## Important Meeting On Proposed Asphalt Plant

The Simeone Corporation will present their plans for a Bituminous Concrete (Asphalt) Plant proposed for 100 Front Street in the City Square area of Charlestown, on Tuesday evening, May 22, 1984 from 7:30 to $9: 30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. in the Auditorium of Bunker Hill Community College.
This meeting, which is being sponsored by the simeone Corporation, will allow residents to view the plans and ask questions of company officials.
The community was made aware of the proposal for construction of the Asphalt Plant several days before a scheduled appearance of the company at the City of Boston Board of Appeals on May 1st. At the Board of Boston Board of Appeals on May 1st. At the Board of
Appeal hearing, some 125 Charlestown residents were in attendance, with many present speaking in opposition to the plan and petitions containing over 350 names, which had been gathered in two days, were also presented in opposition. To address the needs of individuals who are too old dividuals who are too old or pediatric facilities and ing homes, the Executive Office of Human Services Office of Human Services would be authorized to set up a program for individuals over 21. living in pediatric nursing homes. A final provision would require the Human Services Office to report to Representative Voke's committee as to the results of the pilot program.

legislation. "I am proud to have been a major force behind this legislation, and am grateful for the cooperation of all parties involved with the Pediatric Nursing Home Subcommittee. ## Free <br> Hearing Screenings

Hearing is critical to good speech and language development. Young children learn to speak by listening to those around them and to themselves. Therefore, it is important to check children's hearing ability periodically
Later in life, hearing remains important to social, occupational, and recreational pursuits. Adults who experience hearing loss, (which can be gradual as well as sudden) often also experience a sense of isolation as it becomes difficult to carry on conversations with family. friends, and co-workers. Sometimes compensating for the hearing loss, for example, turning up volume on the TV. may cause family members to become irritable. Sometimes hobbies, such as listening to music. are no longer the source on enjoyment they once were.
So much can be done these days to treat hearing impairment and prevent or minimize the unpleasant effects. But the first step is identifying the problem.
As part of the Speech-Language Pathology Department's recognition of May as Better Speech and Hearing Month, the Bunker Hill Health Center at 73 High Street is offering free hearing screenings, open to all ages. on Monday. May 21 from 12:00 to 1:00 p.m. and on Wednesday, May 23 also from 12:00 to 1:00 p.m. A hearing screening will determine whether hearing levels are normal or whether some hearing loss is prelevels are normal or whether some hearing loss is pre
sent. When hearing loss is detected, the person is sent. When hearing loss is detected, the person is
referred to Audiology Services for further tests to determine the type and extent of loss as well as the best type of treatment
If someone you know has a hearing loss, here are some suggestions which may aid in effective communication:

1) Don't expect the individual to do as well in group conversations or with background noise as in a one to one situation. Competing noise makes conversation difficult.
2) Don't try to overarticulate. Do speak clearly but don't exaggerate-and distort-mouth movements
3) Remember that hearing loss doesn't always only make things quieter; it can make speech less clear too. Requests for repetitions may not mean the person's not listening; speech may simply sound too unclear to be readily understood.
4) Especially with older persons, try to slow down a bit rather than simply talking louder
5) Try to include the hearing impaired person in conversations and family decision making, remembering that it's twice as much work for them, but that it's worth preventing feelings of isolation and rejection that can come from exclusion.

## City Gardens: Planting Your Window Box

## by Barbara Maheigan

Once your window box is ready and waiting. you can enjoy choosing plants to compliment your home. You can create many different effects: consider using one type of plant in one color. like cascading white petunias, for an elegant entrance, or mix a variety of plants in many colors for a cheerful country-like setting. If you need further en or a cheerful country-like setting. If you need further en couragement to begin. remember the window box contest gardens for Charlestowner, and two of last year's winners nual eonest in late sum. were first-time gardeners. Here are a few hints to help you begin.
Before planting, the box must be filled with a growing medium. First, to keep the drainage holes open and the soi in the box. place a curved piece from a broken flower po over the holes. Next. fill the box will a lightweight soil or soiless mix. If garden loam is available, you can make your own potting soil by mixing loam and at least one quart of peat moss. then fertilizing in accordance with the package directions. This mixture should stand one week before planting.
Summer plants should be chosen with care, as the amount of sunshine your box will receive determines which plants can flourish. Plants in window boxes are often

When they went over to the dogs. they found the body of a white male, about 30 years old. lying on his back two feet from driver's door of a grey Datsun. The unidentified male had what appeared to be a shotgun wound in his right chest. He was pronounced dead at $6: 10 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. by ambulance attendants. This incident will be further investigated by Homicide Detectives.
