Attached please find my application for the Affordable Housing Advisory Committee and my resume. I have been attending the meetings of this committee for the past two years and am very familiar with its work. If chosen to serve, there would be no learning curve, as I've been following the issues of planning, funding and advocating for affordable housing in Asheville.

In addition to the experience you can see on my resume, I have a long history of connection to housing issues. In college, I organized and led a home repair spring break trip for a campus group. Following college I moved to New York City, where I volunteered in a homeless shelter and in a local soup kitchen. In graduate school, I studied community organizing and asset-based community development which led me to work in Indianapolis with a Community Development Corporation whose focus included affordable housing issues.

I first began work with Habitat for Humanity in Rochester, NY, in my role there as a community relations pastor, and later became a live-in volunteer with a community in rural Maryland for families experiencing homelessness. In my direct service work with women in prostitution in Chicago and with men coming out of maximum security prison in upstate New York, the problem of finding appropriate and affordable places to live was a constant concern.

As the owner of a single-family detached home in West Asheville for nine years and now of a townhome there, I am personally invested in the well-being of our City. My son's father is a landlord in both the City of Asheville and Buncombe County, so I am also familiar with the concerns of local landlords and investors, and both of my brothers also work in real estate. For more than three decades I've paid attention to the issues of housing needs and housing markets and through my local work with Habitat, I'm intimately connected to the particular issues of developing housing in this market and terrain.

It would be an honor to put this interest to use for the good of Asheville.
