

How to Loop YouTube Videos

Have there ever been YouTube videos that you found yourself wanting to watch or listen to repeatedly? Getting tired of always going back and pressing the replay button to restart it? Fortunately, it is simple to [loop YouTube videos](#) so that they play endlessly. We can assist you if you wish to learn how to achieve this.

We're going to walk you through the two techniques we advise using to loop YouTube videos. With screenshots, we'll walk you through each step so you can see how to complete it on your own. Keep in mind that both of these techniques will let you loop YouTube videos on a PC or Mac, but none will function on mobile devices (as the YouTube app does not allow for this). Let's talk about some of the kinds of YouTube videos you might want to loop before we get into the methods.

What kinds of videos would be good to loop?

- Keep a DIY project or culinary guide playing continually to assist you progress when learning something new.
- Watch music videos while playing your favorite songs repeatedly.
- Loop one of these films for direction as you practice meditation to get the most out of a long meditation session.
- Listen to soothing sounds to help you unwind, concentrate, or fall asleep.

Just a few of the types of videos you might wish to loop are listed above. Here are the instructions for our first approach to loop YouTube videos, which you may use once you've decided what kind of video you want to keep playing.

Right-click a YouTube video to have it loop.

1. Launch your favorite web browser and navigate to YouTube.com.

Fire up your preferred web browser on your computer. then open your browser and navigate to the YouTube website. The main YouTube homepage will appear.

2. Look up the particular video you want to loop.

Find the video you want to loop right now. Enter the video's title or keywords related to the category of videos you're looking for in the Search Bar at the top of the screen. Even better, try searching for a channel's name to see if one of their videos appears in the search results. To search, press the "Enter" key on your keyboard.

3. Launch the video and let it start playing.

Look through the search results after you've finished your YouTube search to determine if the video you want to loop is there. When you locate it in the results, click on the thumbnail or title of the video to launch it and begin playing.

4. To display a menu, right-click anywhere on the video window's top. Select Loop next.

You can now start your YouTube loop! Hover your mouse over the window containing the playing video while the video page is open. Next, perform a right click anywhere in the video player window to display a menu with YouTube options and settings. When the menu appears, choose Loop. The video loop control should now have a check mark next to it, indicating that it has been activated.

5. Take pleasure in playing your YouTube video repeatedly!

You're ready to watch your YouTube video repeatedly now that the loop feature has been enabled!

Change the URL to loop a YouTube video.

1. Open your web browser and go to YouTube.com.

Launch your web browser and navigate to YouTube.com to reach the home page.

2. Find the video you wish to repeat itself.

To find the video you want to loop, click the Search Bar and type its name into the box that appears.

3. Click the link to the video in the search results to access it.

Find the movie you wish to loop by scrolling through the page of search results that appears. To enter the video page, click the thumbnail or title of the video. As soon as you open it, the video will begin to play.

4. Check out the URL for the video.

Look at the specific URL of the video once you've reached the video page. When a video is posted to YouTube, a code is assigned to it, creating a special page on the YouTube website. You can locate the unique URL for each video by looking at the URL at the top of your screen. After the "v=" appears at the end, the text that specifies that this is the URL particularly for this video follows.

5. Include this extra code in the URL of the video.

To make this video loop, we'll now change the video's URL. We're going to add the following code to the end of the URL for the movie you want to loop:

```
autoplay=1&loop=1
```

Let's use the URL for the video you want to loop as an illustration:

<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=wr7Gy7VINB8>. Your changed URL would appear something like this if you used the example YouTube loop URL above:

<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=wr7Gy7VINB8&autoplay=1&loop=1>

Put the special code for the video you wish to loop into the template above.

6. Add the changed URL to your browser by pasting it.

We're going to copy and paste your changed URL into your web browser window now that you've created it. Select the text with your cursor, choose Copy from the context menu, and then click the URL you just established.

Now open a new browser tab and click in the top-right URL field. Make sure the text box is clear before using the right click to display a menu of choices. To paste a URL into your browser, click Paste.

To open the URL you created in your browser, press the "Enter" key on your keyboard.

7. Enjoy the looping YouTube video!

You can watch your YouTube looping video whenever you want when the page loads! If you choose to loop another YouTube video, simply follow these instructions again and utilize the URL modification template.
