Chugiak Elementary students are about to begin the Battle of the Books program. Battle of the Books is a statewide reading motivation program. The goal is to encourage and recognize students who enjoy reading and to broaden reading interests and comprehension while promoting academic excellence.
All $3^{\text {rd }}, 4^{\text {th }}$ and $5^{\text {th }}$ graders are welcome to join!

All students interested in participating will need a signed permission slip which includes a summary of the books. Each student will be given a bookmark with titles and authors. Students in Christiansen, Ugarte, Himes, and Sparkman's classes will practice on Mondays during recess. Studetns in MacNaughton, Tkacs, and Senchantixay's classes will practice on Wednesdays during recess. Students in Canada, De La Rosa, and King's classes will practice on Fridays during recess. Practices will help reinforce reading books and help students answer questions about the books.

## How Do We Pick Teams?

All interested students will practice together in a large group during the months of September through December. In early January we will select two teams of three students (plus one alternate) for $3 \mathrm{rd} / 4^{\text {th }}$ Grade and two teams of three students (plus one alternate) for $5^{\text {th }}$ Grade, who will represent Chugiak Elementary at the Anchorage Battle in February. These sixteen will have earned a place on one of the two teams. A point system will be used to determine who places on the final teams. Students earn points for the number of books read, attendance at Battle meetings, overall attitude, and points for correct answers on the final test given to all students in early January.
