



Exclusion

There are 35.2 permanent exclusions per day

Pupils with an EHC plan were 6 times more likely to receive a permanent exclusion rate

Regions with the highest rate of #PEx are West Midlands and North West

SEND students account for half of all #PEx and fixed term exclusions

Those students on SEN support are 7 times more likely to be #PEx

81% of permanent exclusions were from secondary schools

Boys are 3 times more likely to be permanently excluded (#PEx)

Cost - £370000 per student who is #PEx (ippr figures)

Majority of permanent and fixed term exclusions are for 'persistent disruptive behaviour'

Permanent and fixed term exclusions are mostly from SEND, disadvantaged and Black Caribbean students. (DFE figures)

FSM are 4 times more likely to be #PEx or receive a fixed term exclusion

Fixed term exclusions

There are 1790 fixed term exclusions per day

In primary schools there were 55740 fixed term exclusions

In secondary there were 270,135 fixed term exclusions

More stats

Black Caribbean students were 3 times more likely to be permanently excluded than the whole school population

Gypsy, Roma and Traveller of Irish heritage groups had the highest rate of fixed term and permanent exclusions (but figure to be treated with caution due to small numbers)

Over half of permanent and fixed term exclusions occur in year 9 or above

Pupils aged 14 and above account for over half of permanent and fixed term exclusions

Highest permanent exclusion rates were in West Midlands and the North West.

Highest rate of #fixedtermEx is Yorkshire and Humber
