Dear Council President Bressi and all esteemed members of the Jackson Council,

We would like to request from the Jackson Council permission to build "Eruvs" in Jackson. Included with this request you will find the plans, which include all the pole numbers of the poles that we would like to use.

Jewish law prohibits carrying or pushing anything outdoors on our Sabbath without an Eruv. This includes carrying a child, pushing a stroller or wheelchair, riding a bike or holding a key. An Eruv however, would allow all those ordinary and reasonable activities to take place.


An Eruv is a virtually invisible demarcation of an area. The least obtrusive method to construct an Eruv is by attaching wooden or plastic strips called "Lechis" to the utility poles. The pipes are narrow conduits which are designed to be camouflaged with the electrical equipment and will not have any adverse effect from a visual or technical standpoint. We will coordinate the same with the relevant utility companies to ensure that it meets their rigorous safety and cosmetic standards. This is a commonly allowed practice throughout hundreds of diverse municipalities in our great country.

To be clear, we are not asking the Jackson Township for permission to put an Eruv on the utility poles that are in the jurisdiction of the utility company. Rather we are requesting that the Township to allow us to work in conjunction with the utility companies and rent the right from them directly for our needs, and to confirm that the township will have no objection with this most practical arrangement.

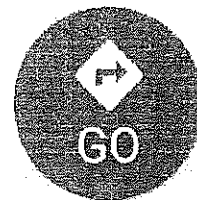
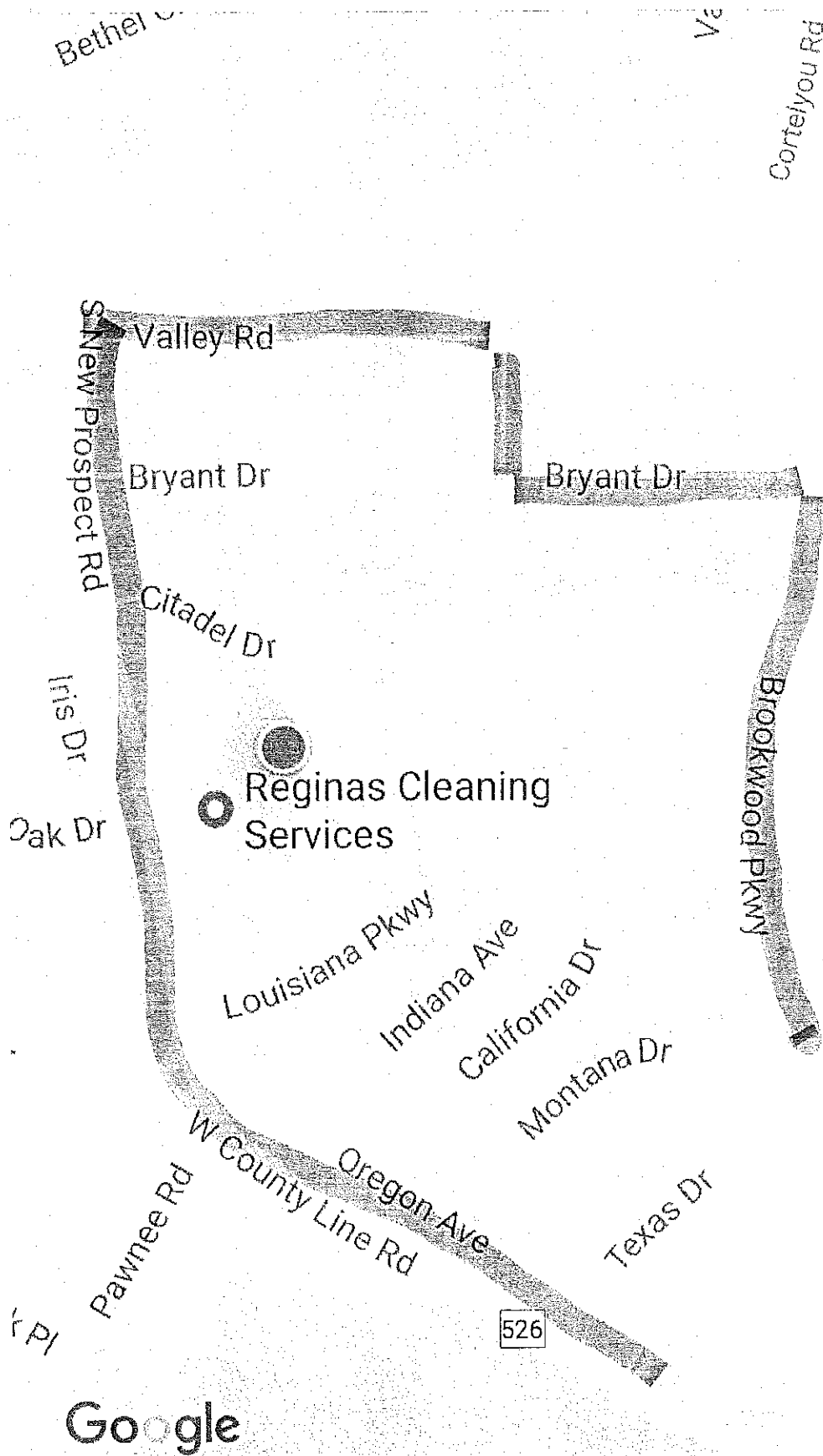

Dear Mayor and Council:

I am advised residents in Jackson have requested approval of the township governing body to construct an Eruv in the municipality and that you now have this matter under consideration.

