Good evening. I am deeply honored and humbled to be a special guest at the Financial Management Association UHD Fall 2019 Banquet.

When I received the invite, I thought: What words of wisdom will I share? I was so thrilled to have the opportunity to talk to all of you and at the same time, I felt the responsibility to share parts of my own story and the lessons I learned thought my life.

As a child, I had a dream of getting an international education from a great university. This dream was especially far from my reach since I was born and raised in Ecuador to a Swiss father and an Ecuadorian mother, and the great universities I dreamed of, were here in the US.

I enrolled at the Universidad Catolica de Santiago de Guayaquil in Ecuador. Out of 1,200 applicants, I was one of only 120 who made the cut. That was only the first part of the battle. I had to figure out how to pay for university. I had to find work and at 17 I started my first full time job.

By my third year of college, I was a bank manager and a model college student. But, my life was turned upside down. When I was 20 years old, my father suddenly passed away. We had to learn to deal with the shock of the loss and a very complicated situation. To compound the sadness I felt, I was the only person in my family that was working. My salary was good for a single student living at home, but it was not enough for a breadwinner in a family. I applied for a second job with the same bank and negotiated with them. I offered to do both jobs for half the value of the second position, which meant I would do double the work for 3/4 what it should cost them. This boost of income gave my family time to find jobs to support themselves.

The future became uncertain, but I kept my faith that a better future could be built despite the difficulties. I continued working full-time while taking classes full-time and finished my degree. I graduated with a Business Engineering degree with emphasis in Management. I am also the first female college graduate of my family.

However, my business degree was not enough; I wanted more. I returned to my dream and came to the US in 1996 to continue my education. With 2 scholarships through my work at Danzas, I received a Master's in International Business in 2002 from University of St. Thomas. By that time, I was an American citizen. Then in 2007, I completed a Certificate of Organizational Leadership from Rice University. I could not believe I had achieved my dream to study at TWO great American Universities.

After graduation, I continued working with the Logistic company: Danzas and went through 7 complicated mergers. Later the company was named DHL Global Forwarding and finally Deutsche Post DHL Supply Chain. I was with them for almost 20 years. One key element of my longevity with DHL is to make the uncertainty of mergers into a positive, instead of negative. I embraced the uncertainty and stayed, while others left.

My area of expertise was Business Financial & Controlling. At the height of my Corporate career, I was the Global Director of Strategy, Performance and Metrics and Controllership based out of Bonn, Germany. I was overseeing 140,000 employees and travelling all over the world, working in wonderful places such as: India, Germany, Switzerland, Hong Kong, Brazil, Uruguay, UK, Mexico, and many others.

Having worked overseas and with so many people I learned to respect, admire, and enjoy our similarities. Be open and embrace our amazing diversity. We are entitled to have different points of view. Disagree with courtesy and respect. Be inclusive and find a share ground that will benefit all. Try new things, travel to different places, eat new food, listen to great music, and enjoy!

In 2016, I wanted to have a bigger impact and I founded Soledad Tanner Consulting, LLC a Business & Financial Management Consulting firm which helps improve profit & productivity of businesses. We support professionals, businesses, and Corporations with solutions, knowledge, and expertise to grow efficiently and stay competitive in the market, optimizing businesses and achieving goals.

I started my financial services business with the faith that other needed my knowledge and experience. My business is a vehicle for my truth about how education leads to knowledge and experience, which can open you up to lead a life of adventure and growth. Particularly, for me this is about the financial sector and how when we are educated about how our money works, we can make better decisions about how to grow it.

Many entrepreneurs struggle because they know their trade, but they do not have the time, experience, or expertise to be business-savvy.
