading up to a possible world war

Today Eliot Higgins tweeted:



He suggests that no other interpretation of the events is possible. Nevertheless, he – as always – neglects a lot of essential questions e.g. regarding the context of that war, the motif and so on. He in a highly likely british manner blames Assad, Russia, the usual suspects and so on ...


Higgins argument 1 – not enough time:



There were several airstrikes that day. First allegations about chemical attacks were published at about 4:30pm. Only 2 images of alleged victims of the first CW attack exists. The image shows 2 children. One of it has a respirator.



The CW allegation came right at the time when the White Helmets posted videos of their rescue efforts in dense dust.




Breathing problems and red eyes might be common in this situation. At the same time "Said Rajeh (pseudonym), a member of the civil defense civil defense crews, told the VDC" that he smelled chlorine. No further prove of a chemical attack can be found so far.

Later that day another anonym source and the head of the SAMS hospital (probably living in Turkey at that time) reported another chemical attack in Douma but at 7:30pm and in a different place. It is unclear if the same anonym source shared his information with the VDC and Dr. Kuttoub. If so then only one anonym source spread the news about symptoms of organophosphates.

Dr. Katoub tweeted 7:00pm:



And reported the attack to the VDC. The VDC cited him and one anonym doctor:



This attack maybe turned out to be not a chemical attack and wasn't reported at any later time.

It seems to be likely that the 7:30pm attack caused a fire in a basement and numerous choking victims as later reported by two members of the medical stuff at the SAMS hospital.




The still living victims were moved to the SAMS hospital where the medical team saw no symptoms of a chemical attack.

If – hypothetically – the dead bodies from that basement and the surrounding area were moved to an empty house (that later became the scene of the alleged chemical attack) then 2 hours were plenty of time to move the bodies.



Any earlier decision to fake a organophosphates attack would have given more time for preparations but there are reasons to believe that – hypothetically – everything was arranged in a hurry.

The first images from inside the house were published at 11:09pm shortly followed by Dr. Katoub (SAMS, source of VDC) at 11:14pm who reported the symptoms of a 7:30pm attack to the VDC and now reports a 3rd attack and victims in a basement.



A few minutes later at 11:26pm the Chicago based Dr. Zaher Sahloul tweeted the image. The White Helmets published the same images more that half an hour later.



Note: No victim was found in the basement of the allegedly attacked house.

Note: 7 minutes after Dr. Katoub (head of SAMS) published the images of the alleged victims the SAMS hospital tweeted a final tweet addressed to the US, UK, HRW and the Syrian opposition saying:



The Douma Medical Center is the SAMS hospital in Eastern Ghouta. As proven by the videos taken inside the hospital showing the "decontamination of victims of the chemical attack" the hospital was neither damaged nor out of duty. So, either the videos were shot earlier, or the hospital was cleared right before the first alleged victims possibly arrived.

If someone planned a fake "decontamination" then this move was about to clear the scene for the show. Indeed, this is exactly what the images suggest.







Higgins argument 2 – a problem to place the chlorine cylinder



The problem doesn't exist.

In the night of the alleged attack a team of White Helmets, fighters and photographers stormed into that building without any protection.

They acted like being the first at the scene documenting the horror. Only one White Helmet had a gas mask but no gloves. He is the only one who was pictured by this team e.g. with a dead baby.

The unprotected photographer was also seen at the scene when the dead bodies were removed from that building. He shows no signs of some intoxication.



The White Helmet without gloves holding a baby the after the photo was replaced on top of the pile of bodies. This photo quickly was used for the White Helmets propaganda.




The most crucial moment of that nightly visit is the moment the team hurried up to the 3rd floor of the building. There the camera pans up to the ceiling and shows a hole in reinforced concrete roof to "document" the entry of some weapon.




In fact, the hole doesn't look like max. 2 hours old. The crucial point is, that no yellow gas cylinder is blocking the sight onto the white side of the balcony above (illuminated white by the spot light mounted on the camera).

3D model of the scene with a gas cylinder:




The bodies were removed the next morning ~11:00am on April 8.

The Russian inspection arrived at about 3:00pm April 9 at the scene and found – according to their statement – nothing that proves a chemical attack.

The statement of the Russian inspection was published on April 10 in the morning.

In the evening of April 10 at 9:06pm the White Helmets published a video shot at 7:02pm the same day to provide the evidence for a yellow chlorine cylinder that allegedly was dropped by a helicopter

and damaged the roof of the house. The major problem with this video is that the video taken at night from below shows no yellow cylinder in the very same hole.



But there is more to say about the timeline. About one hour before the Russian inspection arrived at the house Eliot Higgins tweeted a screenshot of a video that also shows the yellow cylinder in that hole. Shortly afterwards he deleted that tweet allegedly for the security of the provider.




The screenshot proves that the cylinder either was moved between the Higgins screenshot and the later White Helmet video or the White Helmets video shows an entirely different cylinder.



The later published White Helmet cylinder:



The video (screenshot deleted by Higgins) appears to be shot between 12:00 and 13:00 either the same day on April 9 or at any other day before.



However, not just the cylinder was moved but also the metal lattice in the foreground. Some tools disappeared, and a red curtain wasn't visible before. So, the question is why there was no cylinder visible in the night of the incident and why the Russian inspection didn't find it.

Furthermore, a 70kg (when filled) steel cylinder dropped from a reasonable height that punched a circular hole (at 160mph or more) into the reinforced concrete wouldn't bounce back to land on the roof just balanced on a bowed metal stick without visible deformation. Note, the same force that acted on the concrete acted also on the cylinder.