For those making this request, an Eruv significantly improves their quality of life while allowing them to respect certain tenets of their religion.

The required attachments to utility poles are hardly noticeable and therefore would not impact other residents unless they were merely attempting to make an issue where none should exist.

Transmitted herewith is an article that appears in this week's Asbury Park Press in which a Tenafly Councilman describes a costly, pointless, losing battle that took place in opposition to an Eruv in his town in 2000. He conveys a message to Mahwah not to get engaged in a similar, useless battle.

It is noted: "in the years since the Eruv has gone up in Tenafly, there has been virtually no negative impact." Former Councilman Joseph Salvatore said, "A lot of the fears never materialized....It was much ado about nothing."

The lost legal battle cost Tenaflly \$325,000.

I would strongly recommend you take Tenaflly's learned lesson to heart and grant approval for the Eruv. It will do no harm but assist in bettering the lives of some of your residents.

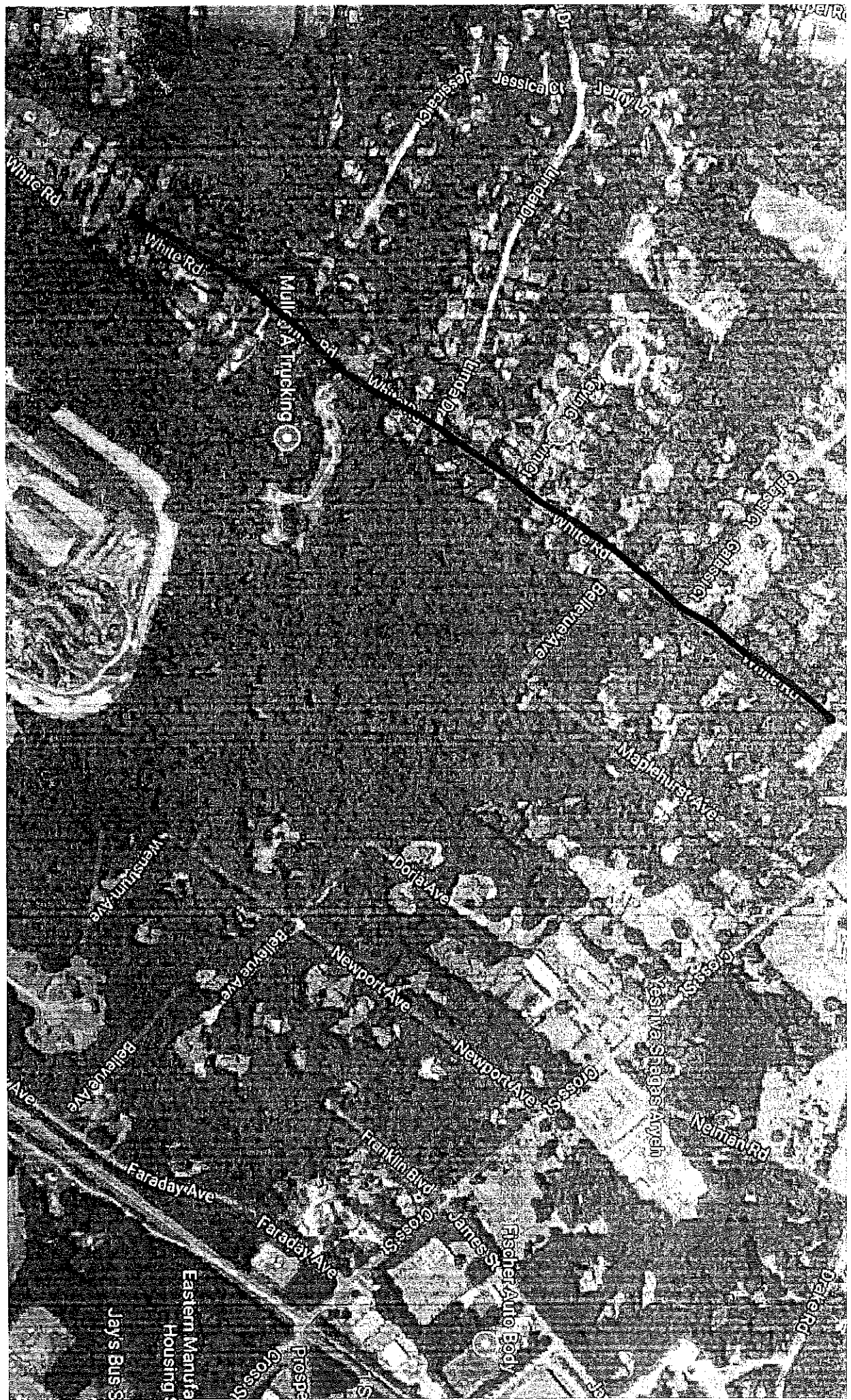

To the honorable Township Committee of Jackson NJ,

I am writing in response to a recent notice of violation of town ordinance regarding the basketball hoop which is on my property near the curbside at 7 Pepperidge Court. The violation notes that I must obtain permission in writing from the township committee in order to maintain this in its current location. I was not aware of any such ordinance at the time it was placed there. This basketball hoop has been used by my two sons and many children from the neighborhood for about 15 years. It was a gift from the boy's grandmother and was installed by me as per manufacturer's instructions with a concrete footing. This has withstood hurricane Sandy and has never fallen or obstructed the roadway in any way unlike the temporary or moveable basketball hoops which are popular. Cars can park in front of this with no obstruction to the roadway. Snow plows and street sweeping equipment can pass by with no issue. Over the years this has been a safe place to play basketball for all of the children in our neighborhood and those in the adjacent neighborhoods, and to my knowledge, the township has not received any complaints. The street is a double cul-de-sac which has minimal traffic at all times. This basketball hoop is well maintained and cared for and does not create an eyesore as it is tucked in to the tree lined area where it blends in and is not easily noticeable. This basketball hoop provides a safe and healthy activity for the children in the neighborhood.

In light of these facts I would respectfully request that this be grandfathered in and or allowed to remain in its current location for all to continue to enjoy.



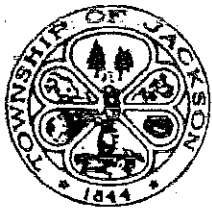

Dear Council President Bressi and all members of the Jackson Council,

We would like to request from the Jackson Council permission to build an Eruv in Jackson.

Jewish law prohibits carrying or pushing anything outdoors on our Sabbath. This means that carrying a child, pushing a stroller or wheelchair, or holding a key is forbidden. This includes carrying in one's backyard. Based on Jewish law, if one is carrying or pushing within a fenced-in area, or an Eruv, then it is permitted.

