Vacant Lot In Thompson Square To Be Developed

Development of the vacant lot at 127 Main Street, located behind the Charlestown Liquor store at Thompson Square, was the topic of discussion at a recent Charlestown Preservation Society Design Review

Committee meeting when developer Dick Held and his attorney, Michael LoPresti, presented plans for the site. Held, who has owned the property since 1976, plans to construct twenty-one condominium units and two retail stores

with twenty-two deeded parking spaces.  
The four-story, 44 foot high structure will extend between Main and Warren Streets with two parking entrances on the Warren Street side and two professional-type offices located on Main Street.

LoPresti stated that the building will be constructed of brick veneer with wood trim and have a slate Mansard sloping roof. It will have a Victorian, nineteenth century appearance to conform with the abutting buildings. Each unit will consist of two bedrooms and one bath. Additional features include bay windows, a working fireplace, trash compactor and central air conditioning. The building will be serviced by an

elevator and a laundry facility will be located on the first floor for the tenants convenience. A roof terrace will also be added for the availability of the occupants.

There are no set-backs on either Warren or Main Street, with the structure right to the sidewalk. A twelve foot space between the new building and the liquor store and a three foot space between the existing structure on Main Street is planned. The construction of a one story addition beside the law offices of McCullough, Stievator and Polvere was discussed as a possibility in the future.

The units will range between 850 and 1,000 square feet in size and the estimated cost for each unit, according to Held, will be "just under \$200,000." The parking garage will contain six spaces on the ground level and the remaining spaces will be located one level underground. The center of the building on Main Street will have bow windows and the main entrance will be centered and set back. Wrought iron grating will be placed at both ends of the building at the liquor store side to help dress up this area and hide the dumpster that will be placed there to service both the complex and store.

Concerns were raised as to the height of the proposed structure on Warren Street, where existing buildings are only three stories high. Also mentioned was the twelve foot space allocation in the plans behind the liquor store for deliveries and dumpster removal. It was felt that this space would not be sufficient and would cause traffic tie-ups on Main Street when large trailer trucks must make deliveries and pickups at the store. Held and his development partner, Paul Kelly, were confident that this would not create a problem, but were reminded that the sidewalks on Main Street will be widened and roadway narrowed when the reconstruction of Main Street is completed, thus creating a reduced area for large trucks to park for any length of time.

The Warren Street side of the building created much concern from those in attendance because of its appearance. This was taken under consideration by the developer who assured the committee that new plans would be designed with their suggestions in mind and be presented at a public meeting before the Charlestown Neighborhood Council.

The meeting will take place with the Development and Housing Committee on Wednesday, June 17 at 7:30 p.m. at the Knights of Columbus Hall, 75 West School Street.

The Board of Appeals will hear the developer's plans on Tuesday, June 23 at 11:00 a.m. in Room 801 at City Hall.



Kennedy Center Revitalizes  
Employment And Training Program

Katherine McDonough, Executive Director, of the J.F. Kennedy Center of Charlestown, announces the revitalization of the Center's Employment and Training program.

The services provided include assessment, counseling, information and referral, job development and job placement. The objective is to match the abilities and interests of job seekers with the needs of employers.

Job applications will be assessed to determine their individual needs. Some applicants, for example, may not know what kind of job they want, how best to go about looking for one, or how to prepare for an inter-

view. Counseling should be helpful in these cases. Others may not have the requisite skills for the job they want. They can be referred to one of the many training programs in the Boston area, including those at ABCD in Boston, the Community Schools of Charlestown, and Bunker Hill Community College. Finally, for those applicants assessed to be "job ready," placement services are available.

Ted Murphy, who holds an M.A. in labor economics from Boston University, has been appointed to coordinate the Kennedy Center's Employment and Training program. In addition to working with job seekers, he plans to establish contacts with local employers to develop a continuous flow of job listings for Charlestown residents. Murphy hopes to work closely with other community agencies as well as employers to determine the need for new training programs based in Charlestown. Later this summer, Murphy expects to supervise the Charlestown portion of Boston-wide survey of Community needs regarding unemployment and under-employment.

