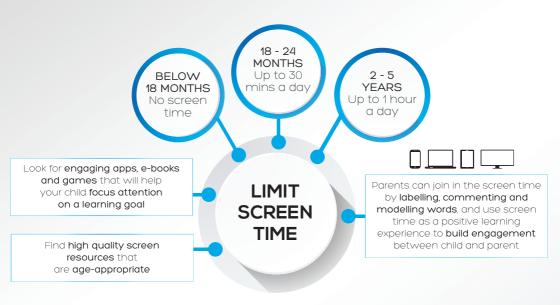

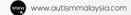


Excessive screen time can lead to poorer language, listening skills and attention span.

# MONITOR KEY MILESTONES

Please get a professional opinion if your child has missed some of these milestones.

### 4 MONTHS

Maintains eye contact Smiles at people Starts to coo and make gurgling sounds

### 9 MONTHS

Understands 'no' Uses finger to point Makes sounds like "bababa" and "mamama" Sits without support

#### 18 MONTHS

Has between 10 to 50 words Imitates facial expressions

#### 30 MONTHS

#### **6 MONTHS**

Responds to name Starts making "ah", "eh", "oh" sounds Can roll from back to stomach

### 12 MONTHS

Able to shake head "no", wave "bye" and play 'peekaboo' Able to say 1 to 3 words Walks with support

### 24 MONTHS

Starts speaking in phrases and Imitates adult behaviour Starts to run

### 36 MONTHS

Talks in a long monologue
