Pair each Patons 3 1/4 mm (USA3) and 4 mm (USA 6) needles. 5 [5, 6, 6, 7, 7] buttons.

### Tension

On 4 mm needles, 21 sts and 30 rows to 10 cm (patt), 22 sts and 30 rows to 10 cm (stocking st).

It is important to check your tension before starting your garment. If there are too many stitches to 10 cm, your tension is tight and you should change to a larger size needle. If there are too few, your tension is loose and you should change to a smaller size needle.

#### Caution

It is essential to work to the stated tension, and we cannot accept responsibility for the finished product if any yarn other than the specified yarn is used.

#### **Abbreviations**

K=knit; P=purl; st=stitch; stocking st=1 row K, 1 row P; tog=together; inc=increase by working into front and back of st; dec=decrease by working 2 sts together; beg=beginning; alt=alternate; rep=repeat; cont= continue; nneas=masures; foll=following; rem=remain(ing); RS=right side; WS=wrong side; cm=centimetres; in=inches; mm=millimetres; sL1K=slip 1 knitways; yfwd=yarn forward; psso=pass slip st over; patt=pattern; 0=no st, row or time to be worked in this size; M1=make a st by picking up horizontal loop lying before next st and working into back of it.

### U.S.A. Glossary

Cast off=bind off; tension=gauge; knit up=pick up and knit; stocking st=stockinette st; yarn forward, yarn over needle or yarn round needle=yarn over.

Instructions are given for the first size, with larger size(s) given in square brackets []. Where only one figure is given this applies to both (all) sizes.

Before starting to knit, read the instructions carefully and circle all figures relating to your size with a coloured pencil.

### **BACK**

With 3 1/4 mm needles, cast on 59 [63, 71, 75, 81, 85] sts.

**Rib row 1** - (RS), K1, \*P1, K1; rep from \* to end.

**Rib row 2** - P1, \*K1, P1; rep from \* to end.

Rep these 2 rows for 4 [4, 5, 5, 6, 6] cm, ending with row 1.

Increase row - Rib 6 [5, 12, 8, 5, 8], \*M1 (by picking up horizontal loop lying before next st and working into back of it), rib 12 [9, 24, 15, 9, 5]; rep from \* to last 5 [4, 11, 7, 4, 7] sts, M1, rib to end (64 [70, 74, 80, 90, 100] sts).

Change to 4 mm needles and work in eyelet patt thus:

Row 1 - (RS), K.

Row 2 and every alt row - P.

Row 3 - K4 [1, 3, 6, 5, 4], \*yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K4; rep from \* to last 0 [3, 5, 2, 1, 0] sts, (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 0 [1, 1, 0, 0, 0] time, K0 [1, 3, 2, 1, 0].

**Row 5 - K.** 

Row 7 - K1 [4, 6, 3, 2, 1], \*yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K4; rep from \* to last 3 [0, 2, 5, 4, 3] sts, (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 1 [0, 0, 1, 1, 1] time, K1 [0, 2, 3, 2, 1].

Row 8 - P.

These 8 rows form patt.

Cont in patt and work a further 40 [44, 52, 56, 60, 68] rows, thus ending with row 8 [4, 4, 8, 4, 4] of patt.

**Next row** - K inc 1 st at centre (65 [71, 75, 81, 91, 101] sts).

Next row - K.

Work in diamond patt thus:

Row 1 - (RS), K1, \*yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso; rep from \* to end.

**Rows 2 and 3** - K.

Rows 4, 6, 8, 10 and 12 - P.

Row 5 - K5 [1, 3, 3, 1, 3], (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K5) 0 [1, 1, 0, 1, 0] time, \*K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K5; rep from \* to last 0 [3, 5, 8, 3, 8] sts, (K2tog, yfwd, K1) 0 [1, 1, 1, 1, 1] time, (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 0 [0, 0, 1, 0, 1] time, K0 [0, 2, 3, 0, 3].

Row 7 - K4 [2, 4, 2, 2, 2], (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K3) 0 [1, 1, 0, 1, 0] time, \*K2tog, yfwd, K3, yfwd, sL1K, K1,

psso, K3; rep from \* to last 1 [4, 6, 9, 4, 9] sts, (K2tog, yfwd) 0 [1, 1, 1, 1, 1, 1] time, K1 [2, 4, 3, 2, 3], (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K2) 0 [0, 0, 1, 0, 1] time.