# Charlestown Militia Company Readies For The Historical Demonstration Of The Battle Of Bunker Hill



History will once again come alive on Saturday, June 13th on the grounds of the Bunker Hill Monument, as the Charlestown Militia Company 1775, in cooperation with the National Park Service, step back 212 years to present an historical demonstration of the Battle of Bunker Hill.

The Charlestown Militia, along with various militia companies, will re-enact the three assaults made by the British on the colonists on June 17, 1775. This battle proved to be a moral victory in the fight for inde-

pendence from England, as the untrained colonists repelled the first two assaults by the British, considered the best trained forces in the world at that time, only to be forced to retreat following the third attack as the ammunition of the colonists was exhausted.

According to Charlestown Militia Captain Frank Maggelet, the weekend activities will begin on Friday evening as an 18th century encampment, complete with marquis (officers'

tents), tents, kitchen and a medical tent, are set up in the National Park Service portion of the Charlestown Navy Yard, near Gate Four. The Militia plans to recreate the normal routine of an 18th century campsite with officers' call, inspections and drills.

Maggelet stated that at approximately 10:30 p.m. on Friday night, the Militia will begin building the redoubt on the Bunker Hill Monument Grounds.

On Saturday, the campsite will be open to visitors from 9:00 a.m. until the

Militia companies depart for the Monument Grounds at 11:00 a.m. Maggelet said that the procession to the Monument will travel from Chelsea Street to Vine Street to Bunker Hill Street, then travel up Lexington Street to the Monument.

Maggelet stated that upon arrival at the Monument, weapons will be inspected and final preparations will be made for the Battle, with the first assault by the British slated to approach the colonists on the hill at 1:30 p.m.

The Battle will be narrated by Bernie Kelly so that visitors may have some sense of the intensity of this battle scene.

Maggelet also stated that a new dimension will be added to the Battle this year as the **Glad Tidings**, a replica of an 18th century vessel, will fire from its berth in the Navy Yard prior to and during the Battle, simulating the firing on Charlestown by British vessels 212 years ago.

Following the battle, the troops will pass in review,

returning to their encampment in the Navy Yard.

Maggelet noted that the Monument Grounds will be secured by Park Service personnel and that no one will be allowed on the Grounds Saturday until after the battle. He also pointed out that parking will be prohibited during the day on Saturday on the Monument Avenue side of the Grounds.

The Charlestown Militia extends a welcome to all to view this historical demonstration of the Battle of Bunker Hill.







## Open Fire Hydrants Can Be Lethal

Opening a fire hydrant can be lethal, the Boston Water and Sewer Commission said in a warning to Charlestown residents.

"Opening hydrants may have been an apparently playful way to beat the summer heat, but the dangers involved are real — and they can be fatal," said Ron Catena, spokesman.

"Several things take place when one of the city's 14,300 hydrants is opened illegally, and none of them are good. Water pressure is reduced, making fire fighting difficult and sometimes impossible."

"In addition, the enormous volume of water emptying onto a street from an open hydrant can cause a vehicle driving on that street to lose control and injure a bystander," Catena added.

The flow of water from one hydrant for one minute — 1,100 gallons — is enough water to provide 17,600 glasses of drinking water, the Commission noted.

"The cost of turning off illegally tapped hydrants can run into hundreds of dollars a day. In addition to committing manpower to this costly task, it reduces the number of people we have to handle emergencies as they arise in our water distribution system," Catena said. "And many times, hydrants are broken when they are illegally opened. The cost to replace one is nearly \$1,000, Catena added.






The 1987 Bunker Hill Day Parade is dedicated to the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution. Charlestown is proud to call itself home to the USS





## Bunker Hill Day Commemorative Exercises on June 17th

The Bunker Hill Day Commemorative Exercises, sponsored by Bunker Hill Post 26, The American Legion under the auspices of the City of Boston, will be held on Wednesday morning, June 17.

The program, according to Standing Committee Chairman James W. Con-

way, Commander of Post 26, will begin with an Ecumenical Service at Saint Francis de Sales Church, 313 Bunker Hill Street at 10:00 a.m.

