## The Trump Document

#### There is ample evidence indicating collusion between the Trump campaign and Russia.

Let's begin our journey with George Papadapoulos. This Trump campaign foreign policy advisor, who has plead guilty to charges laid out by Special Counsel Mueller's investigation, provides a timeline of events. He was offered dirt on Hillary Clinton by a mysterious professor with ties to Russia. The Trump campaign knew of hacked emails before Trump made his rally speech in which he asked Russia to release their collection of hacked emails. Special Counsel Mueller's indictment of Papadapoulos listed him as a proactive cooperator - the implication being that Papadopoulos might have engaged with his former colleagues on behalf of investigators. Professor Mifsud, the individual with ties to Russia that had met with Papadapoulos offering dirt on Clinton, has since gone missing.

After Papadapoulos was offered dirt, top Trump campaign officials met with Russian operatives. Paul Manafort, Jared Kushner, and Trump Jr. were present at the infamous Trump Tower meeting where adoptions were discussed with Russian operatives. Adoptions is an established euphemism used in reference to the Magnitsky Act, sanctions that are meant to cripple the power of Putin. President Trump's son, son-in-law, and Campaign Manager met with Russians with the expectation of receiving damaging information about Clinton. One of the Russian operatives present at the meeting, Rinat Akhmetshin, has ties to Russian intelligence and has a history of being embroiled in court cases related to hacking campaigns. During Fusion GPS CEO Glenn Simpson's Congressional testimony he confirmed that the Trump campaign likely received foreign intelligence aid as Manafort had close ties to Russian Intelligence.

We know Manafort was in contact with Russian Oligarch Oleg Deripaska during the campaign. We know Paul Manafort offered to give the Russian billionaire private briefings on the Trump campaign trail. [10] Manafort used a campaign account for the aforementioned email correspondence. [11] According to videos recorded by an escort that were discovered by Russian opposition activist, Alexei Navalny, show Deripaska meeting a Russian Deputy Prime Minister on a yacht 1 month after the email correspondence between Manafort and Deripaska took place, the United States came up as a topic of discussion. [12] Russia has threatened to block access to social media sites, such as YouTube and Instagram, if they do not remove the videos of Deripaska and Russian Deputy Prime Minister Prikhodko meeting on the yacht. [13]

Now here's another avenue of possible collusion, Roger Stone. [14] While Roger Stone has attempted to downplay his communication with Guccifer 2.0, he has admitted to have been in contact with the DNC hacking suspect. [15] According to the Daily Beast report, US investigators have found out that Guccifer 2.0 is a Russia Intelligence Officer that worked for the GRU. [16] The discovery was made because the Russian officer forgot to use a VPN while logging into Twitter and Wordpress. Last month investigative journalists discovered direct contact made between Roger Stone and Wikileaks. [17] We also know that Special Counsel Mueller has been asking questions about whether or not President Trump knew of the hacked DNC emails before they were released. They've asked about the relationship between GOP operative Roger Stone and WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange, and why Trump took policy positions

favorable to Russia. [18] WikiLeaks can be considered an extension of Russia's 2016 disinformation campaign, [19] we knew that WikiLeaks shared material hacked by the GRU [20] before The Daily Beast report was released.

There are 2 excuses peddled I often see in response to my sourced comment; Firstly that the Russian hackers would be too intelligent to forget to turn on their VPN, secondly that the Trump campaign receiving dirt on Clinton from Russia is not illegal. Both claims are wrong.

**To the first point** - While the system the Russian hackers use is indeed genius, that doesn't mean it's impervious from human error. In fact here is a CSE report from 2011 that elaborates on that point. The CSE, Communications Securities Establishment, is Canada's national cryptologic agency that collects foreign signal intelligence in order to inform and alert the Government of Canada to the activities of foreign entities outside Canada.

But a 2011 presentation to the NSA and its foreign partners by Canada's signals intelligence agency, the Communications Security Establishment, undermines the notion of a foreign hacker so skilled that a victim would never know their identity. The document calls Russian hackers "morons" for routinely compromising the security of a "really well designed" system intended to cover their tracks; for example, the hackers logged into their personal social and email accounts through the same anonymizing system used to attack their targets, comparable to getting an anonymous burner phone for illicit use and then placing calls to your girlfriend, parents, and roommate.

And to the second point - In short, what the Trump campaign did could very well be illegal according to Federal Election Commission laws.[3]

Foreigners who aren't U.S. citizens or U.S. permanent residents, the argument goes, are barred from providing candidates any "thing of value" in connection with any American election campaign. Campaign staff are barred from soliciting any "thing of value" from such foreigners. And, the argument goes, valuable political information about an opponent's misdeeds is a "thing of value." (Hasen notes that the Federal Election Commission has treated some information, such as contact lists, campaign materials, and polling information as a "thing of value.")

Trump Jr. may have broken campaign finance laws if Russia provided illegal campaign contributions, which seems incredibly likely at this point. [4]

Trump Jr. could have run afoul of campaign finance law if Russia was offering an illegal campaign contribution that he agreed to accept. To be considered an illegal campaign contribution, what Russia offered must be considered "of value," as defined by campaign finance law. There are reasons to question whether simply exchanging information with a foreign national would count.

Now how does this differ from the Clinton campaign doing opposition research? We can ascertain the thought that something of value was given to the Trump campaign illegally, as outlined in my comments. A foreign nation was not offering dirt on President Trump, the Clinton campaign went through the correct procedures and hired an American research company, Fusion GPS, to conduct opposition research. Futhermore, Fusion GPS and Glenn Simpson had already begun doing opposition research on Trump during the GOP primary. Fusion GPS was initially hired by Conservative Paul Singer through the Washington Free Beacon. This op-ed does a good job explaining it; [5]

The other answer is more subtle. Adav Noti, who served as a Federal Election Commission lawyer between 2007 and 2017, told me that all of this goes back to the ban on contributions and donations from foreign governments or foreign nationals in federal elections. The law has been on the books since the 1970s, and he said it applies to promises of deleted emails and other kinds of opposition research.

"There is a real meaningful distinction," said Noti, who is now senior director of the Campaign Legal Center, a nonpartisan group that monitors election law. "The Clinton campaign, based on what has

## been reported, paid for opposition research, which included paying people to dig up dirt in foreign countries." Unsavory? Perhaps. But not illegal.

Compare that to what we know about George Papadopoulos, a low-level Trump campaign foreign-policy adviser, who has pled guilty to lying to the FBI. The plea agreement, released Monday by Mueller, says Papadopoulos emailed a Russian professor and another Russian contact who promised to turn over Clinton's emails free of charge.

Or consider the meeting in the summer of 2016 between Donald Trump Jr. and Russian nationals who reportedly offered to hand over dirt on Clinton. Noti said that if the Trump officials solicited the information, "the act itself was unlawful."

Noti cannot be dismissed as a partisan. Last week, his law center filed a formal complaint with the FEC against the Clinton campaign and the Democratic National Committee for filing misleading federal reports that hid the contract with Fusion GPS. "They routed the money through their legal counsel so that no payment showed up on their federal disclosures," Noti said. "The activity was legal, but they misreported it."

Glenn Simpson, former Wall Street Journal journalist, is the CEO of Fusion GPS and is American. President Trump and the GOP have repeatedly tried to paint him as someone on the "left", but Simpson is far from that. His previous investigative work has uncovered many Democratic scandals, he has been lauded by the right. He has investigated and brought down many Democratic politicians, including previously investigating the Clintons. It just so happens that he's landed his biggest find, Trump and Russia. When the Conservative Paul Singer and his Washington Free Beacon wanted Trump research, which was then continued by the Clinton campaign, Simpson used his network of contacts to probe President Trump's financial ties to Russia. I've been friends with "Shaggy," as I dubbed him, ever since. Over the years, I've watched him make mischief: exposing the Clintons' campaign finance abuses, including the "Chinagate" scandal of 1996; scoring a key scoop in the Clinton travel office scandal; bedeviling Clinton financier Terry McAuliffe; and forcing the resignation of James Johnson, a top Obama adviser in 2008, over the Countrywide scandal.

... This is the same Journal editorial page that repeatedly praised Simpson's work when he was bringing down Democrats. It hailed "enterprising reporters such as the Journal's own Glenn Simpson" for exposing the hypocrisy of the Clinton fundraising operation. Paul Gigot, now editorial page editor, also praised the "enterprising" Simpson for a scoop about Anita Hill. The page cited Simpson's book on corruption, and even before Simpson came to the Journal, it reprinted and hailed his "illuminating" scoop for Roll Call about Democratic Speaker of the House Tom Foley (Wash.) making money from insider stock tips.

... Simpson's foreign-money investigations infuriated politicians of all stripes. With Jill Abramson (later top editor at the New York Times), he helped break key stories about John Huang, Webb Hubbell and overseas Asian interests giving big campaign gifts to Democrats.

After the 9/11 terrorist attacks, Simpson probed terrorism financing. Then he went to Brussels under Journal bureau chief Peter Fritsch (now his Fusion partner) and became fascinated with Russian money. In March 2007, he wrote to Paul Manafort with a prescient inquiry, saying he had "credible information"

that the future Trump campaign manager represented Ukrainian official Viktor Yanukovych without registering as a foreign agent. A decade later, Robert Mueller indicted Manafort over exactly that.

At Fusion, Simpson has investigated political money for clients of all persuasions, including a hedge-fund manager and more than a few Trump supporters. So it follows that when conservative Paul Singer's Washington Free Beacon and then the Democrats wanted Trump research, Simpson used his intelligence contacts from Brussels to probe Trump's financial ties to Russia.

### How do Cambridge Analytica and WikiLeaks play into all of this?

Cambridge Analytica wanted to work with Wikileaks, an extension of Russia's disinformation apparatus. Cambridge Analytica<sup>[1]</sup> is a data analysis organization that purchases and compiles demographic data on voters and is run by the Mercer family, the CEO was recently caught on camera admitting that they won President Trump the election. Cambridge Analytica were hired by the Trump Campaign.<sup>[2]</sup> We know that Cambridge Analytica reached out to Wikileaks during the 2016 presidential election.<sup>[3]</sup> Rebekah Mercer wanted to organize the hacked DNC emails.<sup>[4]</sup> Cambridge Analytica is under investigation by the Russia probe.<sup>[5]</sup> Wikileaks can be considered an extension of Russia's disinformation apparatus,<sup>[6]</sup> sharing material hacked by the GRU.<sup>[7]</sup>

Steve Bannon was a member of the board at Cambridge Analytica until he stepped down and became the campaign Chairman for Trump, later becoming his Chief Strategist in the White House. [8] Steve Bannon oversaw the collection of Facebook data in 2014 and was the boss of current Cambridge Analytica CEO Alexander Nix. [9]

"We had to get Bannon to approve everything at this point. Bannon was Alexander Nix's boss," said Wylie, who was Cambridge Analytica's research director. "Alexander Nix didn't have the authority to spend that much money without approval."

The Cambridge Analytica whistleblower has come out and said that in 2014 CA was testing slogans, such as *drain the swamp* and *deepstate*, the Trump campaign later adopted these slogans. [10] The Paradise Papers leak confirms that the Mercer family used off-shore money, hidden to avoid taxation, to fund Bannon and attacks on Hillary Clinton. [11]

Their efforts, compounded with Russian interference, helped Donald J. Trump win the presidency of the United States of America. Just to summarize Special Counsel Mueller's indictment of 13 Russians and 3 Russian entitities, [12] Russian operatives used stolen US identities, travelled across 9 states collecting intelligence, discussed escape routes if they were caught inside the country, bought equipment including burner phones/SIM cards. This operation included hundreds of employees conducting information warfare during the election, it was funded with millions of dollars from the Kremlin. Russia was and is actively pushing propaganda and fake news to create a system that manipulates the narrative using social media sites as conduits for this endeavour. It took less than 80 thousand votes in 3 states to flip the electoral college vote in favour of President Trump. [13] Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein put it best when he said that Russia was waging information warfare. [14] This is a Republican who was appointed by President Trump. [15]

Cambridge Analytica has its hands all over this administration. A Trump appointee working as a special assistant to the secretary at the Department of Commerce was once a Cambridge Analytica employee. The Secretary to the Department of Commerce is Wilbur Ross, a long time friend of President Trump. Wilbur Ross was the vice-chair of Bank of Cyprus, the paradise paper leaks confirm that Ross has personal business ties to Putin's son-in-law.

