INTENSIVE & VERY SHORT PROGRAM

In the year 2016, Yayasan AFS
Antarabudaya Malaysia has sent
41 students in total to 7 countries
which includes China, Denmark,
Finland, Italy, Japan, Germany
and Spain. For this year, MEXT
scholarship from the Japanese
Government was awarded to 5
students respectively from Selangor,
Kuala Lumpur, Melaka and Kelantan.
We are currently looking to expand
our programs to more countries for
Intensive and Very Short Program in
the near future.

SEMESTER, YEAR & COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAM

As of year 2016, we have sent a total of 102 participants. The total number of participants includes the Semester Program, Year Program for both Southern and Northern Hemisphere (SH and NH cycle). For the SH cycle, 36 Year Program and 66 Semester Program participants have successfully completed the program. A total number of 53 students has received either full or partial scholarship this year to go for the program. The scholarship are Yavasan AFS Anatarbudaya Malaysia, Kamenori, AAI, AFS Global Changemaker, KL-YES and British Petroleum Scholarship. AFS Malaysia has sent 1 participant for the Community Service (18+) Program this year to Denmark for a Semester. We hope to expand the list of countries for this program in future.





KENNEDY-LUGAR YOUTH EXCHANGE & STUDY PROGRAM

A total of 45 students were selected as finalists for the Kennedy-Lugar Youth Exchange & Study Semester Program to the United States for the year 2016. The program, which is funded by the U.S. Department of State, provides scholarships for secondary school students from countries with significant Muslim population to spend up to a year in the United States. Participants serve as "youth ambassadors" of Malaysia, promoting mutual understanding by forming lasting relationships with their host families and communities. The YES Alumni played a big role in preparing the students at the Pre-Departure Orientation. The students were also invited to a Luncheon hosted by the US Embassy during their Pre-Departure Orientation. This gave them the opportunity to meet and mingle with fellow American representatives.

Program Overview:

Hosting

he hosting number for 2016 in total is 63 participants with school based 45 pax and 18+ community service program 18 pax for both SH and NH cycles. As for the school based program, Japan and Italy was the largest sending partners and Germany remains as the major sending partners for 18+ community service program.

In 2016, we hosted a participant from Thailand again which the last we hosted participant from our neighbor country was in the year 2013. And yet, it was a successful exchange journey for the participant.

Besides that, the hosting highlights were our Festive Exchange program where we places the students to a different host families with different races for them to experience different celebration that is happening throughout the year. For those who are leaving with a Chinese family, we will place them in Indian and Malay family during the Deepavali and Eid Celebration, and vice versa, during the Chinese New Year celebration. The Festival Exchange has always been our most favorite experience for the hosted students.

In addition, we also involve our school based participants with the two weeks short term exchange program, well known as STE Program. During these two weeks exchange, the







participants able to get the opportunity to learned about the very unique and authentic cultural experience as the participants will be place in different state in Malaysia such as Sarawak, Terengganu, Kelantan, Pahang and Kedah. As all of you might know, STE is one of the awaited cultural enrichment activities by the hosted students in Malaysia. The STE is conducted twice a year, in March (NH Batch) and in September (SH Batch).
