

LSVT LOUD®

Following extensive research over the past 25 years, LSVT LOUD[®] is the gold standard in speech and voice therapy for people with Parkinson's disease. It is proven to improve functional vocal loudness, intonation, and voice quality in 90% of patients from pre- to post-treatment. A speech-language pathologist certified in LSVT LOUD[®] conducts four consecutive treatment sessions per week for four consecutive weeks following the initial evaluation.

LSVT BIG®

LSVT BIG[®] was created using principles of LOUD[®] to train individuals with Parkinson's disease to use bigger movements anywhere, anytime in their daily lives to help empower them to stay moving and active. Just like LOUD, BIG focuses on high intensity movements, self-perception, and increased amplitude of output. Extensive research in BIG has shown improved limb and body movement for improved functionality in daily living activities. (LSVT Global, INC[®]). LSVT BIG[®] treatments are conducted by physical/occupational therapists and assistants. The program consists of four consecutive treatment sessions per week for four consecutive weeks following the initial evaluation.

Prescriptions should include:

- Medical diagnosis: Parkinson's disease or Secondary Parkinsonism
- "LSVT LOUD[®]" for speech therapy and/or "LSVT BIG[®]" for physical therapy
- Treatment diagnosis

- Dysarthria (R47.1)
- Dysphonia (R49.0)
- Aphonia (R49.1)

Appropriate treatment diagnosis for LSVT BIG[®] include:

- Difficulty balancing (R29.818)
- Difficulty walking (R26.2)
- Frequent falls (R29.6)
- · Abnormality of gait and mobility (R26.9)
- Decreased coordination (R27.9)
- Muscular deconditioning (R 29.898)
- Difficulty transferring (R 68.89)

While the main emphasis of this program is to target patients early in their diagnosis, our LSVT certified therapists will evaluate your patient in any stage of Parkinson's disease to determine qualification for participation in the LSVT program. If the patient is not deemed appropriate for LSVT, a more traditional approach to therapy may be taken.
