- 3. Why is prayer so vital in our lives? What does it produce? How often do you pray before you speak or post? What is something that you could do to help prayer be a filter for you? How would prayer change your communication if you did that? Explain.
- 4. What does steadfast prayer look like? How is it continual, proactive, and constant in nature? Does this reflect your prayer life? If so, how? If not, how can you develop this kind of prayer life? Why does Paul encourage us to be watchful in prayer? Why is thanksgiving so important? When

you are thankful in your prayer who are you not focused on? Why s it important to take the focus off of yourself? How can it bring a healthy perspective?

Are your prayers evangelistic? If someone were to only be able to observe your social media footprint, would they know that you are a believer? Would others be encouraged or discouraged by what you post? Does it bring glory to God? Does it point people to Jesus?