Following the service, the veteran, military, militia, and patriotic organizations will assemble outside the church and form a pro-

cession to march to the Bunker Hill Monument Grounds for the Patriotic Exercises, commencing at 11:00 a.m.

The Monument Orator on this, the 212th Anniversary of the Battle of Bunker Hill, will be Doctor Thomas H. O'Connor, Professor of History at Boston

College and a member of the Commission on the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution.

A graduate of Boston Latin School, Dr. O'Connor entered Boston College in 1942. He left for three year's service in the United States Army, serving in the China-Burma-India Thea-

ter. He returned to Boston College where he received his AB and MA degrees and later received his PhD degree in American History from Boston University.

Dr. O'Connor began teaching at Boston College in 1950 and currently holds the rank of Professor of History. He was chairman of the History Department at Boston College from 1962 to 1970; was elected vice-president of the University Academic Senate from 1968 to 1971; and served as faculty assistant to the President of Boston College from 1970 to 1972.

An expert on the Civil War period of American History, Dr. O'Connor is the author of several history textbooks and numerous historical articles. He has also written such specialized studies as *Lords of the Loom; The Disunited States: The Era of the Civil War and Reconstruction; Religion in American Society; Bibles, Brahmins and Bosses; and Fitzpatrick's Boston, 1846-1866.*

Dr. O'Connor, a resident of Braintree, is past president of the South Shore Association for Retarded Citizens; a former member of the Board of Directors of the Massachusetts Association for Retarded Citizens; and is currently a member of the Board of Trustees of the Braintree Society for Handicapped Citizens. He

was a member of the Civil War Centennial Commission; an historical consultant for the BOSTON 200 program; and project director for FORUM 350 which commemorated the 350th anniversary of Boston.

Dr. O'Connor was one of only 24 persons named by President Ronald Reagan to serve on the Commission on the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution.

This year, the Bunker Hill Day Parade has been dedicated to the Bicentennial of the Constitution.

At the conclusion of the formal ceremonies, a wreath will be placed at the base of the statue of Colonel William Prescott on the Monument Grounds.

Chairman of the Bunker Hill Day Commemorative Exercises, James W. Conway and the committee, extend a warm welcome to all residents, organizations from within and outside the community, to join with them on the morning of the 17th of June - the 212th Anniversary of the Battle of Bunker Hill, at both the Ecumenical Services at Saint Francis de Sales Church at 10:00 a.m. and at the Patriotic Exercises at the Monument at 11:00 a.m.

With the cooperation and attendance of all, these commemorative exercises will be truly a fitting tribute to our fallen heroes of Bunker Hill.





I would really appreciate it very much if you would read this article from the beginning to the end. It is important to me.

I am going to have a fundraiser at Anthony's Pier 4 on July 15, 1987. There will be a 16 piece band and a lot of entertainment by professional entertainers that I have known for many years. The bar will be opened from six to nine p.m.

For those of you who come, I hope that you will arrive early, because I would like to see all of you dancing to the big band sound.

For twelve years, I never had a fundraiser because I honestly felt that I was doing my job as a full-time councillor who never had another income, but now I find that I have to raise funds in order to be re-elected to the Council At-Large.

Let me give you an example of why I have to raise funds. When I ran last year for Sheriff of Suffolk County, I raised \$70,000 and my opponent, Sheriff Robert Rufo, raised \$226,000. He not only outspent me, but had the support of people like Mayor Flynn out to defeat me. (I will never forget Ray Flynn for that.)

## USS Constitution Marches On Bunker Hill Day

The USS Constitution's marching unit, the Pikemen, will be part of the United States military presence marching in the annual Bunker Hill Day Parade that begins at 12:30 p.m., Sunday, June 14. This year's parade will be dedi-

cated to the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution.

According to Commander Robert L. Gillen, USN, (Retired), "This year's event will be the biggest in recent history." Gillen is the chief marshal of the parade

and a former commanding officer of the USS Constitution.

The parade will include marching units including the 35 member Northeast Navy Band, the USS Constitution Pikemen, the 18th Army Band, the Paris Island Marine Corps Band and the Heritage Hall 50 flag marching unit from Fort Devens. Commander Joseph Z. Brown, USN, 61st commanding officer of USS Constitution, is the Military Liaison for the parade.

