It's also important to silence your phone so that the animals don't get in danger of being disturbed. You don't want to disturb the animals and endanger your own safety or that of others.

3. Photograph with a camera

Having a good camera will allow you to take some amazing photos of your trip. A wide-angle lens is essential, since you will want to capture every moment of the activity surrounding you! A zoom lens will allow you to be more flexible when composing your shots.

A teleconverter can also be helpful because it allows you to capture more detail in a shorter distance. Bring a waterproof bag to keep your gear dry in the event of rain.

4. Look comfortable in comfortable Clothes
