From Jeremy

Dad (Edward) was born in Batu Pahat on the 21st of October 1967, his father owned a plantation and his mother was an English teacher. In 1986 Dad came to Adelaide to study and returned to Malaysia in 1991 after completing a double degree in law and accounting. He met mum while at Adelaide Uni and after 7 years of dating he finally got married to mum in 1995. Dad and mum had us 4 kids also known as the 4 Js or 4 "monkies" before returning to Australia in 2009. First, dad worked as a tax consultant before deciding to do his chambering and qualify to practice as a lawyer in Malaysia. He "lawyered" for a few years before deciding to pursue something new. He became a research analyst and after that decided to become a share remisier which is kinda like a stock broker. While in Adelaide, he worked to help set up a new institution of higher learning. As you can see, dad was a jack of all trades and had many talents.

Dad was always supportive of our hobbies but took special interest in music, asking the girls about their violin or viola progression, he bought josh his Cajon, learnt the drums so he could jam whenever anyone played the piano and asked his friends for advice (which was uncle Gerard at the time) before buying my guitar. He came to our caroling sessions to support and help us and always sang "ho ho ho" and did the ad libs for little drummer boy the loudest and he bought us all frozen drinks from KFC, making sure everyone was hydrated.

He also loved to listen to the girls practice and attended their concerts. A piece of advice that really stuck with the girls when they were practicing was if your softs aren't soft, how can your louds be loud. He played Justine's SACE viola solo performance recording many times in the hospital when he couldn't make it to the concert and listening to her playing filled him with great pride and joy.

Dad loved sports and was also very involved with our sports, taking my brother-Josh and I to our soccer and basketball games. He also enjoyed playing soccer with family and friends in the back yard or the local park but also had another interest in golf w here he met many friends.

Dad was the biggest supporter of Liverpool FC; he was always trying to convert everyone he met but most importantly he loved introducing everyone to our favorite sport that is football... or soccer. I remember when we used to stay up late or wake up early to catch every possible game. The most memorable memory was going to Greece with him when I was 12 to watch the Champion's league finals. We didn't win but the atmosphere in the city was amazing, or in 05 in Istanbul when dad came home from work excitedly asking me if I stayed up to watch the penalty shootouts. I'm so happy that dad was able to make one final trip to Anfield, and was able to once again live out his dreams at the Kop.

Dad loved to tell jokes and always carried a goofy smile on his face. He was always full of terrible jokes, but his go to joke whenever we told him a joke was, are you burger king's brother? Joe King. While his jokes were a bit lame, he carried a smile that would light up the world and as much as you resisted laughing at those dumb jokes, you couldn't help but to smile. Dad had a warm and kind soul that was always keen to help anyone in need no matter how big the problem was. After understanding the struggles of moving to a new country, he even started a business where he could help people settle in, allowing them to be more comfortable in a foreign place. Through this business he was able to meet many people that he now calls friends for life. And after reading all the messages of remembrance from his clients/friends I am so proud of the way he has touched the lives of so many by his kindness and generosity of spirit.

I'm thankful that he was able to surround himself with wonderful people, people that would always be there for him and supported him. People that would fill him with laughter and joy. Friends and family that would be there not only during the good but especially during the bad. I'm sure dad greatly enjoyed getting to know each and every one of you and appreciated your friendship.

I would like to thank everyone near and far, those that could make it and those who unfortunately couldn't due to the circumstances for all their support and good wishes. In particular, thank you Ah Kor (that's Sophia to the rest of you) for being with mum and helping the rest of the family during Dad's final stay at St Andrew's hospital. I will also like to extend a special thank you to Aunty Pat and Uncle Gerard for helping dad make food, assisting with funeral queries from mum, sending me prayers and guidance and also helping with the music today.

I just remember all the Liverpool games we watched together and rambunctiously singing You'll Never Walk Alone accompanied by the piano and drums. The 5 KM walks where we travelled to my favourite spot on Frost Street and practiced my Chinese. All of these are memories that I will take with me and never forget. It will be very hard for us to continue living our best lives, but whilst your life was cut tragically short, your spirit lives on in all the hearts you have touched.

Dad taught me to work hard, be kind to each other and that anything is possible if you put your mind to it. He was always there for us no matter what and we were so blessed to meet a man like him.

Goodbye dad, the man who raised me. We all love you very much and were all touched and changed for the better by your presence. I hope to make you proud. I'll miss you. We'll all miss you tremendously.

You never gave up on me and never gave up on us - You were and still are, the glue that held all of us together- the family, the extended family, the friendships - both here in Adelaide and overseas. Your love, care, thoughtfulness and selflessness was evident in your interaction with one and all. Needless to say, you were the more patient of us two - and definitely the better half!

I don't know what I did to deserve such a wonderful man - but I thank God that He sent you to me and that I was clever enough to realise how lucky I was and snap you up (although it may have taken us a while to get married after 7 years of dating!)
