Roblox's "oof" Sound is Dead. Long Live Roblox's 'oof' Sound

Roblox has removed an integral element of the game. The developer explained that it was due to an issue with licensing.

Roblox Corporation, the developer of the massively multiplayer online game announced Tuesday's decision via Twitter and also announced that a new game was to be launched on the platform.

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"Related sounds," Roblox has removed the "oof!" sound and created the default sound that is available today, the company announced on Twitter.

As Kotaku mentions, the "oof" sound was invented by a former game composer and Intellivision CEO Tommy Tallarico and it's not the first time Roblox has had to deal with licensing issues around it.