Donald Trump's commerce secretary, Wilbur Ross, is doing business with Vladimir Putin's son-in-law through a shipping venture in Russia.

Leaked documents and public filings show Ross holds a stake in a shipping company, Navigator, through a chain of offshore investments. Navigator operates a lucrative partnership with Sibur, a Russian gas company part-owned by Kirill Shamalov, the husband of Putin's daughter Katerina Tikhonova.

Ross, a billionaire and close friend of Trump, retained holdings in Navigator after taking office this year. The relationship means he stands to benefit from the operations of a Russian company run by Putin's family and close allies, some of whom are under US sanctions.

Cambridge Analytica's parent company, Strategic Communications Laboratories (SLC), has been awarded a contract from the State Department to fight ISIS propaganda. [4] However, the timing of the contract does raise eyebrows.

When that deal was inked, SCL and Cambridge Analytica had just helped orchestrate a massive upset in the 2016 presidential election, and were viewed as power players in data analytics.

## Quick Timeline of Cambridge Analytica and hacked DNC emails:

- Summer 2015 Corey Lewandowski, Trump's future campaign manager, is in talks with Cambridge Analytica (2).
- Summer 2015 Michael Flynn, an advisor of Cambridge Analytica (3), meets Donald Trump (4).
- July 2015 DNC is hacked (5).
- December 2015 Michael Flynn sits with Putin at an RT Gala in Moscow (6).

- At some point Peter Smith, in coordination with Michael Flynn, contacted various hacker groups, including at least two connected to the Russians, in hopes of finding Hillary Clinton's 30,000 deleted emails (7).

- Aug 14, Trump adviser Roger Stone direct messages Russian intelligence agent Guccifer 2.0 (11)(13). Roger Stone admits being in contact with Guccifer (10).
- Guccifer 2.0 leaks DNC hacked memo directly to Kushner-owned Observer (12)

## Nigel Farage may have given Julian Assange the DNC and Podesta hacked emails.

Cambridge Analytica has a history of using hacked emails in their campaigns. Alexander Nix, CEO of Cambridge Analytica, met with Israeli hackers at his office in London and used the hacked materials they provided in his campaign against Buhari in Nigeria (1).

...Russian hackers [tried] to retrieve emails from Clinton's server and pass them along to Flynn, who would then share them with the Trump campaign (7).

Based on this, Cambridge Analytica may have first received the hacked emails and then transferred them to Julian Assange, perhaps through Nigel Farage.

Nigel Farage is good friends with Cambridge Analytica vice-president at the time, Steve Bannon (14).

Nigel Farage was a frequent guest of the Ecuadorian embassy where Julian Assange resides and once passed a thumb drive to Assange (15).

Nigel Farage is a person of interest in the Mueller probe (16)

Can you blame Dowd for resigning? I stand by my statement - President Trump and his administration are a Russian asset. The HIC investigation is a farce.

Let's begin with a Russian backed Assad regime assault on a US base in Syria. We know that Yevgeny Prigozhin gave the go ahead for Assad forces and Russian mercenaries to attack a US base in Syria a few weeks ago. [1] Prigozhin, Putin's chef, was indicted by Special Counsel Mueller.

This operation was funded through Russian fronts, including a catering company run by Prigozhin. They used stolen American identities. An American selling the stolen identities has pled guilty, although his attorney has stated that he did not know who he was selling the stolen identities to. [6] Operatives bought political ads on social media sites. Operatives visited the United States, travelled across 9 states and discussed escape routes if they were caught inside the country. Operatives bought equipment including burner phones and SIM cards. This operation included hundreds of employees, Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein put it best - the Russians conducted information warfare during the election. [7]

Want to know why they are Russian assets? President Trump and his administration have refused to stop Russian election interference, he has failed to create or enact new sanctions against Russia, in fact they have made a mockery of the process. There were sanctions that were passed overwhelmingly by Congress in retaliation for Russia's election meddling and human rights abuses, President Trump refused to apply all the sanctions. The administration claimed that the threat of sanctions was enough to dissuade business with Russia. To add insult to injury Secretary Steve Mnuchin and the Treasury Department had been given 6 months to create a list of Russian political figures and Oligarchs with close ties to Putin and all they produced was a list copied directly from a Russian edition of Forbes billionaire list, further indication that the administration refuses to take sanctions against Russia seriously. A Treasury Department spokesperson confirmed that the list was taken from Forbes Magazine.

Secretary of State, Rex Tillerson, was awarded Russia's Order of Friendship award. [12] He has shut down the State Department office that oversees sanction policies. [13] Tillerson has completely gutted a formerly functioning State Department essentially crippling US influence abroad. [14] He has

systematically dismantled the State Department with major cuts to leadership roles, these are career diplomats who have served under different administrations and possess unparalleled experience. [15] President Trump is now instigating a trade war while America's global influence deteriorates.

They have done nothing while the United States Intelligence Agencies have confirmed that a foreign nation interfered with the American election process, that foreign nation being Russia. The Intelligence Agencies heads unanimously agree that the Russians will attack the 2018 election. President Trump has refused to act, NSA Director Admiral Rodgers admitted last week that Trump has not ordered disruption of Russian election meddling.

In 2014 Deripaska sued Manafort for a cool \$19 million claiming that Manafort and Gates had stolen funds intended for an investment. The Associated Press were the first ones to discover their business dealings and Deripaska attempted and failed at suing AP for libel.

Zwaan's father-in-law is no ordinary Russian oligarch, he is German Khan<sup>[1]</sup> and owns Alfa Group.<sup>[2]</sup> German Khan and his partners opened Alfa Bank which is the largest privately owned Russian bank.<sup>[3]</sup>

What's odd is that Alfa Bank repeatedly looked up contact information of a Trump Tower server, making up 80% of the traffic during the campaign. President Trump's Secretary of Education, Besty DeVos, is connected to the Trump Tower server through her husband's company Spectrum Health. Together with Alfa Bank they made up 99% of the lookups of the Trump server in the summer of 2016. [4]

Betsy DeVos's brother is none other then Erik Prince, he proposed a private spy network for President Trump and was an advisor during the campaign. Erik Prince held a secret meeting in Seychelles to establish a Trump-Putin back channel. Prince told congressional house members that he had met the CEO of the Russian Direct Investment Fund, Kirill A. Dmitriev. The Russia Direct Investment Fund is a Russian sovereign wealth fund that has an interesting link to Alfa Group. The First Deputy CEO of RDIF, Tagir Sitdekov, was a former Managing Director in Afla Group's private equity arm.

George Nader, an advisor to the United Arab Emirates that was present at the Seychelles meeting, is cooperating with Special Counsel Mueller's investigation.^[10] He has already testified in front of a grand jury. George Nader is another instance of an unscrupoulous individual being allowed to work with the Trump campaign, he has previously been convicted on child pornography charges.<sup>[11]</sup>

Manafort and Rick Gates are central figures to this investigation, allow me to expand below. A Russian Oligarch, Oleg Deripaska, worked with them for years. Oleg Deripaska was recently in the news, he was the oligarch that was recorded by an escort. The recording shows him meeting a Russian Deputy Prime Minister a month after Manafort had established email correspondence with Deripaska. They were likely exchanging intelligence. We also know that Rick Gates was in communication with GRU Officer Kilimnik weeks before the election. Kilimnik was a liaison between Manafort and Deripaska in Kiev for years. Alex van der Zwaan lied about these communications and has been sentenced to 30 days in prison.

Rick Gates has been Manafort's right hand man for years and was very involved in the Trump campaign even after Manafort stepped down as Campaign Manager. Rick Gates is reportedly pleading guilty to charges laid out by Special Counsel Mueller's indictment, a clear indication that he is ready to cooperate with investigators. [1]

Email correspondence between Russian Oligarch Oleg Deripaska and former Trump Campaign Manager Paul Manafort will be important in understanding why Manafort is a key figure to this investigation. According to videos recorded by an escort that were discovered by Russian opposition activist, Alexei Navalny, show Deripaska meeting a Russian Deputy Prime Minister on a yacht 1 month after the email correspondence between Manafort/Deripaska took place. Russia has threatened to block access to social media sites, such as YouTube and Instagram, if they do not remove the videos of Deripaska and Russian Deputy Prime Minister Prikhodko meeting on the yacht.

Paul Manafort was brought into the Trump campaign as Chairman to corral delegates at the convention, it was at this time where the Trump campaign pressured the GOP to make a specific change to the platform. An amendment proposed that the GOP commit to sending lethal weapons to Ukraine to fight Russian aggression was softened considerably at the request of the campaign. [4] Paul Manafort has since been indicted by Special Counsel Mueller. [5]

We know Paul Manafort offered to give a Russian billionaire private briefings on the campaign trail, the oligarch was Oleg Deripaska. [6] Paul Manafort used a campaign account for the aforementioned email correspondence. [7]

Gates and Manafort's ties to Deripaska are deep and date back at least a decade. They partnered over a massive real-estate deal in 2008. [8]

Back in 2006 Paul Manafort offered a deal to Russian oligarch Deripaska where he indicated he would offer a great service in pushing Putin's policies abroad. He was paid very handsomely by Deripaska. [9]

"We are now of the belief that this model can greatly benefit the Putin Government if employed at the correct levels with the appropriate commitment to success," Manafort wrote in the 2005 memo to

Deripaska. The effort, Manafort wrote, "will be offering a great service that can re-focus, both internally and externally, the policies of the Putin government."

In 2014 Deripaska sued Manafort for a cool \$19 million claiming that Manafort and Gates had stolen funds intended for an investment. The Associated Press were the first ones to discover their business dealings and Deripaska attempted and failed at suing the AP for libel.

Furthermore, Paul Manafort worked as Trump's campaign chairman for free. [12] In 2006 Manafort bought a condo in Trump Tower. [13]

When Paul Manafort had resigned as campaign manager on the Trump campaign his protege and longtime partner Rick Gates continued to work with the Trump campaign and was in contact with a former Russian intelligence officer weeks before the election. The former GRU officer also happened to be a long time liaison between Manafort and Deripaska. [1] Alex van der Zwaan lied to Special Counsel Mueller about the contacts he had with Rick Gates and Person A who is alleged to be a former GRU Officer. Van der Zwaan recorded these communications, has plead guilty to lying to investigators and has been sentenced to 30 days in prison.

The documents reveal Gates was in contact with a former officer in Russian military intelligence in the months leading up to Trump's win.

Gates was "directly communicating in September and October 2016" with an unidentified person who "has ties to a Russian intelligence service and had such ties in 2016," the filing says.

Alex van der Zwaan, the son-in-law of a Russian Oligarch who owns Alfa Bank, has plead guilty to lying to investigators. He lied about his contact with Gates and Person A. The Washtingon Post has stated that Person A is former GRU officer Konstantin Kilimnik, a Ukraine-based aide to Paul Manafort. [2]

Fourth, the lies and withholding of documents were material to the Special Counsel's Office's investigation. That Gates and Person A were directly communicating in September and October 2016 was pertinent to the investigation. Federal Bureau of Investigation Special Agents assisting the Special Counsel's Office assess that Person A has ties to Russian intelligence service and had such ties in 2016. During his first interview with the Special Counsel's Office, van der Zwaan admitted that he knew of that connection, stating that Gates told him Person A was a former Russian Intelligence Officer with GRU.

