

Raw, Wet, Or Dry: Which Type of Dog Food is Best for Your Dog

Raw Dog Food

People who prefer to feed their dog raw food generally are of believe that dogs must thrive on food that they used to eat, i.e. way meat, before humans domesticated them. Most of the manufacturers of way [dog food supplies](#) list the benefits of raw food as shinier coats, smaller stools, higher energy levels, and healthier skins.

The wet dog food options, suggests an expert of [pet dog supplies](#), tends to be more palatable as compared to other dog food options as it tends to have more intense taste and smell, and a higher level of moisture content which helps the dog stay hydrated, which is really important especially if your dog doesn't drink ample amount of water.

Benefits of wet dog diet includes firmer stools, healthier weight, healthy skin, shiny coat, and improved digestion. Wet dog food has all the necessary nutritional benefits that's available in way dog food diet, especially when the dog food is steam-cooked gently and packed appropriately.

Dry Dog Food

You can find wide range of dry dog food options available and all of it can vary a lot in price, and in cooking method. Baked, extrusion, cold-pressed, freeze dried, or air dried – each of the methods having its own set of pros and cons.

Whichever type of dry dog food you may choose to select, you must make sure that you choose a premium dry dog food from a reputed dog food supplies store, in order to make sure that it contains only high-quality ingredients. Make sure that the dry food that you select isn't containing cheap protein in form of meat meal or cheap fillers such as corn, as it can indicate the low quality of that dog food.

Dry dog food tends to be digested slower, so if your dog tends to put on weight easily and get minimal exercise, then you might want to consider a senior/light, or mixer option. A mixer includes a base of dry dog food that's topped with either raw or wet dog food. Mixers can provide your dog with a perfect balance and variety in their diet, but one needs to ensure that they get the right percentages of each type of dog food.
