If you want to save even more money, you should consider purchasing the best corded chainsaws available, as they are less expensive than gas models. The most important element in choosing your chainsaw is the handguard, which attaches the bar to the frame. While you can purchase electric chainsaws with a handguard that doesn't attach to the bar at all, it's best to choose a chain with a bar that attaches, as you'll be more stable if you hold the bar with both hands. The best corded chainsaws will have at least a three-prong handguard to make it safe to operate.

Another important factor in choosing your electric chainsaw is whether or not you want a corded or cordless model. While cordless chainsaws are more convenient for homeowners, they tend to be much heavier and may not be as portable. If
