Hundreds of local leaders, business partners, and other community organizations were in attendance as Pharr Mayor, Dr. Ambrosio Hernandez, hosted the third annual State of the City Address on January 17, 2019. Hernandez, a pediatric surgeon by trade, began his address by proudly announcing that, as Pharr's primary care provider, "the diagnosis of the state of the city of Pharr is healthy, vibrant and flourishing," and that "its prognosis is excellent and expected to move forward on a continued path of success."

During his remarks, Hernandez highlighted significant accomplishments for the previous year and discussed many new projects on the horizon for 2019, including Pharr's goal of becoming a "smart city" and aspirations to achieve the prestigious Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award – the nation's highest

presidential honor for performance excellence.

Following a tradition that began in the inaugural State of the City, Hernandez presented the "Polo Palacios Service Award" to a Pharr citizen who embodied the legacy of service set forth by the award's namesake. This year's recipient was Dr. Daniel P. King, Superintendent of Schools for Pharr-San Juan-Alamo (PSJA) ISD. According to Hernandez, Dr. King was selected for his legacy of transformational work in the field of education and the impact it has had on the lives of students and families across PSJA ISD.

With excess proceeds from the sponsor-funded event, Hernandez also presented three local nonprofit organizations each with a \$5,000 donation. Organizations recognized included Valley Interfaith,

Team Mario, and the Knights of Columbus Council #9791.

Hernandez ended the event by inviting Texas Workforce Commissioner Representing Labor, Julian Alvarez onstage for a special announcement. Commissioner Alvarez awarded Dr. King and the PSJA ISD School Board of Trustees with a \$280,630 Jobs and Education for Texans (JET) grant. The JET grant program allocates \$10 million each biennium to defray start-up costs associated with the development of career and technical education programs to public community and technical colleges and independent school districts.

The City of Pharr and Mayor Hernandez thank everyone for helping make Pharr's State of the City Address a success. Working together, let's continue to imagine!

Pharr Leads Sales Tax Growth in the RGV!

The sales tax allocation report for February 2019 showed that Pharr received \$2.46 million for the month of December 2018. This amount reflects a substantial increase - 43.68% - from the same reporting period in December 2017. This sales tax growth was one of the largest in Hidalgo County for this reporting period.

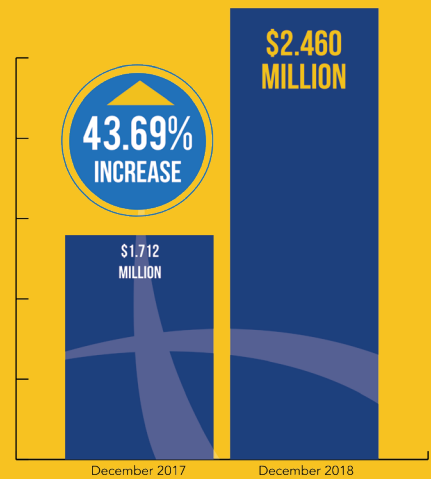

SALES TAX ALLOCATION

Pharr Ranks Amongst Safest Cities to Live

The City of Pharr was recently ranked among the safest places to live in Texas! A new study by Safehome.org released its rankings of all the safest cities in the United States with populations above 50,000 based on crime types and trends. Pharr earned a top spot as the 25th safest city in the state and is among the highest ranked in the Rio Grande Valley.

"We are committed to working with our law enforcement partners to ensure that our Pharr families are safe and secure," said Mayor Ambrosio Hernandez, M.D. "Pharr has an outstanding public safety department and partnerships with our local agencies which help us not only create a safe environment for our citizens but also foster a positive relationship within our community," he added. "The entire Pharr City Commission is proud of this recognition and we thank all our city, local, state, and federal law enforcement partners for helping contribute to this recognition."

According to the study, Pharr ranked as the 25th safest city in Texas out of the top 60 ranked, with six cities from the Rio Grande Valley also making the list. The study indicates that Texas is home to many of the safest cities in the United States.

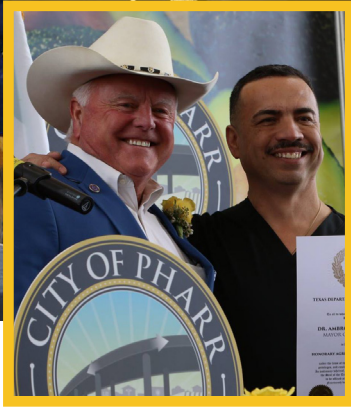
transfer. The parties will conduct these initiatives to increase business opportunities and strengthen the cultural, historic, and economic ties between the cities.
