2) Impact of the project

The facilities in rural areas have enormously improved due to the monitored implementation of MGNREGS. This scheme has provided different facilities which have improved the living standard of the people. Such facilities are construction of roads from NH to villages, RCC Bridge, footpath, motor able road and to preserve streams spring chambers have been constructed. Check dams were built across small rivers in order to stop the water flowing out thus preserve water for the agricultural purpose and ring wells have been constructed to provide drinking water.

CASE STUDY

Seempara village is under South Garo Hills, Meghalaya which is half kms away from NH with 90 households comprising of 564 population. The villagers were struggling due to unemployment as well as difficulty to work in the surrounding areas due to hilly terrain with no proper road connectivity. There was no source of income for the people of that area. After MGNREGS scheme being implemented in Seempara village, the life style of the people have changed to a great extend with the construction of fishery ponds from which they not only got employment opportunity but also contributed for the economic growth. They also constructed footsteps in hilly areas which helped the villagers for better and easier transportation.

During Social Audit it was found that MGNREGS project has been facilitating the people of Seempara village for economical and social development.

CASE STUDY

Darugre village is situated in East Garo Hills, Meghalaya which is one km away from NH with 174 households comprising of 485 population. The people of this village are mainly farmers and unemployment was the main reason for the miserable conditions of the villagers where people have no basic means of survival. However after the implementation of MGNREGS, people were employed in different works which not only improved their economic conditions but their social life as well. The villagers were employed in constructions of RCC Bridge, road, ring wells, CC check dams which brought tremendous progress and changes in the lives of rural people. The villagers also started to take active role in Public Hearing and Social Audit.



X. Disaster Intervention

BAKDIL started with the name Catholic Charities in 1973 in response to the influx of refugees in the year nineteen seventies. Since then disaster intervention and disaster preparedness has been one of the focus areas of BAKDIL.





On 16th may 2015 the house of Mr. Pidison B. Marak and Mrs. Paulina D. Marak fully gutted and their whole house, clothes, furniture's, childrens books were burnt and nothing was left except the clothes which they were wearing. This awful disaster happened in the early morning when the family members were asleep. The back of the mother of the family namely Paulina D Marak caught fire and was seriously injured while trying to extinguish the fire. There were six members in the family. Nothing was left. The family was given financial assistance to restore themselves to normal life.

In a similar case the house of the driver of the Bishop of Tura was blown away due to heavy wind. He was also assisted financially to replace the tins for the house roof.





XI. Miscellaneous

A) STRATEGY PLAN FOR BAKDIL

Bakdil as a Non-Governmental Organization intervenes in specific situations based on the plans developed. The last strategic Plan was organized in 2011 and therefore it was time to review the strategic Plan that was developed in 2011. Therefore a team of two Resource Persons including Mr. Lukose, Assistant Professor in Assam Don Bosco University and Fr. Varghese, the Executive Director, Assam. Bishop of Tura and the President of Bakdil and the Director of Bakdil with all the coordinators were present for the Strategic Planning for the period 2016-2021. 







