With over 60 member organizations, ranging from mosques, to Islamic schools and community organizations based in the Chicagoland region, the CIOGC is made up of a very diverse body.

Muslims are represented by a wide array of ethnicities, races and cultures including African Americans, Nigerians, South Asians, Arabs, Bosnians, Albanians, Turks, Latinos, Caucasians and many more. The Council brings these extraordinary communities together in cooperation and collaboration to engage and work with the interfaith community, government, media and the public in general.

Our mission is to be the unifying federation of Islamic organizations of greater Chicagoland, the leading advocate of Muslim community interests and a catalyst for enriching American society.

Dear Muslim Community,

A picture is worth a thousand words. We are pleased to present to you a pictorial record of CIOGC accomplishments this year, thanks to Allah (swt) and your continued support. Your CIOGC presents a demonstration of unity, diversity, leadership, service and representation of the Chicago area Muslim community. We all are lucky to be so united, something that is lacking in many other metropolitan areas in the US.

The Council has continued its increased focus on our member organizations. The tradition of a Yearbook (that was re-initiated last year) has grown considerably this year. You will find in this book the profile and accomplishments of almost all of our major member organizations.

While we have made significant strides in the past year, we have also been met with challenges. One of them has been the targeting and scapegoating of the Muslim community relating to the arrest of three young Muslims over the past two years on charges of supporting or seeking to involve themselves with terrorist groups. We see that violent extremism is a disease that has plagued almost all communities across our country, as witnessed in numerous shootings in schools and other public places. For the Muslim community one arrest in 2012 on charges of terrorism was one too many.

CIOGC and its members continue to address the problem of violent extremism through support and promotion of programs for and by the youth. These programs have flourished over the past several years at mosques, Islamic schools, and centers across Chicagoland. CIOGC is also proactively encouraging our governmental agencies to do their part in rehabilitating young people with violent tendencies before giving up on them and putting them away. Parents of troubled teens are more likely to seek help from these programs.

We as a society need to understand and address the root causes of violent extremism. All three young Muslims arrested over the past two years expressed their frustration with our foreign policies that seem to be stacked up against Muslims in many parts of the world. We also know that they were not alone in expressing these frustrations. Nearly half of all Americans were opposed to the Iraq war that killed hundreds of thousands of Muslims and devastated a country.

The challenges that we face as a community are being able to identify root causes of the violent extremism, providing positive opportunities for Muslim youth, and working closely with law enforcement and government agencies to respond to and proactively prevent violent extremism. Islam is a religion of peace and CIOGC will continue to display this through our efforts to unify Muslims, work with the youth, partners of faith, media, and government.

Illinois Muslim Action Day

CIOGC held a successful 6th Annual Illinois Muslim Action Day on April 30 at the state capitol in Springfield, Illinois. During the event, Muslim community leaders met with Senators and Representatives to seek support for CIOGC's legislative agenda. A press conference was also held in which all Springfield media outlets attended.

Iftar with the Governor

Governor Pat Quinn hosted more than 100 Illinois Muslim community leaders for the second annual Governor's Iftar at the Executive Mansion in Springfield, Illinois, on July 2, 2014. Quinn inaugurated the custom in 2013 as part of his agenda to make Illinois the most welcoming state in the nation. Muslim leaders who attended the event were

also able to communicate with the Governor on various topics and issues pertinent to the Muslim community.

UPAJ Meeting with the Governor

Over 800 community activists, religious leaders and concerned citizens met with Governor Pat Quinn in January to discuss issues for which they sought an immediate response. Organized by United Power for Action and Justice (UPAJ), the meeting at Ascension Church brought together Jews, Christians, Sikhs, Muslims and other people of faith.

Voter Registration Drives

CIOGC hosted multiple voter registration drives throughout September 2014 at various locations, including the Downtown Islamic Cen-

ter (DIC), the Islamic Center of Naperville (ICN) and the Islamic Foundation of Villa Park. Drives were met by a large number of community members who saw the importance of getting involved in the voting process.

Muslim American Advisory Council

CIOGC closely works with the Muslim American Advisory Council (MAAC) to advise the Governor on ways to advance the role and civic participation of Muslim Americans in Illinois as well as ways in which Illinois can enhance trade and cooperation with Muslim-majority countries. Additionally, MAAC helps the State build relationships with and disseminate information to Muslim American communities across Illinois.


Internship Program
