<p>15.30-17.00</p>	<p>Analysing networks among Central Asian researchers To build up the SEnECA Research Database, work package 1 maps researchers working partially or full-time on Central Asia in Europe and on European integration in Central Asia. In order to identify supportive and impeding circumstances of research cooperation, this dataset will be used to conduct a network analysis, which researches the current state of affairs in the field. It will analyse the density of links between certain subgroups of researchers within the network, such as citation circles, as well as areas where links are very loose. 
