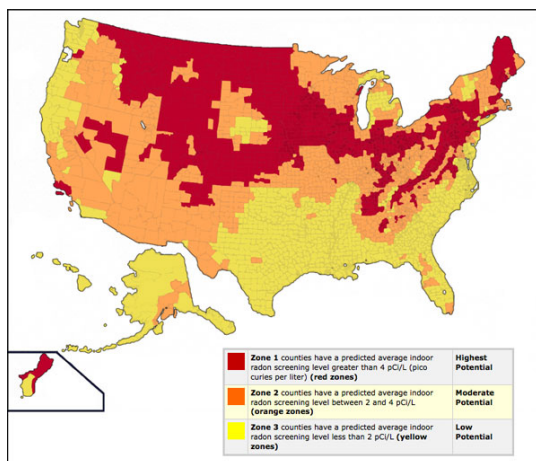

- Roughly 6 million homes in the USA have radon levels over 4 picocuries per litre (pCi/L), which is the remediation level the EPA recommends.

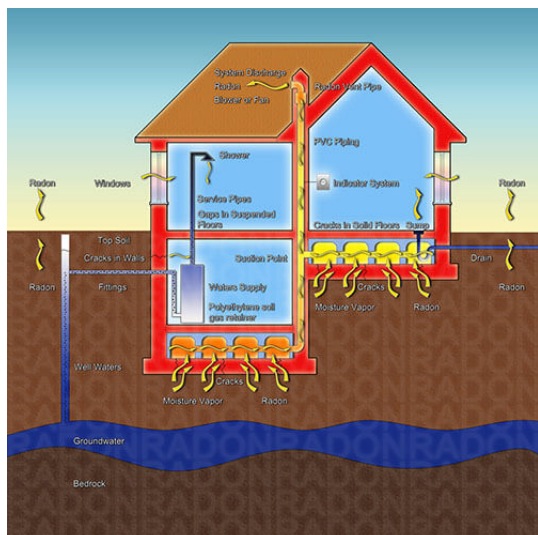
