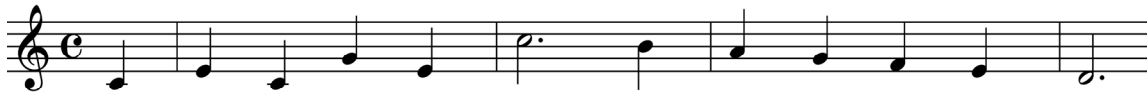

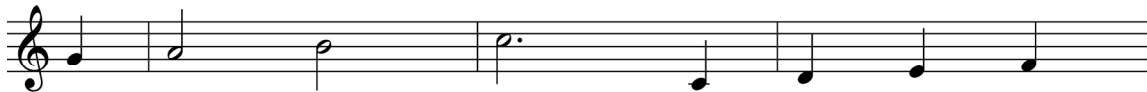
Preparation of the Gifts "Rejoice, the Lord is King!"

Spiritual Communion Prayer


My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.
