## **MAGGIE BAILEY**

### **BOURBON | MINT | LEMONADE**

In the 1920s, at just 17 years old, Bailey began bootlegging to help support her five younger siblings. Proving to have a knack for the practice, she kept at it for decades. Bailey was only ever convicted once for selling moonshine, serving about 18 months. She continued to bootleg for the next 50 years. Not only was she never arrested again, she was beloved by the community, reportedly using her money to help local families buy coal, groceries, and even pay for college tuition. Bailey finally quit bootlegging at age 95, and she was nationally eulogized upon her death in 2005 at the age of 101.

## **ADA COLEMAN**

### **GIN | SWEET VERMOUTH | CYNAR | ORANGE JUICE | ANGOSTURA BITTERS**

At a time when women behind the bar were still referred to as barmaids, Ada Coleman was a true mixologist in today's parlance. Coleman, served as head bartender at the famed American Bar at The Savoy hotel in London. In 1903 she was appointed head bartender at The Savoy's American Bar where she presided for the next 23 years. Coleman served notable patrons like Charlie Chaplin, Marlene Dietrich, Mark Twain and comic actor Charles Hawley, for whom she created the now-classic "Hanky Panky".

## **ELLA FITZGERALD**

### **GIN | LEMON | BLACKBERRIES**

Fitzgerald was more than a singer, she was a survivor. As a young teenager and before the world would ever hear her sing, she worked for local gamblers running money between bettors. Her life, and the music world, changed forever in 1934 on the day her name was selected at random in a weekly drawing at the Apollo Theater. Nervous and shy, Fitzgerald took the stage and wowed the audience. She was often referred as "The First Lady of Song", "Queen of Jazz" and "Lady Ella". She was noted for her crisp, precise voice to redefine a jaw dropping range of American classics, stabling herself as the premier vocal stylist of her era.

## **JANE GOODALL**

Pioneering primatologist Jane Goodall has forever changed the way human beings look at chimpanzees and themselves. Seen as the world's foremost expert on chimpanzees, her fascination with animals began during her childhood in London. At the age of 23, she moved to Kenya on her own with no post-secondary education. She ended up being hired as a secretary to the well-known scientist Louis Leakey who sent her to the Tanzanian jungle to study chimpanzees in the most up close and personal way possible; by living among them.
