
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





LOURDES JULIAN DOPLITO ÇABUK


FENG SHUI- You have the compass in you!




By virtue of the psychotherapy séances he has conducted for many years in Switzerland as well as in Turkey, psychologist Dr. Merter has observed numerous cases of malaise in which ordinary persons unexpectedly find themselves arrested at the level of the ego, that is to say, in a state of stasis, which they are incapable of transcending. The person feels like a caged tiger who is frustrated and unable to keep himself from pacing back and forth, irritably. The source of this unease is the inability to attain one's ultimate potential on an existential level. In the presentation of his model of multistoried ego, Merter draws on a wealth of resources, ranging from modern psychology and postmodern theorists on the conscious. to Sufi literature. Arranging them within the framework of his original therapy techniques of transpersonal psychology, the author reveals the secrets of transcendence.

PSYCHIATRIST DR. NESIP MUSTAFA MERTER

Born in Istanbul in 1947, Dr. Merter attended the Austrian High School in İstanbul. He graduated from the School of Medicine at Lausanne in 1975. He served at the Burghölzi Psychiatric Hospital and Psychiatric Polyclinic, ancillary to the hospital of the University of Zurich, and completed his doctorate in the field of biological psychiatry with a study on neuroleptics entitled "Flufenazin Dekanoat." Since 1987, Dr. Merter has been living in Turkey, where he practises his profession of psychiatry at Bodrum. Dr. Merter developed an active interest in Jungian pyschology and existential analysis at Zurich and subsequently put into practise the group therapy methodology of I. Yalom. For the past 10 years, Dr. Merter has brought to bear his cumulative experience in the area of transpersonal psychotherapy. In particular, he has attempted to comprehend transpersonal psychology in the light of Sufism and, inspired by international studies in this area, create a synthesis. In the year 2005, Dr. Merter founded the Turkish Transpersonal Psychology Association in Üsküdar (Istanbul).


NAFS PSYCHOLOGY and THE LANGUAGE of DREAMS

In the new title of Dr. Merter, in order to understand nafs (soul), we will first contemplate on the views of Sigmund Freud, Carl Gustav Jung and some other researchers. While modern Western psychology narrates the two dimensional man to us (conscious and unconscious), nafs psychology will take us to a thrilling third dimension: the super unconscious or alemi misal (the intermediate realm). In this area, we will be meeting with mysteries that modern psychology does not know about, as if we are discovering a new continent. In the second part, we will be dealing with psychological illnesses in terms of nafs psychology: We will try to understand what anxiety, depression and neurosis mean according to the three dimensional nafs structure. In the third part, we will be thoroughly examining psychotherapy, especially psychotherapy that probes in depth. We will see that human beings are never alone even in the deepest pits they fall. In the final part, we will try to understand the language of dreams and take a careful step into the alemi misal, (the intermediate realm).




In terms of psychology, the science of nafs seems to be in its initial stages. We are hoping that this humble study presented to you will conduce to new ideas for young researchers.






DR. MICHAELA MİHRİBAN ÖZELSEL




FILIBELI AHMET HILMI


The son of Sehbender (that is to say, Consul) Süleyman bey, Filibeli Ahmed Hilmi was born in the Bulgarian city of Philoppopolis, or Plovdiv, in 1865. He was graduated from the Imperial Galatasaray High School at Istanbul. While in imperial service at Beirut, he was compelled to flee to Egypt because of his Young Turk activities. Here, he started up the newspaper Çaylak (Rookie). Though he returned to Istanbul in 1901, he was exiled to Libya by Sultan Abdulhamid II. While in Libva, he cultivated an interest in Sufism and became a member of the Arusiyya dervish order. He returned to Istanbul on the proclamation of the Second Constitutional government in 1908. The author of some forty works. Ahmed Hilmi died in 1913 and is buried in the courtyard of the Mosque of Mehmed II at Istanbul








ISTANBUL, A REALM OF FANCY: TALES À LA TURCA





OTTOMAN OBSERVERS OF THE EUROPEAN SCENE

In this comprehensive study, Dr. Bâki Asiltürk treats the full range of observations submitted to the reader by Ottoman travelers.