Kilimnik served as a liaison between Manafort and Oleg Deripaska. Manafort has previously denied communicating with Russian intelligence, Special Counsel Mueller seems to be alleging something entirely different.

The FBI has found that a business associate of former Trump campaign chairman Paul Manafort had ongoing ties to Russian intelligence, including during the 2016 campaign when Manafort and his deputy, Rick Gates, were in touch with the associate, according to new court filings.

The documents, filed late Tuesday by prosecutors for special counsel Robert S. Mueller III, also allege that Gates had said he knew the associate was a former officer with the Russian military intelligence service.

Van der Zwaan recorded some of his conversations he had with Rick Gates and Person A, who is alleged to be Kilimnik. [4]

After years of working with Gates on a report meant to aid a political group in Ukraine, Gates contacted him in 2016 about a foreign criminal case they feared could be filed against van der Zwaan's law firm. Afraid of the situation, the young attorney recorded a phone call with Gates and the unnamed Eastern European associate, and a call with his firm.

Later, when Mueller's office asked about his interactions with Gates and the other person, he lied because he feared his firm might fire him for recording the call, according to the memo.

The timeline is beginning to come together. Michael Cohen, the President's personal attorney, told Congressional investigators that he had stopped working on the Trump Moscow Tower project in January of 2016. But a new report surfaced yesterday indicating that Mr. Cohen had continued to work on the Trump Moscow Tower project up until at least May, when then candidate Trump was close to securing the GOP presidential nomination. [5] Candidate Trump promoted Paul Manafort to the role of Campaign Chairman around this time to corral delegates at the GOP convention, furthermore it was at this stage of the campaign where Trump began to publicly change his policy towards Ukraine and Russia. [6]

"Our president is not strong and he is not doing what he should be doing for the Ukraine," Trump told he group of pro-Western businessmen, diplomats and politicians. "I don't think you're getting the support you need."

That view was in line with other statements Trump has made calling for a firmer Western response to Russian President Vladimir Putin's March 2014 annexation of Crimea and support for a pro-Russian separatist movement in the country's east, according to a review of Trump's public comments about Ukraine since 2014.

In recent days, however, Trump has struck a far milder tone. He now says he might recognize Crimea as Russian territory and lift punitive U.S. sanctions against Russia. The alternative, he warned on Monday, could be World War III.

[16] The discovery was made because the Russian officer forgot to use a VPN while logging into Twitter and Wordpress. Last month investigative journalists discovered direct contact made between Roger Stone and Wikileaks. [17] We also know that Special Counsel Mueller has been asking questions about whether or not President Trump knew of the hacked DNC emails before they were released. They've asked about the relationship between GOP operative Roger Stone and WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange, and why Trump took policy positions favorable to Russia. [18] WikiLeaks can be considered an extension of Russia's 2016 disinformation campaign, [19] we knew that WikiLeaks shared material hacked by the GRU before The Daily Beast report was released.

Erik Prince, an advisor to Trump and the brother of Education Secretary Betsy DeVos, held a secret meeting with the RDIF CEO in Seychelles to establish a Trump-Putin back channel. Prince told congressional house members that he had met the CEO of the Russian Direct Investment Fund, Kirill A. Dmitriev. The wife of Dmitriev is close friends with Putin's younger daughter.

Kirill Dmitriev, CEO of the Russian Direct Investment Fund, is known to have met with Prince shortly before President Trump's inauguration, and Prince admitted to the meeting while testifying before the House Intelligence Committee late last year.

Six sources cited by the Financial Times say Dmitriev's wife, Natalia Popova, is close friends with Putin's younger daughter, Yekaterina Tikhonova, and also serves as the deputy director of her Innopraktika foundation.

George Nader, an advisor to the United Arab Emirates that was present at the Seychelles meeting, is cooperating with Special Counsel Mueller's investigation. He has already testified in front of a grand jury. Erik Prince had told Congressional investigators and journalists that his meeting with the CEO of the RDIF, Dimitriev, was unplanned and that he just happened to run into him. George Nader contests that testimony, Nader says that Prince planned the meeting well in advance.

Moreover, a member of President Trump's cabinet has business ties to Putin's family. Long time Trump friend and Commerce Secretary Wilbur Ross was the vice-chair of Bank of Cyprus. The paradise paper leaks confirm that Secretary Ross has personal business ties to Putin's son-in-law. [6]

Donald Trump's commerce secretary, Wilbur Ross, is doing business with Vladimir Putin's son-in-law through a shipping venture in Russia.

Leaked documents and public filings show Ross holds a stake in a shipping company, Navigator, through a chain of offshore investments. Navigator operates a lucrative partnership with Sibur, a Russian gas company part-owned by Kirill Shamalov, the husband of Putin's daughter Katerina Tikhonova.

Ross, a billionaire and close friend of Trump, retained holdings in Navigator after taking office this year. The relationship means he stands to benefit from the operations of a Russian company run by Putin's family and close allies, some of whom are under US sanctions.

Although Wilbur Ross has claimed that he has divested himself from the Bank of Cyprus, the Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington (CREW) had found that he had not yet done so. Another interesting link is Paul Manafort. Paul Manafort has been accused of innumerable financial crimes by Special Counsel Mueller. FBI investigators have found a number of bank accounts in Cyprus belonging to Manafort, the majority at Cyprus Popular Bank. In 2013 most assets held by Cyprus Popular Bank were taken over by the Bank of Cyprus. They have tried to distance themselves from Paul Manafort, Cypriot authorities are cooperating with investigators and have handed over Manafort's banking records.

It also contains indicators of compromise (IOCs) and technical details on the tactics, techniques, and procedures (TTPs) used by Russian government cyber actors on compromised victim networks. DHS and FBI produced this alert to educate network defenders to enhance their ability to identify and reduce exposure to malicious activity.

Now here's another avenue of possible collusion, Roger Stone. [15] According to the Daily Beast report, US investigators have found out that Guccifer 2.0 is a Russia Intelligence Officer that worked for the GRU. [16] The discovery was made because the Russian officer forgot to use a VPN while logging into Twitter and Wordpress. Last month investigative journalists discovered direct contact made between Roger Stone and Wikileaks. I mean today we learned that after President Trump was inaugurated Elliott Broidy, a former deputy treasury chair of the RNC and Trump associate, offered his services to get sanctions lifted from a Russian gas company for \$26 million; [1]

Email correspondence between Russian Oligarch Oleg Deripaska and former Trump Campaign Manager Paul Manafort will be important in understanding why Manafort is a key figure to this investigation. According to videos recorded by an escort that were discovered by Russian opposition activist, Alexei Navalny, show Deripaska meeting a Russian Deputy Prime Minister on a yacht 1 month after the email correspondence between Manafort/Deripaska took place. Russia has threatened to block access to social media sites, such as YouTube and Instagram, if they do not remove the videos of Deripaska and Russian Deputy Prime Minister Prikhodko meeting on the yacht.

Paul Manafort was brought into the Trump campaign as Chairman to corral delegates at the convention, it was at this time where the Trump campaign pressured the GOP to make a specific change to the platform. An amendment proposed that the GOP commit to sending lethal weapons to Ukraine to fight Russian aggression was softened considerably at the request of the campaign. [4] Paul Manafort has since been indicted by Special Counsel Mueller. [5]

We know Paul Manafort offered to give a Russian billionaire private briefings on the campaign trail, the oligarch was Oleg Deripaska. [6] Paul Manafort used a campaign account for the aforementioned email correspondence. [7]

Gates and Manafort's ties to Deripaska are deep and date back at least a decade. They partnered over a massive real-estate deal in 2008. [8]

Back in 2006 Paul Manafort offered a deal to Russian oligarch Deripaska where he indicated he would offer a great service in pushing Putin's policies abroad. He was paid very handsomely by Deripaska. [9]

"We are now of the belief that this model can greatly benefit the Putin Government if employed at the correct levels with the appropriate commitment to success," Manafort wrote in the 2005 memo to Deripaska. The effort, Manafort wrote, "will be offering a great service that can re-focus, both internally and externally, the policies of the Putin government."

When Paul Manafort had resigned as campaign manager on the Trump campaign his protege and longtime partner Rick Gates continued to work with the Trump campaign and was in contact with a former Russian intelligence officer weeks before the election. The former GRU officer also happened to be a long time liaison between Manafort and Deripaska.^[1] Alex van der Zwaan lied to Special Counsel Mueller about the contacts he had with Rick Gates and Person A who is alleged to be a former GRU Officer. Van der Zwaan recorded these communications, has plead guilty to lying to investigators and has been sentenced to 30 days in prison.

The documents reveal Gates was in contact with a former officer in Russian military intelligence in the months leading up to Trump's win.

Gates was "directly communicating in September and October 2016" with an unidentified person who "has ties to a Russian intelligence service and had such ties in 2016," the filing says.

Alex van der Zwaan, the son-in-law of a Russian Oligarch who owns Alfa Bank, has plead guilty to lying to investigators. He lied about his contact with Gates and Person A. The Washtingon Post has stated that Person A is former GRU officer Konstantin Kilimnik, a Ukraine-based aide to Paul Manafort. [2]

Fourth, the lies and withholding of documents were material to the Special Counsel's Office's investigation. That Gates and Person A were directly communicating in September and October 2016 was pertinent to the investigation. Federal Bureau of Investigation Special Agents assisting the Special Counsel's Office assess that Person A has ties to Russian intelligence service and had such ties in 2016. During his first interview with the Special Counsel's Office, van der Zwaan admitted that he knew of that connection, stating that Gates told him Person A was a former Russian Intelligence Officer with GRU.

Kilimnik served as a liaison between Manafort and Oleg Deripaska. Manafort has previously denied communicating with Russian intelligence, Special Counsel Mueller seems to be alleging something entirely different.

The FBI has found that a business associate of former Trump campaign chairman Paul Manafort had ongoing ties to Russian intelligence, including during the 2016 campaign when Manafort and his deputy, Rick Gates, were in touch with the associate, according to new court filings.

The documents, filed late Tuesday by prosecutors for special counsel Robert S. Mueller III, also allege that Gates had said he knew the associate was a former officer with the Russian military intelligence service.

Van der Zwaan recorded some of his conversations he had with Rick Gates and Person A, who is alleged to be Kilimnik. [4]

After years of working with Gates on a report meant to aid a political group in Ukraine, Gates contacted him in 2016 about a foreign criminal case they feared could be filed against van der Zwaan's law firm. Afraid of the situation, the young attorney recorded a phone call with Gates and the unnamed Eastern European associate, and a call with his firm.

Later, when Mueller's office asked about his interactions with Gates and the other person, he lied because he feared his firm might fire him for recording the call, according to the memo.

Let's take a closer look at a few other people President Trump's inner circle and their business ties to Putin's family;

Erik Prince, an advisor to Trump and the brother of Education Secretary Betsy DeVos, held a secret meeting with the RDIF CEO in Seychelles to establish a Trump-Putin back channel. Prince told congressional house members that he had met the CEO of the Russian Direct Investment Fund, Kirill A. Dmitriev. The wife of Dmitriev is close friends with Putin's younger daughter. [3]

Kirill Dmitriev, CEO of the Russian Direct Investment Fund, is known to have met with Prince shortly before President Trump's inauguration, and Prince admitted to the meeting while testifying before the House Intelligence Committee late last year.

Six sources cited by the Financial Times say Dmitriev's wife, Natalia Popova, is close friends with Putin's younger daughter, Yekaterina Tikhonova, and also serves as the deputy director of her Innopraktika foundation.