In observance of Flag Day, also celebrated Sunday, June 14, a giant American flag, currently stored on board USS Constitution, will be drawn along the parade route by horse-drawn caisson.

It will take a crane and 20 sailors to raise this 45 feet by 85 feet five inch flag at a 5:00 p.m. ceremony in observance of Flag Day, to take place in front of USS Constitution. The ceremony's highlights will include the 75 member Lexington Pops Chorus and a salute from the USS Constitution's cannons when the flag reaches its full extension.

The flag will be used later by the National Park Service to rededicate the Lincoln figure on Mount Rushmore, South Dakota on the occasion of its 50th anniversary.

# Philadelphia's Champion Fralinger String Band To Perform In Concert On Monument Square



THE FRALINGER STRING BAND, 1987 Champions of the Annual New Year's Day Mummers Parade in Philadelphia, will appear in concert on Monument Square in front of the

Bunker Hill Museum on Saturday afternoon, June 13th at 5:00 p.m. The band will also be in the line of march in the Bunker Hill Day Parade on Sunday, June 14th.

A foot tapping, hand clapping good time is in store for residents on Saturday afternoon, June 13 at 5:00 p.m. as the Fralinger String Band from Philadelphia presents a concert on Monument Square, in front of the Bunker Hill Museum.

This concert, sponsored by the Bunker Hill Day Commemorative Committee, will feature the colorful costumes and award-winning music of the famous Fralingers — the first place winner in the 1987 New Year's Day Mummers Parade in Philadelphia.

A Mummer is defined as "one who goes merrymaking in disguise during festivals." Mummery can be traced back to Medieval Europe when men and women

would lead festal rites at the Christmas holiday season. History records that when the pioneer Swedes came to this country, they settled in an area known as Tinicum, bringing with them many customs of the old country. Important among them was the age-old habit of visiting friends on the day after Christmas through the first day of the new year. They would travel in bands of men through South Philadelphia engaging in a series of festivities. This informal celebration continued until January 1, 1901 when the first organized parade was established and hence tradition was set.

The Fralinger String Band was founded and organized in 1915 by the late Dr. John Fralinger and is

one of the oldest and most respected string bands. Band members master such instruments as the banjo, saxophone, bass, accordion, glockenspiel and drums — there is no brass.

The Fralinger String Band is one of 27 such bands, 16 of which form the Philadelphia Mummers String Band Association.

Rivalry among the string bands is strong. Each band must develop a theme and throughout the year evolve it. Costumes and music along with drilling supplement the theme. Bands spend many thousands of dollars on costumes and each new year, every unit must present a completely new costume and presentation to be eligible for competitive prizes in the New

Year's Day Parade.

Authenticity in music and diversification in sound are perhaps the secret of Fralinger's success. Its music has carried the band's reputation and banners throughout the country as they have participated in such events as the Mardi Gras in New Orleans, Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York, the Circus Day Parade in Milwaukee and the Apple Blossom Festival in Virginia.

The Fralinger String Band has been Philadelphia's champions on nine occasions.

This year, under Captain Bill Bowen, Jr., the theme is "Copa-Banana." The band welcomes you to an unusual tropical cabaret filled with fresh fruit fan-

tasies and overflowing with Latin energies.

The Headpiece suit is a latin cornucopia of fruit in true Miranda style . . . large, garish, tropical and colorful. There are also Tangerine and Strawberry costumes that are just as colorful. The Captain is fashioned as a grand and pure Miranda, lavish in rich materials of lace ruffles, silk, lame, mylar and jewels, surrounded with plumage and fruit displays.

A wide variety of musical selections will be perform-

ed — from the Latin to Dixieland to the sounds of Sousa to old time favorites — and of course, the mystical magic of "Dem Golden Slippers" with the famous Mummer's strut.

In addition to Saturday afternoon's concert, the Fralinger String Band will strut through the streets of Charlestown during the Bunker Hill Day Parade on Sunday, June 14th.