**Row 9** - K3 [**3**, 0, **1**, 3, **1**], (K2tog, yfwd) 1 [**0**, 0, **1**, 0, **1**] time, (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K1, K2tog, yfwd) 0 [**1**, 0, **0**, 1, **0**] time, \*K5, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K1, K2tog, yfwd; rep from \* to last 10 [**3**, 5, **8**, 3, **8**] sts, (K5, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 1 [**0**, 0, 1, 0, 1] time, K3 [**3**, 5, 1, 3, 1].

Row 11 - K2 [4, 6, 0, 4, 0], (K2tog, yfwd, K7) 1 [0, 0, 1, 0, 1] time, \*yfwd, sL1K, K2tog, psso, yfwd, K7; rep from \* to last 4 [7, 9, 2, 7, 2] sts, (yfwd, sL1K, K2tog, psso, yfwd) 0 [1, 1, 0, 1, 0] time, (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 1 [0, 0, 1, 0, 1] time, K2 [4, 6, 0, 4, 0].

Row 13 - K2 [5, 7, 10, 15, 20], \*M1, K20; rep from \* to last 3 [6, 8, 11, 16, 21] sts, M1, K to end (69 [75, 79, 85, 95, 105] sts).

Starting with a P row, work in stocking st for 23 [29, 29, 29, 35, 41] rows, thus ending with RS facing for next row.

# Shape shoulders

Cast off 7 [8, 8, 9, 11, 12] sts at beg of next 4 rows, then 8 [8, 9, 9, 10, 12] sts at beg of foll 2 rows. Leave rem 25 [27, 29, 31, 31, 33] sts on a spare needle.

#### **LEFT FRONT**

\*\*With 3 1/4 mm needles, cast on 29 [31, 33, 37, 41, 43] sts and work in rib as on Back for 4 [4, 5, 5, 6, 6] cm, ending with row 2 [1, 1, 2, 1, 1].

**61, 66 and 76 cm sizes: Next row** - In rib inc 1 st at centre ([**32**, 34, 42] sts).

**81 cm size**: **Next row** - Rib 5, \*M1, rib 11; rep from \* to last 5 sts, M1, rib 5 (47 sts).

All sizes: Change to 4 mm needles and work in eyelet patt thus:\*\*

Row 1 - (RS), K.

Row 2 and every alt row - P.

Row 3 - K4 [1, 3, 6, 5, 4], \*yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K4; rep from \* to last st, K1.

Row 5 - K.

**Row 7** - K1 [4, 6, 3, 2, 1], \*yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K4; rep from \* to last 4 sts, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K2.

Row 8 - P.

These 8 rows form patt.

Cont in patt and work a further 40 [44, 52, 56, 60, 68] rows, thus ending with row 8 [4, 4, 8, 4, 4] of patt.

Next 2 rows - K.

Work in diamond patt thus:

**Row 1** - (RS), K1 [2, 2, 1, 2, 1], \*yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso; rep from \* to end.

Rows 2 and 3 - K.

Rows 4, 6, 8, 10 and 12 - P.

Row 5 - K5 [1, 3, 3, 1, 3], (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K5) 0 [1, 1, 0, 1, 0] time, \*K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K5; rep from \* to last 4 sts, K2tog, yfwd, K2.

Row 7 - K4 [2, 4, 2, 2, 2], (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K3) 0 [1, 1, 0, 1, 0] time, \*K2tog, yfwd, K3, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K3; rep from \* to last 5 sts, K2tog, yfwd, K3.

Row 9 - K3 [3, 0, 1, 3, 1], (K2tog, yfwd) 1 [0, 0, 1, 0, 1] time, (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K1, K2tog, yfwd) 0 [1, 0, 0, 1, 0] time, \*K5, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K1, K2tog, yfwd; rep from \* to last 4 sts, K4.

**Row 11** - K2 [4, 6, 0, 4, 0], (K2tog, yfwd, K7) 1 [0, 0, 1, 0, 1] time, \*yfwd, sL1K, K2tog, psso, yfwd, K7; rep from \* to last 8 sts, yfwd, sL1K, K2tog, psso, yfwd, K5.

Row 13 - K2 [5, 7, 10, 15, 20], M1, K20, M1, K to end (31 [34, 36, 39, 44, 49] sts).