George Nader, an advisor to the United Arab Emirates that was present at the Seychelles meeting, is cooperating with Special Counsel Mueller's investigation. [4] He has already testified in front of a grand jury. Erik Prince had told Congressional investigators and journalists that his meeting with the CEO of the RDIF, Dimitriev, was unplanned and that he just happened to run into him. George Nader contests that testimony, Nader says that Prince planned the meeting well in advance. [5]

Moreover, a member of President Trump's cabinet has business ties to Putin's family. Long time Trump friend and Commerce Secretary Wilbur Ross was the vice-chair of Bank of Cyprus. The paradise paper leaks confirm that Secretary Ross has personal business ties to Putin's son-in-law. [6]

# Donald Trump's commerce secretary, Wilbur Ross, is doing business with Vladimir Putin's son-in-law through a shipping venture in Russia.

Leaked documents and public filings show Ross holds a stake in a shipping company, Navigator, through a chain of offshore investments. Navigator operates a lucrative partnership with Sibur, a Russian gas company part-owned by Kirill Shamalov, the husband of Putin's daughter Katerina Tikhonova.

Ross, a billionaire and close friend of Trump, retained holdings in Navigator after taking office this year. The relationship means he stands to benefit from the operations of a Russian company run by Putin's family and close allies, some of whom are under US sanctions.

Although Wilbur Ross has claimed that he has divested himself from the Bank of Cyprus, the Citizens for Responsibility and Ethics in Washington (CREW) had found that he had not yet done so. Another interesting link is Paul Manafort. Paul Manafort has been accused of innumerable financial crimes by Special Counsel Mueller. FBI investigators have found a number of bank accounts in Cyprus belonging to Manafort, the majority at Cyprus Popular Bank. In 2013 most assets held by Cyprus Popular Bank were taken over by the Bank of Cyprus. They have tried to distance themselves from Paul Manafort, Cypriot authorities are cooperating with investigators and have handed over Manafort's banking records.

Actually it's a bit more complicated than that. Allow me to explain some of the events leading up to Flynn flipping;

This piece includes a former CIA Director, former National Security Adviser Michael Flynn, a plan to kidnap a Turkish cleric hiding in the United States, and a Turkish-Iranian national who is standing trail for circumventing sanctions that President Erdogan desperately wants released from US custody. Rudy Guiliani and Michael Mukasey represent the Turkish-Iranian national who is being prosecuted by the Justice Department.

Several months ago a key witness to the Russia investigation popped up at Mar-A-Lago. [1] James Woolsey is a former CIA Director that served under 4 administrations and was on Trump's transition team. He later resigned from his position as a senior adviser due to Trump's undermining comments about the intelligence community. [2]

We know that Woolsey pitched a \$10 million contract to Turkish businessmen to discredit a controversial U.S. based Turkish cleric while he was an adviser during Trump's campaign. [3] James Woolsey has been interviewed by Special Counsel Mueller, they discussed Flynn's alleged Turkish scheme. [4]

Now how was Woolsey roped into Trump's campaign? Well he has ties to a Trump protege, Mark Brown, who ran Trump's Atlantic City casino empire. A casino in Saipan was visited by the FBI back in March of 2017 and is an alleged conduit for laundering money, both Woolsey and Brown are 2 board members.

Reza Zarrab, the aforementioned Turkish-Iranian national, recently plead guilty to charges of conspiring to avoid US sanctions. Turkish President Erdogan wants Reza Zarrab released as he know Erdogan's financial secrets. The second Turkish individual Erdogan wanted was Fethullah Gulen - he is the Turkish cleric hiding in the United States, the same cleric that the Trump campaign tried to discredit and the same cleric that Erdogan and the Turkish government are after for drummed up charges. Erdogan's allies allegedly offered Flynn a \$15 million deal to kidnap Gulen. While the kidnapping plan made headlines all over the media it was only 1 of 2 topics Flynn discussed with his Turkish counterparts during their meeting. The second topic was, allegedly, discussing the release of Reza Zarrab who is being tried by the United States government for conspiring to violate sanctions. [8]

We know that Zarrab plead guilty to the charges he faced and is now cooperating with American authorities. [9] Around this time Flynn's lawyer broke communication from Trump's legal team, indicating

that Flynn was ready to cooperate with Special Counsel Mueller. [10] We know that Flynn's lawyer had met on a Monday morning with members of Special Counsel Mueller's team, another indication that he was ready to cooperate. [11] And then he pleaded guilty to lesser charges, a significant development as it indicates that he is fully cooperating with the investigation. [12]

I recommend reading the Lawfare post, it does an excellent job in summarizing who Zarrab is and why he is so important to this investigation. Below I have included some interesting tidbits from the article with many familiar names.

In recent weeks, there has been increasing American interest in a previously little-watched judicial saga unfolding in New York district court. Like a Turkish soap opera, it involves a dashing businessman with a pop-star wife, corruption allegations, leaked tapes of private conversations and intrigue at the highest levels of government. The trial of Reza Zarrab on charges of evading Iran sanctions, including any revelations he makes about corruption in the Turkish government, could have significant political and economic implications for Turkey. It could also damage already fraught relations between Turkey and the United States.

In events surrounding Zarrab's trial, interactions between the U.S. government and Turkish officials raise rule of law questions for the United States. Erdogan has taken a strong personal interest in Zarrab, discussing him on multiple occasions with the Obama and Trump administrations. He demanded Zarrab's release and Bharara's firing in a meeting with then-Vice President Biden in 2016, while his wife pleaded the case to Biden's wife. Erdogan raised Zarrab in his final phone calls with Obama in Dec. 2016 and Jan. 2017. It was a topic of discussion between Erdogan and Trump as well. Following a September phone call, Erdogan said Trump told him the case in New York was not under his jurisdiction.

Eyebrows have been raised over connections between the Zarrab case and the Trump administration. In March, Trump fired Preet Bharara, the U.S. District Attorney who brought the indictment against Zarrab. (Attorney General Jeff Sessions asked 46 U.S. attorneys to resign. Bharara refused, noting Trump had asked him after the election to remain. Trump called Bharara; he declined to answer, citing rules against sitting attorneys talking to the President. Trump then fired him.) The case has continued under Bharara's former deputy and current Acting District Attorney, Joon Kim.

Also in March, Zarrab made changes to his legal team. He hired Rudy Guiliani, an informal Trump advisor, and Michael Mukasey, a former Attorney General. These lawyers met with Erdogan and senior Trump administration officials in search of a "diplomatic solution." Guiliani described his role in a deposition as determining "whether this case can be resolved as part of some agreement between the United States and Turkey that will promote the national-security interests of the United States and redound to the benefit of Mr. Zarrab."

In addition, there are questions about Michael Flynn's possible involvement. Special Counsel Robert Mueller, who is investigating Russian interference in the U.S. presidential election, is exploring Flynn's Turkish activities. Flynn, a Trump campaign advisor and briefly U.S. National Security Advisor, was allegedly offered \$15 million to return Gulen to Turkey. Mueller is reportedly examining whether Flynn also discussed ways of freeing Zarrab from court charges.

Taken together, The Times's findings and Mr. Avenatti's report offer the most detailed picture yet on Mr. Cohen's business dealings and financial entanglements in the run-up to the election and its aftermath. Federal prosecutors in Manhattan are investigating Mr. Cohen for possible bank fraud and election-law violations, among other matters, according to people briefed on the investigation. There's no evidence any material ever existed on the sites, and all of them return an error message.

DHS and FBI characterize this activity as a multi-stage intrusion campaign by Russian government cyber actors who targeted small commercial facilities' networks where they staged malware, conducted spear phishing, and gained remote access into energy sector networks. After obtaining access, the Russian government cyber actors conducted network reconnaissance, moved laterally, and collected information pertaining to Industrial Control Systems (ICS).

Yup, here's a little more detail on the Steele Dossier and Michael Cohen. [1]

The Steele Dossier contains four reports alleging that Cohen played a role in covering up collusion with Russia during the 2016 election.

It makes repeated, detailed allegations that Cohen traveled to Europe to meet with Kremlin officials as part of a coordinated effort between the Trump campaign and the Russian government, specifically going to Prague in August/September 2016. Nearly a quarter of Steele's entire public catalog deals with Cohen allegations and were written frequently in the final days of the campaign. One report is written after the election, on December 13th.

Because Steele only allowed 17 of 166 reports to become public, we can infer that he's pretty confident about the Cohen allegations. They get more detailed and more concrete as time went on.

**Allegation:** Cohen had a covert relationship with Russia, October 18, 2016: "Kremlin insider [highlighted the] importance of TRUMP's lawyer, Michael COHEN in covert relationship with Russia."

"A key role in the secret TRUMP campaign / Kremlin relationship was being played by the Republican candidates personal lawyer Michael COHEN."

**Allegation:** Cohen met secretly with Russians in an EU country, October 19, 2016: "[Cohen] engaged with Russians in trying to cover up scandal of MANAFORT and exposure of PAGE and meets Kremlin officials secretly in the EU in August in pursuit of this goal."

Cohen was important "in the ongoing secret liaison relationship between the New York tycoon's campaign and the Russian leadership".

"According to the Kremlin insider, COHEN now was heavily engaged in a cover up and damage limitation operation in the attempt to prevent the full details of TRUMP's relationship with Russia being exposed."

**Allegation:** The meeting was in Prague, October 20, 2016 (a day later): "Kremlin insider reports TRUMP lawyer COHEN's secret meeting/s with Kremlin officials in August 2016 was/were held in Prague [...] Pro-Putin leading Duma figure, KOSACHEV, reportedly involved as 'plausibly deniable' facilitator and may have participated in the August meeting/s with COHEN."

"According to the Kremlin advisor, these meeting/s were originally scheduled for COHEN in Moscow but shifted to what was considered an operationally 'soft' EU country when it was judged too compromising for him to travel to the Russian capital."

**Allegation:** Names meeting participants and "deniable cash payments to Romanian hackers," December 13, 2016: "We reported previously (2016/135 and /136) on secret meeting/s held in Prague, Czech Republic in August 2016 between then Republican presidential candidate Donald TRUMP's representative, Michael COHEN and his interlocutors from the Kremlin working under cover of Russian NGO Rossotrudnichestvo."

"COHEN had been accompanied to Prague by 3 colleagues and the timing of the visit was either in the last week of August or the first week of September."

According to [REDACTED] the agenda comprised questions on how deniable cash payments were to be made to hackers who had worked in Europe under Kremlin direction against the CLINTON campaign and various contingencies for covering up these operations and Moscow's secret liaison with the TRUMP team more generally."

"In terms of practical measures to be taken, it was agreed by the two sides in Prague to stand down various 'Romanian hackers' (presumably based in their homeland or neighbouring eastern Europe) and that other operatives should head for a bolt-hole in Plovdiv, Bulgaria where they should 'lay low.'"

## 1. The Moscow Project - MICHAEL COHEN, BAG MAN

Russia stands to benefit economically as a result of the United States withdrawing from the Iran nuclear deal.

President Trump is reneging on a multi-lateral nuclear peace agreement that was agreed upon by the P5 members, Iran, and the European Union<sup>[1]</sup> - it was a long and arduous process. We know Iran is abiding<sup>[2]</sup> by<sup>[3]</sup> the agreement,<sup>[4]</sup> but President Trump has decided to withdraw from the agreement which will in turn lead to higher oil prices.<sup>[5]</sup> Moreover, the foremost argument in favour of reneging on the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action is predicated upon Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's speech about Iran covertly continuing their nuclear program. His argmuent was debunked by the world's nuclear watchdog, the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) rejected the Israeli Prime Minister's claims.<sup>[6]</sup>

The world's nuclear watchdog has effectively rejected Israel's claims Iran lied about its nuclear activities, by referencing a report showing there were, "no credible indications of activities in Iran relevant to the development of a nuclear explosive device after 2009".

