At this point, it's not clear when those casinos will start accepting sports bets. However, those interested can place a wager at several casinos in New Jersey and Delaware already. As of late August, SugarHouse offers online sports betting after New Jersey legalized sports betting in July after a decade-long battle.

ATLANTIC CITY- (Wayne Parry, Associated Press) - Not even the third time was the charm for the former Atlantic Club casino in Atlantic City, which on Thursday saw the third attempt to sell it fall through in as many years. The latest involved a bid by Stockton University to buy the casino property as part of its new Atlantic City campus. But Stockton wanted the parking garage and the land; the casino and hotel buildings would have been razed. TJM Properties of St. Petersburg, Florida, pronounced the deal dead Thursday. No purchase price was ever revealed. When Stockton agreed to buy the complex in August, it said a purchase price would be made public at the deal's closing. Nevada Casino Revenue Drops for Second Consecutive Month

September 27, 2018

LAS VEGAS- (Regina Garcia Cano, Associated Press) - Gambling revenue at Nevada casinos decreased for a second consecutive month in August, in line with the weak results that some casino-operators had projected for the ongoing quarter. A report released Thursday by the Nevada Gaming Control Board shows casinos won about \$913 million from gamblers in August. That's a 7.7 percent

decline compared with the same month last year. Senior board analyst Michael Lawton said the board was disappointed but not surprised by the results as casinos faced a difficult comparison with August 2017, which had a stronger calendar of events that included the marquee fight between Floyd Mayweather Jr. and Conor McGregor in Las Vegas.

GOP lawmakers push for new regulations on sports gambling

UNITED STATES- (CBS News) - House Republicans say they strongly favor new federal regulations on sports gambling after the Supreme Court allowed states to open sports books. At a hearing of a House Judiciary subcommittee, GOP members Thursday said they were concerned advertisements and online gambling platforms could target minors, and said they feared the potential for match-fixing. "For Congress to do nothing is the worst possible alternative," said Rep. Jim Sensenbrenner, a Wisconsin Republican. NFL still forbids on-air sports betting talk despite growing legalization

UNITED STATES- (Michael McCarthy, Sporting News) - If you bet Troy Aikman, Terry Bradshaw and other NFL TV personalities would make like Jimmy the Greek this football season, you lost money. Despite the legalization of sports betting in some states, the topic of gambling has been almost completely absent on NFL game telecasts from Fox, CBS, NBC, ESPN and NFL Network this season. Sources told Sporting News that the moratorium on sports betting through Week 3 also extends to NFL pregame shows such as Fox's top-rated "Fox NFL Sunday," CBS' "The NFL Today," NBC's "Football Night in America" and ESPN's "Sunday NFL Countdown," as well as weekday programming, such as ESPN's "NFL Live."