Starting with a P row, work in stocking st for 11 [17, 17, 13, 19, 23] rows, thus ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape neck

**Next row** - K28 [30, 31, 34, 39, 43], turn and leave rem 3 [4, 5, 5, 5, 6] sts on a safety-pin.

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 6 [6, 6, 7, 7, 7] rows (22 [24, 25, 27, 32, 36] sts).

Work 5 [5, 5, 8, 8, 10] rows, thus ending with RS facing for next row.

Shape shoulder

Cast off 7 [8, 8, 9, 11, 12] sts at beg of next and foll alt row. Work 1 row. Cast off rem 8 [8, 9, 9, 10, 12] sts.

### RIGHT FRONT

Work as Left Front from \*\* to \*\*.

Row 1 - (RS), K.

Row 2 and every alt row - P.

Row 3 - K5, \*yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K4; rep from \* to last 0 [3, 5, 2, 1, 0] sts, (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 0 [1, 1, 0, 0, 0] time, K0 [1, 3, 2, 1, 0].

Row 5 - K.

Row 7 - K2, \*yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K4; rep from \* to last 3 [0, 2, 5, 4, 3] sts, (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 1 [0, 0, 1, 1, 1] time, K1 [0, 2, 3, 2, 1].

Row 8 - P.

These 8 rows form eyelet patt.

Cont in patt and work a further 40 [44, 52, 56, 60, 68] rows, thus ending with row 8 [4, 4, 8, 4, 4] of patt.

Next 2 rows - K.

Work in diamond patt thus:

**Row 1** - (RS), K1, \*yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso; rep from \* to last 0 [1, 1, 0, 1, 0] st, K0 [1, 1, 0, 1, 0].

Rows 2 and 3 - K.

Rows 4, 6, 8, 10 and 12 - P.

Row 5 - K2, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, \*K5, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso; rep from \* to last 5 [8, 10, 3, 8, 3] sts, (K5, K2tog, yfwd) 0 [1, 1, 0, 1, 0] time, K5 [1, 3, 3, 1, 3].

Row 7 - \*K3, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K3, K2tog, yfwd; rep from \* to last 9 [2, 4, 7, 2, 7] sts, (K3, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 1 [0, 0, 1, 0, 1] time, K4 [2, 4, 2, 2, 2].

Row 9 - K4, \*yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K1, K2tog, yfwd, K5; rep from \* to last 5 [8, 0, 3, 8, 3] sts, (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K1) 1 [1, 0, 1, 1, 1] time, (K2tog, yfwd) 0 [1, 0, 0, 1, 0] time, K2 [3, 0, 0, 3, 0].

Row 11 - K5, \*yfwd, sL1K, K2tog, psso, yfwd, K7; rep from \* to last 4 [7, 9, 2, 7, 2] sts, (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 1 [0, 0, 1, 0, 1] time, (yfwd, sL1K, K2tog, psso, yfwd) 0 [1, 1, 0, 1, 0] time, K2 [4, 6, 0, 4, 0].

Row 13 - K6, M1, K20, M1, K to end (31 [34, 36, 39, 44, 49] sts).

Work to match Left Front, reversing shapings, **noting** that an extra row will have to be worked before start of neck

and shoulder shaping.

### SLEEVES

With 3 1/4 mm needles, cast on 33 [35, 37, 39, 39, 41] sts and work in rib as on Back for 4 [4, 4, 5, 5, 6] cm, ending with row 1.

56, 61, 71 and 76 cm sizes: Increase row - Rib 2 [4, 5, 4], \*M1, rib 5 [7, 3, 2]; rep from \* to last 1 [3, 4, 3] sts, M1, rib to end (40 [40, 50, 56] sts).

66 and 81 cm sizes: Increase row -Rib [4, 3], (M1, rib 3) [3, 4] times, (M1, rib 2) 6 times, (M1, rib 3) [3, 4] times, M1, rib [3, 2] ([50, 56] sts).

All sizes: Change to 4 mm needles and work in eyelet patt as on 56 [56, 66, 66, 71, 71] cm size of Back, shaping sides by inc 1 st at each end of 3rd [3rd, 3rd, 3rd, 5th, 9th] and every foll 5th [5th, 8th, 9th, 9th, 6th] row until there are 62 [66, 70, 70, 78, 78] sts, taking inc sts into patt.

81 cm size: Inc 1st at each end of every foll 7th row until there are 88 sts. taking inc sts into patt.

All sizes: Work 1 [1, 1, 0, 1, 0] row, thus ending with RS facing for next row.

Next row - K inc 1 st at centre (63 [67, 71, **71**, 79, **89**] sts).