The International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) said documents released by Israel about Tehran's nuclear weapons program do not reveal anything new.

It cited one of its own reports, from 2015, that identified some Iranian activities in 2003, "relevant to the development of a nuclear explosive device".

"These activities did not advance beyond feasibility and scientific studies, and the acquisition of certain relevant technical competences and capabilities," the IAEA said in a statement.

"Based on the director-general's report, the board of governors declared that its consideration of this issue was closed."

Oil prices were at their highest point since 2014 due to Trump's rhetoric, [7] fear grew of the United States leaving the deal. The price of oil will continue to go up with this withdrawal. Higher oil prices are great for the Russian economy while lower oil prices are terrible for the Russian economy. [8] Current rising oil prices have been great for the Russian economy while they face sanctions. [9]

The consequences of pulling out of the Iran deal will be severe. A top State Department official and expert on nuclear proliferation has resigned, furthering weakening an already ailing State Department - American soft power diplomacy is in rapid decline as is their decline in stature as a global leader. Trump's administration has threatened European companies with sanctions if they do business with Iran. The European Union is deciding on whether they will block the U.S. sanctions as they worry

about how they can sustain an incentive for Iran to continue to comply with the Iran nuclear deal. While President Trump supporters claim that they can cripple the Iranian economy through harsh sanctions, it is incredibly unlikely as the sanctions regime will be weakened and fractured if opposed by the International Community. The weakened sanction regime may push Iran out of the nuclear agreement as hardliners in Iran will push for a reopening of their nuclear program. This will cause further instability in the Middle East. Moreover, Russia once again stands to benefit as the Trans-Atlantic Alliance is under assault from the Trump administration, he continues to alienate long standing allies and divides the West.

The Atlantic alliance, built to contain the Soviet Union in the aftermath of World War II, began to die when the Cold War ended. What kept it alive over the last three decades has been less strategic necessity than a convergence of values — the values of the liberal postwar order. Now, the senior partner of the alliance, the United States, has lost interest in those values. The alliance was already a corpse, but Donald Trump drove the last nail into its coffin when he decided this week to withdraw from the nuclear deal with Iran.

...The American people, meanwhile, preferred to face home. They wanted a pivot to America, and they voted for the candidate who promised to deliver it. It has thus fallen to Trump to deliver the coup de grâce to the alliance that has defined the postwar world. The Iran decision followed his decision to impose tariffs on European aluminum and steel, which followed his decision to withdraw from the Paris climate accords. Trump is no more contemptuous toward European allies than Asian or Latin ones; the only opinion to which he defers is that of his base.

...As a simple matter of geographical proximity, Europe is threatened by conflict in the Middle East as the United States is not. The tidal wave of asylum-seekers from Syria in 2015 upended European politics and exposed a popular vein of xenophobia and illiberalism that has thrown a terrible scare into European elites. Europe simply cannot afford to follow the American lead if the United States is prepared to sow further chaos in the region.

Of course, Europe's old reputation for deference and submission to the United States was reinforced by the spectacle of French President Emmanuel Macron and German Chancellor Angela Merkel visiting the White House in the hope of propitiating the First Bully and then being dismissed with scarcely a "by your leave" — and oh, by the way, we're still coming after your steel industry. But perhaps Europe's leaders needed the shock. Hours after Trump's announcement, Macron, Merkel, and British Prime Minister Theresa May issued a joint statement reminding the world that the deal had been "unanimously endorsed by the U.N. Security Council" and thus remained "the binding international legal framework" on Iran's nuclear program. European Council President Donald Tusk announced that Trump's Iran and trade policies "will meet a united European approach."

### The NRA is compromised

A few weeks after President Trump launched his Presidential Campaign he was asked a question by a Russian activist on what he would do about Russian sanctions, Trump responded by suggesting that he would rescind the sanctions. <sup>[1]</sup> The Russian that posed the question was Maria Butina, a woman named in the Fusion GPS Congressional testimony. Maria Butina is a protege of reputed Russian mobster and Putin ally Alexander Torshin, below I will explain who Torshin is and his extensive ties to the NRA;

We know powerful Russians have close ties to the NRA and are being investigated for funneling millions into the organization. This influx of money from Russia is being investigated by FBI Counterintelligence as the NRA's campaign contributions during this Presidental election doubled previous campaigns. [2] It was at an NRA convention where it was planned that the Trump campaign meet with Alexander Torshin, an ally of Vladimir Putin, a reputed mobster and deputy governor of the Russian central bank. [3] Alexander Torshin is wanted in Spain in connection to a money laundering operation for a Russian crime syndicate. [4] Alexander Torshin reportedly told a Trump campaign adviser that he could arrange a back-channel meeting between President Trump and President Putin. [5] The House Intelligence Committee testimony of Fusion GPS CEO Glen Simpson was released, in it he testifies that Russia had infiltrated the NRA and other conservative groups in America. [6]

MS. SPEIER: Okay. What is the interest of Russia with the National Rifle Association?

But I would say broadly speaking, it appears that the Russian operation was designed to infiltrate conservative organizations. And they targeted various conservative organizations, religious and otherwise, and they seem to have made a very concerted effort to get in with the NRA. And so there is a Russian banker-slash-Duma member-slash-Mafia leader

named Alexander Torshin who is a life member of the NRA. And we spent a lot of time investigating Mr. Torshin. And he is well known to Spanish law enforcement for money laundering activity, and you have probably seen the press articles. And I think the Spanish files on him should be available to you. And he, as you know, was supposed to have a meeting with President Trump after the inauguration. And somebody noticed that there had been some stories about him that weren't pretty good. So he is one of the more important figures, but, you know, another woman with whom he was working, Maria Butina, also was a big Trump fan in Russia, and then suddenly showed up here and started hanging around the Trump transition after the election and rented an apartment and enrolled herself at AU, which I assume gets you a visa.

MS. SPEIER: You said there were other conservative groups. Are there other conservative groups in the United States that they have infiltrated to your knowledge?

MR. SIMPSON: I think there's been -we have done some research on some religious groups having relationships w ith the Russians, having, developing, and pursuing relationships with various religious groups. The names of them escape my mind. But there has been a lot of that. And then there has been the independence movements, California independence, Texas independence. You know, it's a big operation.

NPR did amazing piece uncovering the depth of Torshin's ties to the NRA. This piece of investigative work is a must read. The National Rifle Association is likely compromised, Torshin boasts of his incredibly close ties to NRA executives including being invited by NRA leadership to be an election observer in 2012. A reputed Russian mobster was invited by the NRA to observe the 2012 Federal Election, this is how close his ties to the NRA are. [7]

On his verified Twitter account, Torshin talked about how he knew Donald Trump through the NRA, citing a connection at the group's 2015 convention. Responding to a tweet about comedian Larry David accusing Trump of being a racist, Torshin said he knew the businessman through the NRA, and defended him.

"I saw him in Nashville" in April 2015, Torshin added later, the date and site of the NRA's 2015 convention. Trump gave a speech at that convention, the outlines of which would become familiar as his stump speech throughout the 2016 presidential campaign. The White House did not respond to repeated requests for comment by NPR, but denied Trump has ever met Torshin to Bloomberg News in 2017.

Torshin has used his repeated trips to NRA conventions to cultivate relationships with top NRA officials. And his Twitter account documents that he has personally met with every person who has been president of the NRA since 2012.

On Twitter, Torshin portrayed these meetings as more than merely casual encounters. In 2017, he tweeted that he was bringing a gift to then-NRA President Allan Cors, and suggested he was familiar with Cors' hobbies.

In a public DropBox album that Torshin linked to from his Twitter account, he's seen meeting with former NRA president Jim Porter, as well as former NRA president David Keene.

His tweets suggest a longtime relationship with Keene, who repeatedly appears in photos as Torshin documents his visits, suggesting that their meeting was not merely coincidental. Keene did not respond to a request for comment.

Torshin has also met the current president of the NRA, Pete Brownell. Brownell was part of an NRA delegation that visited Moscow in 2015.

These relationships that he cultivated appeared to open another door. Torshin came to the United States in 2012 as an international election observer, and watched as ballots were cast during the Obama-Romney presidential contest in Tennessee. This was possible, he wrote, due to his NRA links.

"Tennessee resident Kline Preston requested Mr. Torshin to be an international observer in November 2012," Adam Ghassemi, a spokesman for the Tennessee Secretary of State, told NPR. The Washington Post reported last year that Preston, a Tennessee lawyer, was the one who originally introduced Torshin to former NRA president David Keene back in 2011.

Trump administration officials are blocking an investigation into 21 state election systems that were attacked by Russia. [1] Moreover, Republicans in the House Intelligence Committee voted to shut down the Russia probe. [2] Republicans shut down the HIC investigation when we know of at least 70 contacts between the Trump team and Russia-linked operatives, the committee obtained either no or incomplete information about 81% of known contacts between Trump officials and Russians.^[3] Six Democrats who are Ranking Members of their committees have been forced to request documents related to the Russian attacks against 21 state election systems in 2016 from Speaker of the House Paul Ryan. [4] It is doubtful that Paul Ryan will assist, he sat by idly while Republican Congressman Nunes made a mockery of the Russia investigation in the House Intelligence Committee for over a year. [5]

While Republicans in the House have been unhelpful, their Senate counterparts have reacted differently. However the Senate leadership has been no better than the House Republicans. The Senate

Intelligence Committee, led by Republican Senator and Chairman Richard Burr and Ranking Member Democratic Senator Mark Warner, have said that the Russia investigation will not be ending any time soon. [6] Furthermore, a bipartisan bill has been drafted to protect Special Counsel Mueller from being fired, but there is significant push back from Republican leaders in the Senate. [7] A bipartisan bill to protect Mueller was voted on and approved by the Senate Judiciary Committee. Four GOP senators broke rank with the party, enough to approve the bill with Democrat support. [8] While the Senate Judiciary committee has approved the bill, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell has said that there has been no indication that Special Counsel Mueller will be fired so there is no need for legislation to protect the investigation. [9] Senate majority leader McConnell is refusing to allow a vote on the Senate floor for a bill to protect Special Counsel Mueller. [10] Senator McConnell's reasoning is absurd if we consider the fact that President Trump has attempted to fire Mueller twice. In June of 2017 President Trump attempted to fire Special Counsel Mueller, he was allegedly stopped by White House Counsel Don McGahn when he threatened to resign over the move. [11] In December President Trump wanted to fire Mueller and shut down the investigation again after investigators issued subpoenas for obtaining information about the President's business dealings with Deutsche Bank. [12]

Michael Cohen, President Trump's personal attorney and Republican National Committee Deputy Finance Chairman who is responsible for the bulk of the RNC fundraising efforts, appears to have been soliciting companies for millions of dollars with the promise of access to the President. Michael Avenatti has estimated a total of \$4.4 million in transactions occurred between companies and the President's personal attorney.

A pharmaceutical corporation, Novartis, paid Michael Cohen's shell company \$1.2 million. [4] These payments occured weeks before the new CEO of Novartis had dinner with President Trump during his visit to Davos. [5] AT&T gave him \$600,000. [6] A South Korean aerospace company gave him \$150,000, [7] they claim they used Cohen's services on accounting, but a closer look shows us something much more nefarious was probable;

The arrangement came as the company, backed by state-owned Export-Import Bank of Korea, competes to sell trainer jets to the U.S. Air Force in an auction that could be worth up to \$16 billion.

And a firm controlled by a Russian Oligarch<sup>[8]</sup> paid him half a million dollars.<sup>[9]</sup>

The Times's review of financial records confirmed much of what was in Mr. Avenatti's report. In addition, a review of documents and interviews shed additional light on Mr. Cohen's dealings with the company connected to Mr. Vekselberg, who was stopped and questioned at an airport earlier this year by investigators for Robert S. Mueller III, the special counsel examining Russian interference in the 2016 presidential election.