An Eruv is a pole with a string attached on top of it that closes off an area in a "halachic" sense and enables us to be able to carry within the Eruv boundaries. We have attached a string to the utility poles outside our house in order to enclose our property within an Eruv. The string is about 16 feet high and is 100% safe. To the best of our knowledge, there has never been an incident in which an Eruv caused any harm to anyone or anything.

We would like to either place a pole in the row in front of our house to use as an Eruv with a string running from my pole to the pole in our neighbors' properties, or use the pre-existing utility poles on our block. Our block is lucky to have utility poles in front of our houses that would make it easy to build an Eruv. We are asking the township to give municipality consent to enter into an agreement with the utility companies to rent from them their poles in order to build an acceptable Eruv. We urge you to approve this very reasonable request.

Thank you for your assistance in this matter.

We have attached a string to the utility poles outside our house in order to enclose our property within an Eruv. The string is about 16 feet high and is 100% safe. To the best of our knowledge, there has never been an incident in which an Eruv caused any harm to anyone or anything.

We would like to either place a pole in the row in front of our house to use as an Eruv with a string running from my pole to the pole in our neighbors' properties, or use the pre-existing utility poles on our block. Our block is lucky to have utility poles in front of our houses that would make it easy to build an Eruv. We are asking the township to give municipality consent to enter into an agreement with the utility companies to rent from them their poles in order to build an acceptable Eruv. We urge you to approve this very reasonable request.

I am reaching out to you due to a violation notice I received in the mail regarding the *eruv* poles in the Row area in front of my house.

I understand that the poles need to be removed, unless permission is obtained in writing from the Township Committee of the Township of Jackson.

Jewish Law prohibits carrying or pushing anything outdoors on our Sabbath unless the area is either fenced in, or alternatively, surrounded by an *eruv*. This means that pushing a stroller, carrying a child, or any item is forbidden if there is no *eruv* in place.

The *eruv* is formed by surrounding the desired area with a string that runs along a few skinny metal poles that are placed in the ground.

We had the water and gas company come down and mark off where the lines are to ensure we would not hit them and ensure the highest level of safety is met.


The *eruv* is not cemented into the ground and can easily be removed if it becomes necessary to access the area. The *eruv* is totally safe and harmless.

None of the neighbors on our street seem to be bothered with the *eruv* poles in any way.

I am therefore reaching out to you to obtain written permission for the *eruv* poles to remain in front of my house the way they currently stand.

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