Higgins argument 3 – the rooms were damaged



No, certainly not. Since the physics suggest that the hole was punched by a different projectile and the damage looks old it is "highly likely" that the house was chosen because of that hole.

A second video linked by Higgins shows questionable physics too. In that video taken at an unknown location a yellow cylinder allegedly penetrated the ceiling, bounced and landed on a bed. This cylinder lacks any deformation too and even the valve (penetrating first, hitting the ground first) is intact.



All forces would act on the valve first:



Note that the carpet is on top of the fins while some rubble is on top of the carpet. This suggests that the yellow cylinder was placed on the bed and some rubble was thrown on it afterwards.



The commentator of this obviously staged chemical attack even mentions the greenish color of the bed as prove for the chemical that ran over the bed.



It isn't clear how a yellow greenish gas can color fabric and wood in a greenish-yellow tint. The best explanation is a selective color-correction using professional video editing software.

However, a second video taken in the same room shows a very different color:



Higgins argument 4 – why two different locations



The reason seems to be obvious: to provide the proper evidence requested by Higgins, the US State department, the media and millions of people. The green-bed video was shot by a young activist who fights against the alleged chemical weapons use. He might be the right one to ask this question. Why, especially during the last day of jihadist power?



Higgins argument 5 – all the accounts must be right



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The danger / fear of a future chemical attack was around since the Khan Sheikhoun incident.

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An article written in March "Four days to declare a Cold War" by Thierry Meyssan has this to say:



Although it has the fourth largest army in the world, the United Kindom is unable to defy Russia without the support of allies. It therefore has to invent a casus belii to make its partners react and lead them to stand beside it.

The British government and certain of its allies, including US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson, have attempted to launch a Cold War against Russia.

Their plan was to fabricate an attack against an ex-double agent in Salisbury and at the same time a chemical attack against the « moderate rebels » in the Ghouta. The conspirators' intention was to profit from the efforts of Syria to liberate the suburbs of its capital city and the disorganisation of Russia on the occasion of its Presidential election. Had these manipulations worked, the United Kingdom would have pushed the USA to bomb Damascus, including the Presidential palace, and demand that the United Nations General Assembly exclude Russia from the Security Council.

Once the news of a chemical attack was spread on a day like this full of airstrikes, dust and death one can easily create a panic that in return creates hundreds of "witnesses". Ake Sellström, former head of the OPCW delegation to Ghouta had this to say:

GW: Do some of these 'mistaken' claims make it more difficult to assess the more likely ones? That they are either 'crying wolf' because they have been asked to, or because chlorine or some kind of obscurant has been released. Does this make it harder to pick out the likely ones?

AS: Yes, and we realised in this investigation that we needed to invest in some science and technology. You can get many symptoms from other items in a war: phosphorous smoke, tear gas, many of these devices in a battlefield scenario will affect the lungs, eyes and give you respiratory problems. Also, in any theatre of war, people will claim that they are intoxicated - we saw it in Palestine, Afghanistan and everywhere else. No-one knows what happened, but we need to be better at differential diagnostics on the intoxication, better medical markers. The people who made the allegations had poor background material to give to the Secretary General;

Higgins argument 6 – all the reporters...



The "some form of collaboration" is explained above.

Note that the VDC cited an anonymous doctor while the second source of the VDC – the head of the SAMS hospital – also was told by an anonymous doctor. The SAMS hospital officially was destroyed and out of duty. This is what one witness has to tell:





His account perfectly fits the appearance of the scenario filmed in the allegedly destroyed hospital.

On the other side we observe some journalists who think the can smell a chemical attack days later in refugee camp dozens of miles away.





So, yes, there is some kind of a collaboration between them. Eliot Higgins and Bellingcat are an essential part of it.

Higgins argument 7 – the spotted helicopters




There is little doubt that even helicopters played a role in the airstrikes that day. The question is, was there a chemical attack or not?

The Indian Times reported already at 10:00am Syrian time two helicopters in the air.



Since the spotters are clearly nor an independent unbiased source, their account might be motivated especially in the last minutes of jihadist rule.



The next day Dr. Zaher Sahloul, the Chicago based Ex-SAMS doctor, spread the news of the flightplan of the helicopter still stressing that it dropped sarin.

Is he the source – the anonymous doctor – who reported the use of organophosphates? Or is his source the same anonymous doctor who reported the use of organophosphates to the VDC? Who tweeted that the hospital is "out of duty" and why?

However, no secondary contamination was reported. The images from the working hospital do not suggest the use of sarin.

The US bombed alleged sarin production facilities in Damascus, but no one was poisoned. The OPCW visited that facility on March 23, 2018.

11. In accordance with paragraph 11 of Council decision EC-83/DEC.5, the second round of inspections at the Barzah and Jamrayah facilities of the SSRC was concluded on 22 November 2017. The results of the inspections were reported as an addendum (EC-87/DG.15/Add.1, dated 28 February 2018) to the report entitled "Status of Implementation of Executive Council Decision EC-83/DEC.5 11 November 2016)" (EC-87/DG.15, dated 23 February 2018). The analysis of samples taken during the inspections did not indicate the presence of scheduled chemicals in the samples, and the inspection team did not observe any activities inconsistent with obligations under the Convention during the second round of inspections at the Barzah and Jamrayah facilities.