Taken together, The Times's findings and Mr. Avenatti's report offer the most detailed picture yet on Mr. Cohen's business dealings and financial entanglements in the run-up to the election and its aftermath. Federal prosecutors in Manhattan are investigating Mr. Cohen for possible bank fraud and election-law violations, among other matters, according to people briefed on the investigation. Stephen Ryan, a lawyer representing Mr. Cohen, declined to comment.

...The payments by Columbus Nova occurred between January and August of last year. Andrew Intrater, the company's American chief executive and Mr. Vekselberg's cousin, donated \$250,000 to Mr. Trump's inauguration, campaign finance records show. He and Mr. Vekselberg attended the event together and met with Mr. Cohen there, according to a person briefed on the matter. Columbus Nova retained him as a consultant soon afterward.

Columbus Nova, the company controlled by a Russian oligarch that paid Michael Cohen, registered a number of websites aimed at white nationalists and the alt-right. [10]

A company at the center of widening questions involving President Trump's personal lawyer Michael Cohen is listed as the organization behind a string of websites targeted toward white nationalists and other members of the alt-right.

Columbus Nova, a company whose U.S. chief executive, Andrew Intrater, and Russian investment partner Viktor Vekselberg have both reportedly been interviewed by special counsel Robert S. Mueller III's team, is listed as the registrant behind a handful of domains for websites named after the alt-right that were created during the 2016 election.

...These sites include Alt-right.co, Alternate-right.com, Alternate-rt.com, Alt-rite.com, and other similar combinations, which were all registered in the two days following a speech given by then candidate Hillary Clinton in August 2016 in which she excoriated the far-right movement known for its extremist, racist, anti-Semitic and sexist viewpoints. The sites are not currently operational.

Moreover, the Russian Oligarch that controlled the firm that gave Cohen half a million dollars was interviewed by the FBI. [11] It was initially reported that agents working with Special Counsel Mueller stopped Vekselberg at a New York airport and searched his electronic devices. [12] Another interesting thing of note is that Vekselberg attended a 2015 dinner in Moscow celebrating RT's 10th anniversary. [13] This gala is infamously known for the photograph of former National Security Advisor Michael Flynn sitting next to Vladimir Putin and his inner circle including high level government officials with incredibly close ties to Russian intelligence agencies. [14] Vekselberg was seated next to the Putin/Flynn table.

What I find fascinating is that Columbus Nova registered a number of websites aimed towards white nationalists, but nothing of note was ever posted on these sites to my knowledge. Why do I find it fascinating? Well we know Russia's disinformation campaign preyed upon racial divisions in America, further elaboration on the scale of this operation is outlined below.

Last week CA whistle-blower Christopher Wylie testified to Congressional investigators that the Facebook data Cambridge Analytica collected may have been compromised by Russia. <sup>[1]</sup> This is an important revelation as we can see both CA and Russia promoted divisive disinformation campaigns online;

Moreover, we know Rebekah Mercer, Steve Bannon, and Alexander Nix knowingly broke election laws in America. They were explicitly told not to use foreigners for significant campaign decisions, but they broke the law to do so anyway. [7]

Russia's geo-political aim is to weaken the West through destabilization by sowing division among the population. Russian operatives used social media to exploit racial and religious divisions during the 2016 election. Democrats in the House Intelligence Committee released 3500 facebook add that were created by the Internet Research Agency, Russia specifically targeted racial tensions in America.

- Of the roughly 3,500 ads published this week, more than half about 1,950 made express references to race. Those accounted for 25 million ad impressions a measure of how many times the spot was pulled from a server for transmission to a device.
- At least 25% of the ads centered on issues involving crime and policing, often with a racial connotation. Separate ads, launched simultaneously, would stoke suspicion about how police treat black people in one ad, while another encouraged support for pro-police groups.
- Divisive racial ad buys averaged about 44 per month from 2015 through the summer of 2016 before seeing a significant increase in the run-up to Election Day. Between September and November 2016, the number of race-related spots rose to 400. An additional 900 were posted after the November election through May 2017.
- Only about 100 of the ads overtly mentioned support for Donald Trump or opposition to Hillary Clinton. A few dozen referenced questions about the U.S. election process and voting integrity, while a handful mentioned other candidates like Bernie Sanders, Ted Cruz or Jeb Bush.

Russia is actively trying to divide the West and has been for quite some time, be aware that they use inflammatory language online and promote disinformation. [14] It can be frustrating when talking to those who share a different set of beliefs, but we should attempt to find common ground with those who believe in the pillars that make Western democracy so great - equity, representation, freedom, and justice. Yes there are institutional problems that need to be addressed and ultimately fixed and there

are different views on how we can come to a solution on these institutional problems. But as it stands right now Western democracy and society is under assault and we must work together by staying informed and exercising our constitutional duty by voting in elections in our respective countries.

The emails reviewed by the AP included work summaries and contracting documents and proposals.

This could be very illegal;

Neither Broidy nor Nader registered with the U.S. government under the Foreign Agents Registration Act, a law intended to make lobbyists working for foreign governments disclose their ties and certain political activities. The law requires people to register even if they are not paid but merely directed by foreign interests with political tasks in mind.

Violating the federal law carries a maximum \$10,000 fine or up to five years in prison.

You may remember Elliot Broidy from his \$1.6 million pay-off of a playboy model that was handled by the Presidents personal attorney Michael Cohen. Broidy ultimately resigned from his position as the Deputy Finance Chairman of the RNC. Earlier in the year the Republican National Committee Finance Chairman billionaire Steve Wynn resigned after sexual misconduct allegations.

Furthermore George Nader, the other individual selling access to the President, is a cooperating witness to Special Counsel Mueller's investigation and has already testified before a grand jury. Ander is well known as an advisor to the United Arab Emirates, but the New York Times has discovered that he has ties to Russia too. George Nader used his ties to the CEO of a Russian sovereign wealth fund to set up the Seychelles meeting between Trump advisor Erik Prince and Kirill A. Dmitriev to, allegedly, establish a Trump-Putin back channel. Prince had told Congressional investigators and journalists that his meeting with the CEO of the Russia Direct Investment Fund, Dimitriev, was unplanned and that he just happened to run into him. George Nader contests that testimony, Nader says that Prince planned the meeting well in advance.

# It should also be mentioned that the wife of Dmitriev is close friends with Putin's younger daughter. [10]

Kirill Dmitriev, CEO of the Russian Direct Investment Fund, is known to have met with Prince shortly before President Trump's inauguration, and Prince admitted to the meeting while testifying before the House Intelligence Committee late last year.

Six sources cited by the Financial Times say Dmitriev's wife, Natalia Popova, is close friends with Putin's younger daughter, Yekaterina Tikhonova, and also serves as the deputy director of her Innopraktika foundation.

The **Proud Boys** are an Alt-Right group founded by **Gavin McInnes**, formerly of *The Rebel Media* and cofounder of VICE, currently with CRTV along side **Mark Levin** and **Michelle Malkin** [2] [A]. **Roger Stone** can be seen <a href="here">here</a>[3] flashing a white power hand gesture with a group of Proud Boys at some bar. This same gesture has been shown multiple times at the White House by several people affiliated with the alt right. [4] These people range from interns to reporters such as **Mike Cernovich**, **Lucian Wintrich**, **Milo Yiannopoulos**, and **Cassandra Fairbanks**. [5].

I've detailed some of Milo in a previous post

**Lucian Wintrich** is the White House correspondent for *The Gateway Pundit*. They are responsible stories calling the Parkland Students "crisis actors". [6]. **Wintrich** was also arrested while speaking at UConn giving a speech entitled "It's OK to be white". [7]

Tucker Carlson did his own segment on the "It's OK to be white" campaign. [8]

**Cernovich** has also tweeted that "Date rape does not exist", but **Donald Trump Jr.** has still retweeted/endorsed him. [11]

**Chuck Johnson** who was also mentioned is a holocaust denier who went to the State of the Union by **Rep. Matt Gaetz**. [12]

Johnson also helped organize a meeting between Rep. Dana Rohrabacher and Julian Assange. [13]

Some have argued that the OK hand gesture isn't racist.

### It's all about context

Virtually any symbol can be coopted for hate *Here are a few video examples of the hand gesture being used*

**Posobiec** is a known figure from the Alt-Right that Donald Trump retweeted after the Unite the Right Rally. [15] **Posobiec**can be seen with <a href="here">here^[16]</a> with **Richard Spencer** who is a key figure in the movement.

• This is a different <u>video example ^[17]</u> from Knox News showing the Traditionalist Worker Party flashing the white power hand sign discretely. Focus on the guy with the white hat and a beard at (1:22). This was one the groups at the Unite the Right Rally in Charlottesville that resulted in the death of Heather Heyer.

The CEO of RDIF, a Russian sovereign wealth fund created by the Russian government that is designed to invest in the Russian economy, is not a prosecutor.

President Trump's foreign policy has been horrendous. His administration is exacerbating the decline of United State's influence abroad by destroying long standing relationships with its allies, the consequences of which could be severe. I will provide two examples below; the Trans-Pacific Partnership and the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action - colloquially known as the Iran Nuclear Deal.

First lets begin with America's decline in foreign diplomacy - Former Secretary of State Rex Tillerson completely gutted a formerly functioning State Department essentially crippling US influence abroad. [1] He systematically dismantled the State Department with major cuts to leadership roles, these are career diplomats who have served under different administrations and possess unparalleled experience. [2] I cannot stress enough how important soft power is in terms of maintaining a US sphere of influence. [3] He also shut down the State Department office that oversees sanction policies. [4]

Trump's administration has isolated, removed and failed to replace State Department leaders, as of right now there are 41 out of 188 ambassadors that remain vacant with no nominations. These vacancies include strategic countries such as Turkey, Egypt, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, and Jordan. Over the last few weeks we have seen the ambassadors to Mexico and Panama retire with no replacements in sight, there is no ambassador to South Korea and the special envoy to North Korea resigned. In comparison to Obama, Trump has double the vacancies at a whopping 22%. These aren't small time diplomats. The United States has no leadership on the world stage, their influence and power will decline considerably if this is not remedied soon.

Moreover, the administration has indicated they want back in to the Trans-Pacific Partnership for a couple of weeks, they now realize it would have been a great way to counter China's economic influence across the region.^[9] The President's comments still project the *America First* mantra, he still refers to TPP as horrible. [10]

Consider the sum of these comments, and Trump is merely suggesting that the United States would be open to participating in a TPP whose provisions furthered the realization of the America First policy. This is not a "return to the TPP" by any measure; they are remarks that seek to jump on the bandwagon of the TPP-11 agreement while effectively calling for a renegotiation of its terms. Having led the TPP-11 negotiations, Japan probably made the right call in coolly describing the prospect of renegotiation as "practically impossible."

TPP was created for the purpose of cementing America's regional influence, its the largest regional trade agreement and does not include China. It was unfortunate that some stipulations favoured American corporations, however when the United States backed off we were able to make the trade agreement much better. The new iteration of TPP, known as The Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP), suspends the intellectual property provisions and mandates all countries adhere to strict labour and environment standards. While the original TPP would have been the largest trade agreement in the world, the total combined gross domestic product of CPTPP would be \$13.5 trillion, that's 13% of the world's GDP.

