### HOUSING RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2. Support the strategic initial high level housing paper for advancing a joint housing project to build (270) houses within the NICF's broader aspirations for strategically working together to improve Maori housing outcomes that aligns with our Te Tiriti o Waitangi framework and the Whanau Ora Outcomes Framework.

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### SMART TECHNOLOGY INVESTMENT FOR MAORI LAND OWNERS RESOLUTION

That the National Iwi Chairs Forum:

- 1. Receive the recommendation on smart technology from the Iwi Assets & Maori Land Symposium held on 1 May 2019.
- 2. Support a proposal to the Minister for Maori Development which looks at using Maori land examples to develop software (including apps) by which Maori land owners can own the platform/IP and source, through smart technology sensors, data which provides real time information that enables Maori land owners to make informed economic and environmental decisions.

# SMART TECHNOLOGY INVESTMENT FOR MAORI LAND OWNERS RESOLUTION CONTINUED

3. Acknowledge that some of the projects that could lead the case studies are: 1. The 5,000 ha within a 50km radius of Kaikohe, 2. 38 blocks in Raukokore/Waihau Bay area which are connected to the Raukokore Irrigation Study & Design (\$17m) and aiming to be investor ready by August 2019, and 3. Ngati Porou land development initiative.

#### **PROTECTING MĀNUKA HONEY RESOLUTION** That the NICF:

- 1. Receive the presentation from Victor Goldsmith on behalf of Ngāti Porou, Miere Limited, Apiculture NZ, UMF Honey Association and NZ Beekeeping Incorporated seeking the protection of 'Mānuka Honey' as only coming from Aotearoa as with other products from other specific areas like champagne.
- 2. Support the legal protection of the term 'Mānuka Honey' as proposed by the Iwi Assets & Māori Land Symposium held on 1 May 2019;
- 3. Support the establishment of a trust to protect the term 'Mānuka' in perpetuity and for all New Zealanders without prejudice to the resolution of Te Tiriti based rights through the Wai 262 claim.
- 4. Support the trust being established with interim membership provided by a representative from each of the following groups: Te Taitokerau; Te Tairawhiti; Te Puku o te Ika (Tuwharetoa); Te Tai Hauauru; Te Tau Ihu; Te Waipounamu; Apiculture New Zealand and UMF Honey Association; New Zealand Beekeeping Incorporated.

#### **DEFINITION OF MĀNUKA HONEY RESOLUTION** That the NICF:

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- 1. Receive the recommendation from the Iwi Assets & Māori Land Symposium with regard to the Ministry for Primary Industries definition of manuka honey;
- 2. Reject the manuka honey definition as determined by the Ministry for Primary Industries;
- 3. Agree that any definition of mānuka honey must be based on robust independent science underpinned by matauranga Maori; and
- 4. Agree that until a new definition based on robust independent science underpinned by matauranga Māori is achieved, MPI revert back to the status quo that was in place immediately before their new definition took effect in 2019.

### OPPOSING LOAN SHARKS AND PROGRESSING FINANCIAL CAPABILITY RESOLUTION

- 1. Government to include an interest rate cap (additional to other control mechanisms) and a ban on retail trucks to the credit contracts Legislation Amendment bill; and
- 2. Submits to Parliament's Finance and Expenditure Select Committee to that effect.
