

Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (Winter semester 2017)

Subject to sufficient enrolment and budgetary restrictions, the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences may appoint several instructors to teach one **or** both of **University 1500 and University 1010** in Winter 2016. Administered from the office of the First Year Success Program, Faculty of HSS, these courses will be offered independently of the Program in the Winter semester. Graduate qualifications to at least Master's level are required. Preference will be given to candidates who have experience working with first year students in academic contexts and who are familiar with student support services. An interest in e-learning and blended delivery modes will be an asset.

Letters of applications for these positions, along with curriculum vitae, a teaching dossier, and the names and contact information of two referees, should be submitted electronically or in hard copy by **Thursday, November 10, 2016**. All required information must be received before applications will be considered; applicants are responsible for ensuring that their application files are complete.

University 1010: The University Experience introduces students to the different modes of enquiry that one finds in the University, the interrelatedness of knowledge and the role of the University in society. It also provides students with tools and techniques of study and research that can lead them to academic success and fulfilling careers.

University 1500: Introduction to Critical Reading and Writing in University introduces students to some of the processes, techniques and standards of university-level critical reading and writing. Students will engage in the practices of critical reading and pre-writing, drafting, revising and editing texts. An emphasis will be placed on using writing in response to critical reading exercises.
