

How To Multiplayer On Minecraft PE (Bedrock).

You can play Minecraft on your own or with a group of players. This makes the game more enjoyable and fun. Minecraft servers There are a variety of ways to create a multiplayer game. Each has its pros and cons. The process is simple however it can be a bit different depending on the platform used and the distance between players.

Minecraft has two official editions, Java and Bedrock. The Bedrock version, formerly called Pocket Edition, is supported on various platforms including Android, iOS and Windows 10, Xbox One, PS4, PS4, and Nintendo Switch.

There are some points you must keep in mind before creating games that are multiplayer. All the players trying to connect must have the same version of the game, and all players should be running the same edition of Minecraft (Java or Bedrock). When these requirements are met, the users can set up the game as a multiplayer.

Connecting with friends Connecting with friends Minecraft PE

1) Sending an invitation for an acquaintance

Gamers can either invite to their friends to join their world, or join their friends in the world. It is simple to use this feature. Users just need to open the title and then enter the world they want to invite. Once they have entered this world, they must send an invitation to their friend.

Xbox Live friends can be added to Minecraft, and in case the name of the friend isn't displayed players can add them through their gamer tag.

2) Setup a network

To play multiplayer games via this method, users must be connected to the same Wi-Fi network. Once they have done that, they must begin playing, and before entering the world they want to play in, players should go to the multiplayer settings and select the visible to LAN Players option.

The host then launches the world and their friends can join the game by selecting the Play button, which brings them to the Play menu. They can then go to the Friends section at the

top of the page to view the relevant LAN games.

3) Joining an online server

To connect to an online server in Minecraft Bedrock, players should know the server's name, address/URL, and port number. Once you have all the necessary information then start the game and click Play. From there, go to Servers via the Play Menu. There will be a lot of servers already available.

Gamers can join any of these servers. If they would like to join a different one, they will need to scroll down until they see the Add Server option. By filling in all of the information previously mentioned, players can join the server they want to.

4) Minecraft Realms

Minecraft Realm gives users the best experience in multiplayer by offering a wide range of breathtaking worlds to explore while allowing them to develop and host their own games.

You can host up to 10 players simultaneously on the server. The most appealing aspect is that other players can play at their leisure even if the host is not online.

It is simple to create Realms in Minecraft Bedrock Edition. Players need access their Play menu, and in Worlds located just below the Create New button on the left, the Realms option will be displayed. After the realm is created, all users need to do is invite their friends to join the realm.

Players are able to join Realms only if they are invited. Once the invitation is accepted, players must just navigate through the Play menu, then go to the Friends section. Here, they will see the Realm name they have been invited to and tap on it to join.
