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

What is the Kennedy-Lugar Youth Exchange & Study?

The Kennedy-Lugar Youth Exchange and Study (YES) program was established by Congress in October 2002 in response to the events of September 11, 2001. The program is funded through the U.S. Department of State and sponsored by the Bureau of Educational & Cultural Affairs (ECA) to provide scholarships for high school students from countries with significant Muslim populations to spend up to one academic year in the U.S. Students live with host families, attend high school, engage in activities to learn about American society and values. acquire leadership skills, and help educate Americans about their countries and cultures. Starting in 2009. the YES Abroad program was established to provide a similar experience for U.S. students (15-17 years) to spend an academic year in select YES countries.

What do students do on the program?

- Live with host families
- Attend high school
- Engage in activities to learn about American society and values
- Acquire leadership skills
- Help educate Americans about their countries and cultures

Who can apply?

Student's Requirements

- Be a citizen of Malaysia
- Be enrolled in Form 5 at the time of application
- Have the equivalent of a B average or better without failling grades
- Be active in extra-curricular activities
- The program highly encourages participation from students with disabilities between the age of 15 and 17 (form 3 to 5 at the time of application)

Priority will be given to underprivileged applicants with little or no previous experience in the United States.

The program officially launched in Malaysia in 2003 in hopes to expand communication between the people of the United States and Malaysia in order to promote mutual understanding and respect. Since then, over 420 Malaysian students have completed the YES program and are now members of the YES community.

The YES program is administered in partnership with the U.S. Department of State by a consortium of non-profit organizations led by American Councils for International Education. In Malaysia, AFS Malaysia manages the YES program in partnership with the Public Affairs Office of the U.S. Embassy in Malaysia.