Over the last few weeks Treasury Secretary Steve Mnuchin has been open to returning to CPTPP and President Trump's chief economic adviser Larry Kudlow has said that the United States could lead a "trade coalition of the willing" to counter China's influence, which is exactly what TPP was. Unfortunately for the United States, the 11 signatory nations are moving forward with the trade

agreement and there is almost no chance of them re-opening negotiations with President Trump to allow the US back into the deal. [14]

Let's take a closer look at the consequences of pulling out of the Iran deal as an example of the deterioration of United States diplomacy under this administration. A top State Department official and expert on nuclear proliferation has resigned, [15] furthering weakening an already ailing State Department - American soft power diplomacy is in rapid decline as is their decline in stature as a global leader. Trump's administration has threatened European companies with sanctions if they do business with Iran. [16] The European Union has decided to release a package of measures to counter the U.S. sanctions as the EU continues to sustain an incentive for Iran's compliance with the Iran nuclear deal. [17] While President Trump supporters claim that they can cripple the Iranian economy through harsh sanctions, it is incredibly unlikely as the sanctions regime will be weakened and fractured if opposed by the International Community. The weakened sanction regime may push Iran out of the nuclear agreement as hardliners in Iran will push for a reopening of their nuclear program. This will cause further instability in the Middle East. [18]

VPN Filter uses known vulnerabilities to infect home office routers made by Linksys, MikroTik, NETGEAR, and TP-Link. Once in place, the malware reports back to a command-and-control infrastructure that can install purpose-built plug-ins, according to the researchers. One plug-in lets the hackers eavesdrop on the victim's Internet traffic to steal website credentials; another targets a protocol used in industrial control networks, such as those in the electric grid. A third lets the attacker cripple any or all of the infected devices at will.

Reminder that the Department of Homeland Security and the FBI have accused the Russian government of a multi-stage intrusion campaign targeting the U.S. energy grid. These attacks included critical infrastructure in energy, nuclear, commercial facilities, water facilities, and aviation facilities. Here is the report by the United States Computer Emergency Readiness Team where analytic efforts undertaken by DHS and the FBI have found a multistage intrusion campaign perpetuated by the Russian state. This isn't fake news, the United States is under cyber attack from Russia.

This joint Technical Alert (TA) is the result of analytic efforts between the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). This alert provides information on Russian government actions targeting U.S. Government entities as well as organizations in the energy, nuclear, commercial facilities, water, aviation, and critical manufacturing sectors. It also contains indicators of compromise (IOCs) and technical details on the tactics, techniques, and procedures (TTPs) used by Russian government cyber actors on compromised victim networks. DHS and FBI produced this alert to educate network defenders to enhance their ability to identify and reduce exposure to malicious activity.

DHS and FBI characterize this activity as a multi-stage intrusion campaign by Russian government cyber actors who targeted small commercial facilities' networks where they staged malware, conducted spear phishing, and gained remote access into energy sector networks. After obtaining access, the Russian government cyber actors conducted network reconnaissance, moved laterally, and collected information pertaining to Industrial Control Systems (ICS).

Moreover, the United States Intelligence Agencies have confirmed that a foreign nation interfered with the 2016 American election process. We know two dozen state's election systems came under attack. The Intelligence Agencies heads unanimously agree that the Russians will attack the 2018 election. President Trump's administration has retaliated to these attacks on America's institutions and infrastructure by penalizing Russians, unfortunately President Trump did not mention the sanctions nor the election meddling during his statement on the nerve agent attack in Britain. President Trump has repeatedly called the Russian election interference a hoax.

What's not surprising is that President Trump's administration has done little to mitigate the threat of Russia attacking the 2018 midterm election. U.S. officials, including former National Security Adviser

General H.R. McMaster, have claimed that this administration has not done enough to dissuade Russian meddling. [8] Most recently President Trump put the brakes on new economic sanctions on Russia, a day after U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Nikki Haley laid out a preliminary plan to impose new sanctions. This decision by President Trump came after the Kremlin denounced the new sanctions plan as *international economic raiding*. [9] Furthermore, NSA Director Admiral Rodgers testified to Congress that Trump has given no order to counter Russian election meddling. [10] While former National Security Adviser General H.R. McMaster warned of Russian election meddling and publicly denounced their continued attacks, he was removed by President Trump and John Bolton took his place. John Bolton has a sordid history that I have previously analysed, [11] National Security Adviser Bolton has been pushing to eliminate a top Cyber-Security position in the White House as he attempts to reorganize the National Security Council. [12]

Cybersecurity experts and former National Security Council officials expressed alarm at the idea of eliminating the job, saying it would undo much of the progress the U.S. has made on cyber efforts and send the wrong message about U.S. priorities in the digital domain. The coordinator — a post created at the beginning of the Obama administration — leads a team of NSC staffers who manage federal cyber strategy on everything from election security to encryption policies to digital warfare.

In fact, says another Congressional aide, Bolton's staff worked actively with the Republican senators who opposed Kerry's efforts.

Bolton refused to speak to us on the subject.

# Roger Stone is in deep.

Two<sup>[1]</sup> Roger Stone aides were subpoenaed last week.<sup>[2]</sup> During the 2016 Presidential campaign Roger Stone<sup>[3]</sup> made constant braggadocios statements about his ties to Guccifer 2.0, the DNC hacker, and Wikileaks. While Roger Stone has attempted to downplay his communication with Guccifer 2.0, he has admitted to have been in contact with the DNC hacking suspect.<sup>[4]</sup> According to a Daily Beast report, US investigators have identified Guccifer 2.0 as a Russian Intelligence Officer that worked for the

GRU. [5] The discovery was made after a Russian intelligence officer forgot to use a VPN while logging into Twitter and Wordpress. Last month investigative journalists discovered direct contact made between Roger Stone and Wikileaks, although nothing of significance was discussed over their direct correspondence. [6]

We also know that Special Counsel Mueller has been asking questions about whether or not President Trump knew of the hacked DNC emails before they were released. They've asked about the relationship between GOP operative Roger Stone and WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange, and why Trump took policy positions favorable to Russia. WikiLeaks should be considered an extension of Russia's 2016 disinformation campaign, we knew that WikiLeaks shared material hacked by the GRU before The Daily Beast report was released.

Moreover, the leading counterargument against the reports of Guccifer 2.0 being a Russian intelligence officer is that they would be too intelligent to forget turning on their VPN. That line of reasoning is wrong. While the system the Russian hackers use is indeed genius, that doesn't mean it's impervious from human error. In fact here is a CSE report from 2011 that elaborates on that point. The CSE, Communications Securities Establishment, is Canada's national cryptologic agency that collects foreign signal intelligence in order to inform and alert the Government of Canada to the activities of foreign entities outside Canada.

But a 2011 presentation to the NSA and its foreign partners by Canada's signals intelligence agency, the Communications Security Establishment, undermines the notion of a foreign hacker so skilled that a victim would never know their identity. The document calls Russian hackers "morons" for routinely compromising the security of a "really well designed" system intended to cover their tracks; for example, the hackers logged into their personal social and email accounts through the same anonymizing system used to attack their targets, comparable to getting an anonymous burner phone for illicit use and then placing calls to your girlfriend, parents, and roommate.

Just a reminder that long time Roger Stone friend and former Trump campaign aide Sam Nunberg was having a melt down on multiple networks 2 months ago for being subpoenaed by Special Counsel Mueller. He wanted to refuse the court order so that he would not be forced to testify against Stone. He claimed that he didn't have the time to sort through his emails and go to the grand jury court order. [12]

The former Trump adviser made a succession of appearances on US news channels in which he – among many gaffes – called the president an 'idiot' and threatened to tear up a subpoena from Robert Mueller

He spent half a day on national television with the most ridiculous excuses, even going as far as to egg Mueller on to arrest him. He has since said he will cooperate. The subpoena of Sam Nunberg asks for all communications/correspondence with Carter Page, Corey Lewandowski, Donald J. Trump, Hope Hicks, Keith Schiller, Michael Cohen, Paul Manafort, Rick Gates, Roger Stone, and Steve Bannon dating back to 2015.

Roger Stone has been a target of this investigation for quite some time. This week Roger Stone attempted to get ahead of a potential indictment by claiming he is ready to be indicted and that the Russian collusion scandal is still a hoax. [15] This report by the Wall Street Journal confirms everyone's suspicions, that New York based radio host and comedian Credico was the liaison between Roger Stone and Wikileaks. Credico was subpeonaed by Special Counsel Mueller in Novermber of 2017.^[16]

I'm glad that Prime Minister Trudeau's government is standing up for Canada. Nonetheless a trade war will be terrible for consumers across the globe. <sup>[1]</sup> The United States is attempting to hold economies across the globe as hostages while President Trump's administration negotiates trade deals with allies. For example these indiscrimnate steel tariffs will cost the Canadian economy \$3.2 billion annually. <sup>[2]</sup> The world is not taking these policies lightly as U.S. allies have already retaliated with their own tariffs, Canada has released a plan targeting imports from America that would cost the U.S. \$12.9 billion dollars while the European Union has prepared levies on U.S. exports worth \$7.5 billion. <sup>[3]</sup> I completely agree with Prime Minister Trudeau's statement; <sup>[4]</sup>

"Let me be clear: These tariffs are totally unacceptable," Trudeau said. "Canadians have served alongside Americans in two world wars and in Korea. From the beaches of Normandy to the mountains of Afghanistan, we have fought and died together."

Noting that Canada purchases more U.S. steel than any other nation, Trudeau lambasted the Trump administration for initiating the tariffs under the guise of confronting a threat to national security. "Canada is a secure supplier of aluminum and steel to the U.S. defense industry, putting aluminum in American planes and steel in American tanks," Trudeau said. "That Canada could be considered a national security threat to the United States is inconceivable."

"These tariffs are an affront to the long-standing security partnership between Canada and the United States, and in particular, to the thousands of Canadians who have fought and died alongside American comrades-in-arms," he finished.

# Let's take a look at the last two attempts where the United States of America initiated tariffs, it didn't end well for them;

President Bush attempted a protectionist agenda under his administration, but within a year of imposing tariffs the retaliation from allies was so severe that he was forced to reverse his decision. President Obama attempted protectionist measures against China by imposing a tariff on tires, but it didn't end well for his administration as it did not boost U.S. employment and China's retaliation cost American chicken producers \$1 billion in sales. President Bush's trade war cost the United States 200,000 jobs and since then multiple studies have found that the cost of such protectionist measures outweigh any short-term benefit.

- 200,000 Americans lost their jobs to higher steel prices during 2002. These lost jobs represent approximately \$4 billion in lost wages from February to November 2002.3
- One out of four (50,000) of these job losses occurred in the metal manufacturing, machinery and equipment and transportation equipment and parts sectors.
- Job losses escalated steadily over 2002, peaking in November (at 202,000 jobs), and slightly declining to 197,000 jobs in December.4
- More American workers lost their jobs in 2002 to higher steel prices than the total number employed by the U.S. steel industry itself (187,500 Americans were employed by U.S. steel producers in December 2002).
- Every U.S. state experienced employment losses from higher steel costs, with the highest losses occurring in California (19,392 jobs lost), Texas (15,826 jobs lost), Ohio (10,553 jobs lost), Michigan (9,829 jobs lost), Illinois (9,621 jobs lost), Pennsylvania (8,400 jobs lost), New York (8,901 jobs lost) and Florida (8,370 jobs lost). Sixteen states lost at least 4,500 steel consuming jobs each over the course of 2002 from higher steel prices.
- While insufficient data exist at this time to measure the precise role steel tariffs played in
  causing such significant price increases, relative to the other factors, it is clear that the Section
  201 tariffs played a leading role pushing prices up. Steel tariffs caused shortages of imported
  product and put U.S. manufacturers of steel-containing products at a disadvantage relative to
  their foreign competitors. In the absence of the tariffs, the damage to steel consuming
  employment would have been significantly less than it was in 2002.
- The analysis shows that American steel consumers have borne heavy costs from higher steel prices caused by shortages, tariffs and trade remedy duties, among other factors. Some

customers of steel consumers have moved sourcing offshore as U.S. producers of steel-containing products became less reliable and more expensive. Other customers refused to accept higher prices from their suppliers and forced them to absorb the higher steel costs, which put many in a precarious (or worse) financial condition. The impact on steel-consuming industries has been significant.