Next row - K.

Work in diamond patt thus:

Row 1 - (RS), K1, \*yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso; rep from \* to end.

Rows 2 and 3 - K.

Rows 4, 6, 8 and 10 - P.

Row 5 - K4 [1, 1, 1, 2, 2], (K2tog, yfwd, K1) 1 [0, 0, 0, 1, 0] time, (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 1 [0, 1, 1, 1, 0] time, \*K5, K2tog, yfwd, K1, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso; rep from \* to last 4 [6, 8, 8, 2, 7] sts, K4 [6, 5, 5, 2, 7], (K2tog, yfwd, K1) 0 [0, 1,

1, 0, 0) time.

Row 7 - K3 [5, 2, 2, 1, 1], (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K3) 0 [0, 1, 1, 0, 1] time, \*K2tog, yfwd, K3, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K3; rep from \* to last 0 [2, 4, 4, 8, 3] sts, K0 [2, 0, 0, 0, 0], (K2tog, yfwd) 0 [0, 1, 1, 1, 1] time, K0 [0, 2, 2, 3, 1], (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K1) 0 [0, 0, 0, 1, 0] time.

Row 9 - K2 [4, 3, 3, 0, 2], (yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K1) 0 [0, 1, 1, 0, 1] time, K2tog, yfwd, \*K5, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso, K1, K2tog, yfwd; rep from \* to last 9 [11, 3, 3, 7, 2] sts, (K5, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 1 [1, 0, 0, 1, 0] time, K2 [4, 3, 3, 0, 2].

Row 11 - K1 [3, 4, 4, 1, 3], (K2tog, yfwd) 1 [1, 0, 0, 0, 0] time, (yfwd, sL1K, K2tog, psso, yfwd) 0 [0, 1, 1, 0, 1] time, \*K7, yfwd, sL1K, K2tog, psso, yfwd; rep from \* to last 10 [12, 4, 4, 8, 3] sts, (K7, yfwd, sL1K, K1, psso) 1 [1, 0, 0, 0, 0] time, K1 [3, 4, 4, 8, 3].

Row 12 - P.

Cast off loosely.

### MAKE UP

Beehive DK or South Pacific DK or Knit 'n' Save DK - Omitting ribbing press lightly under a dry cloth using a cool iron.

Pure Wool Crepe DK or Diploma Gold DK - Omitting ribbing, press lightly following instructions on the ball band.

All yarns - Join shoulder seams.

Place centre of cast-off edge of sleeves to shoulder seams, then sew Sleeves to Back and Fronts. Join side and sleeve seams.

#### **Neck Border**

With RS facing and 3 1/4 mm needles, K3 [4, 5, 5, 5, 6] from safety-pin, knit up 12 [12, 12, 15, 15, 16] sts up right side of neck, K25 [27, 29, 31, 31, 33] from back, knit up 12 [12, 12, 15, 15, 16] sts down left side of neck, then K3 [4, 5, 5, 5, 6] from safety-pin (55 [59, 63, 71, 71, 77] sts).

Starting with row 2, work in rib as on Back for 4 [4, 4, 6, 6, 6] cm. Using a 4 mm needle, cast off loosely in rib.

Fold Neck Border in half to WS and slip-hem loosely in position.

## **Button Border**

With 3 1/4 mm needles, cast on 7 sts.

Row 1 - (RS), K1, (K1, P1) twice, K2.

Row 2 - K1, (P1, K1) 3 times.

Rep these 2 rows until Border when slightly stretched, fits up Left Front to top of Neck Border, sewing in place as you go along.

Cast off in rib. Mark position of 5 [5, 6, 6, 7, 7] buttons on Button Border with pins to ensure even spacing, first to come 1 cm up from lower edge, last to come in centre of Neck Border and reminder spaced evenly between.

# **Buttonhole Border**

Work as Button Border with the addition of 5 [5, 6, 6, 7, 7] buttonholes to correspond with pins on Button Border.

To make a buttonhole: (RS), rib 3, cast off 2, rib to end and back, casting on 2 over those cast off.

Sew on buttons.

Do not dry handknits in harsh sunlight as fading or yellowing may occur.

Pure Wool Crepe DK and South Pacific DK and Knit 'n' Save DK - Do not tumble dry.

Beehive DK and Diploma Gold DK You may tumble dry your garment in any domestic tumble dryer at temperatures of up to 60 °C.