The last two administrations have clearly demonstrated the negative impact from imposing tariffs on allies and foreign adversaries. Yet President Trump's new tariffs target U.S. allies more so than China. Canada, Mexico, and South Korea are America's leading steel import/export partners. President Trump has instituted these tariffs while there are ongoing trade talks between Western allies, these Western allies have vowed to retaliate. Even the National Review, a well known Conservative publication, has come out against these insane protectionist measures;

The economics here are pretty straightforward. Trump thinks steel is just one more example of the Chinese getting one over on Americans, but China is in fact a minor player in the U.S. steel-import business, being No. 11 among nations exporting steel to the United States. A quarter of our imported steel comes from our NAFTA partners, mostly from Canada, which provides 16 percent of U.S. steel imports. Among Asian steel exporters, South Korea is our largest trading partner, not China. Moody's projects that the country that will be most adversely affected by the tariffs is Canada, followed by Bahrain, a country that does not loom particularly large in our economic consciousness, having as it does an annual national economic output about one-fifth of the Ford Motor Company's. It is better to punish one's enemies than one's allies.

And it is no good at all to punish producers and consumers both, which is what tariffs do. Tariffs are a sales tax, in this case on a raw material that is used in everything from buildings to automobiles and industrial machinery — and the latter two are a big part of the U.S. export portfolio, something that ought to occur to a president who obsesses about the balance of trade. Steel is a necessary part of the machinery that produces the agricultural commodities, electronics, and industrial implements that are the heart of U.S. exports of goods. Advantaging a small number of politically connected firms at the expense of the broader manufacturing economy — which employs vastly more people and represents vastly more in the way of both economic production and exports — is damned foolish. As an economic matter, it is illiteracy in action. There's a reason Caterpillar shares sank after the tariff announcement, along with Boeing, United Technologies, General Motors, and others.

...The president is in error and, while he undoubtedly has the authority to impose these tariffs, doing so will put us in violation of both the letter and the spirit of our existing trade agreements. To what end? The policy will hurt more American businesses and American workers than it will help, and it will absolutely imperil export-dependent American industries from the farms to the factories. It's a bad idea, conceived and unveiled badly.

## What has Special Counsel Mueller's investigation uncovered so far?

Contrary to right-wing media outlets in America the investigations into the President's closest confidants is not a *nothing burger*. Former Campaign Chairman Manafort has been indicted, former National Security Advisor Michael Flynn has plead guilty and is cooperating with investigators, Rick Gates has plead guilty and is cooperating and several other campaign aides are cooperating with investigators. [1]

The searches open a new front for the Justice Department in its scrutiny of Mr. Trump and his associates: His longtime lawyer is being investigated in Manhattan; his son-in-law, Jared Kushner, is facing scrutiny by prosecutors in Brooklyn; his campaign chairman is under indictment; his former national security adviser has pleaded guilty to lying; and a pair of former campaign aides are cooperating with Mr. Mueller. Mr. Mueller, meanwhile, wants to interview Mr. Trump about possible obstruction of justice.

Last month the first person to be jailed in Special Counsel Mueller's investigation was sentenced 30 days for lying to investigators about his contact with Rick Gates and Person A, who has not yet been identified but is alleged to be a former member of the GRU. Contrary to President Trump and his allies this investigation is moving at an incredible pace compared to other similar investigations.

If you don't have time to read through each source Reuters has compiled a list of Trump aides and associates who are under investigation or have been indicted; [6]

**Michael Cohen,** Trump's longtime personal lawyer, is being investigated by federal prosecutors in Manhattan. Cohen's lawyer, Stephen M. Ryan, said that U.S. prosecutors conducted a search on April 9 that was partly a referral by Mueller's office. Federal prosecutors are investigating Cohen for possible bank and tax fraud, and for possible campaign law violation in connection with a payment to a porn actress and perhaps other matters having to do with foreign support to Trump's 2016 campaign, a source familiar with the investigation said.

**Michael Flynn,** a former national security adviser to Trump who was also a close campaign aide, pleaded guilty in December to lying to Federal Bureau of Investigation agents about his contacts with Russia and agreed to cooperate with Mueller's investigation.

**Paul Manafort,** a former Trump election campaign chairman, is facing two indictments in different federal courts brought by Mueller. Charges against him include conspiring to launder money, failing to register as a foreign agent in connection with his lobbying for the previously pro-Russia Ukrainian government, bank fraud and filing false tax returns. Manafort has pleaded not guilty to all charges and has argued that Mueller has overstepped his authority.

**Rick Gates,** a former deputy campaign chairman, pleaded guilty in February to conspiracy against the United States and lying to investigators, and agreed to cooperate with the Mueller probe.

**George Papadopoulos,** a former Trump campaign adviser, pleaded guilty last fall to lying to FBI agents about his contacts with Russia. According to documents released with his guilty plea, Papadopoulos offered to help set up a meeting with then-candidate Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin. He is now cooperating with Mueller.

**Alex Van der Zwaan,** a lawyer who once worked closely with Manafort and Gates, pleaded guilty in February to lying to Mueller's investigators about contacts with an official in the Trump election campaign. Van der Zwaan, the Dutch son-in-law of one of Russia's richest men, was sentenced on April 3 to 30 days in prison and fined \$20,000.

**Richard Pinedo**, who was not involved with the Trump campaign, pleaded guilty in a case related to the Mueller probe in February to aiding and abetting interstate and foreign identity fraud by creating, buying and stealing hundreds of bank account numbers that he sold to individuals to use with large digital payment companies. Pinedo "made a mistake" but "had absolutely no knowledge" about who was buying the information or their motivations, his lawyer said. Sources familiar with the indictment said Pinedo was named as helping Russian conspirators launder money as well as purchase Facebook ads and pay for rally supplies.

In November 2015, Ivanka Trump told Cohen to speak with Klokov, according to the four sources. Cohen had at least one phone conversation with the weightlifter, they said. It is not known what the men discussed over the phone, but they exchanged a string of emails that are now being examined by congressional investigators and federal agents probing Russia's election meddling.

In one of those emails, Klokov told Cohen that he could arrange a meeting between Donald Trump and Putin to help pave the way for the tower. Later, Cohen sent an email refusing that offer and saying that the Trump Organization already had an agreement in place. He said he was cutting off future communication with Klokov. Copying Ivanka Trump, the Russian responded in a final brusque message, in which he questioned Cohen's authority to make decisions for the Trump Organization. Frustrated by the exchange, Ivanka Trump questioned Cohen's refusal to continue communicating with Klokov, according to one of the sources.

### **Summary:**

Last month Buzzfeed released an in depth article about the Trump Moscow Tower project. [1] We learned that Michael Cohen lied to lawmakers in Congress when he claimed to have ended the venture in early 2016. Mr. Cohen had continued to work on the Trump Moscow Tower project up until at least May, when then candidate Trump was close to securing the GOP presidential nomination. [2] Candidate Trump promoted Paul Manafort to Campaign Chairman around this time to corral delegates at the GOP convention, it was at this stage of the campaign where Trump began to publicly change his policy towards Ukraine and Russia. [3] Felix Sater, a long time business associate of the President that was working on this project with his childhood friend Michael Cohen, was in contact with a former GRU officer during the duration of the venture. ^[4]

#### Russia's multi-pronged cyber attacks:

Russian cyber interference goes far beyond hacking election systems. The Department of Homeland Security and the FBI have accused the Russian government of a multi-stage intrusion campaign targeting the U.S. energy grid. These attacks included critical infrastructure in energy, nuclear, commercial facilities, water facilities, and aviation facilities. Here is the report by the United States Computer Emergency Readiness Team where analytic efforts undertaken by DHS and the FBI have found a multistage intrusion campaign perpetuated by the Russian state. This isn't fake news, the United States is under cyber attack from Russia.

This joint Technical Alert (TA) is the result of analytic efforts between the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). This alert provides information on Russian government actions targeting U.S. Government entities as well as organizations in the energy, nuclear, commercial facilities, water, aviation, and critical manufacturing sectors. It also contains indicators of compromise (IOCs) and technical details on the tactics, techniques, and procedures (TTPs) used by Russian government cyber actors on compromised victim networks. DHS and FBI produced this alert to educate network defenders to enhance their ability to identify and reduce exposure to malicious activity.

DHS and FBI characterize this activity as a multi-stage intrusion campaign by Russian government cyber actors who targeted small commercial facilities' networks where they staged malware, conducted spear phishing, and gained remote access into energy sector networks. After obtaining access, the Russian government cyber actors conducted network reconnaissance, moved laterally, and collected information pertaining to Industrial Control Systems (ICS).

Furthermore, the FBI recently thwarted a sophisticated malware system that is linked to Russia's military intelligence agency, the Russian malware has infected hundreds of thousands of routers. The Justice Department has announced actions to disrupt the advanced botnet malware system. It is recommended to restart your router as it may be infected.

Special counsel Robert Mueller files witness tampering indictment against Paul Manafort **and Russian citizen Konstantin Kilimnik** 

Why are these new indictments important?

When Paul Manafort had resigned as campaign manager on the Trump campaign his protege and longtime partner Rick Gates continued to work with the Trump campaign. Gates was in contact with *Person A*, who is former Russian intelligence officer Konstantin Kilimnik, weeks before the election. [1] The former GRU officer also happened to be a long time liaison between Manafort and Russian Oligarch Oleg Deripaska.

Alex van der Zwaan has plead guilty to lying to investigators. Alex van der Zwaan lied to Special Counsel Mueller about the contact he had with Rick Gates and Person A. Van der Zwaan was sentenced to 30 days in prison<sup>[2]</sup> and has been deported back to the Netherlands.<sup>[3]</sup> Before today's indictment the Washtingon Post reported that Person A is former GRU officer Konstantin Kilimnik, a Ukraine-based aide to Paul Manafort.<sup>[4]</sup>

Fourth, the lies and withholding of documents were material to the Special Counsel's Office's investigation. That Gates and Person A were directly communicating in September and October 2016 was pertinent to the investigation. Federal Bureau of Investigation Special Agents assisting the Special Counsel's Office assess that Person A has ties to Russian intelligence service and had such ties in 2016. During his first interview with the Special Counsel's Office, van der Zwaan admitted that he knew of that connection, stating that Gates told him Person A was a former Russian Intelligence Officer with GRU.

Kilimnik served as a liaison between Manafort and Oleg Deripaska. Manafort has previously denied communicating with Russian intelligence, [5] Special Counsel Mueller seems to be alleging something entirely different.

The FBI has found that a business associate of former Trump campaign chairman Paul Manafort had ongoing ties to Russian intelligence, including during the 2016 campaign when Manafort and his deputy, Rick Gates, were in touch with the associate, according to new court filings.

The documents, filed late Tuesday by prosecutors for special counsel Robert S. Mueller III, also allege that Gates had said he knew the associate was a former officer with the Russian military intelligence service.

Van der Zwaan recorded some of his conversations he had with Rick Gates and Person A, who has been indicted by Special Counsel Mueller - Konstantin Kilimnik. [6]

After years of working with Gates on a report meant to aid a political group in Ukraine, Gates contacted him in 2016 about a foreign criminal case they feared could be filed against van der Zwaan's law firm. Afraid of the situation, the young attorney recorded a phone call with Gates and the unnamed Eastern European associate, and a call with his firm.

Later, when Mueller's office asked about his interactions with Gates and the other person, he lied because he feared his firm might fire him for recording the call, according to the memo.

# A timeline is beginning to come together.

Michael Cohen, the President's personal attorney, told Congressional investigators that he had stopped working on the Trump Moscow Tower project in January of 2016. But a new report has surfaced indicating that Mr. Cohen had continued to work on the Trump Moscow Tower project up until at least May, when then candidate Trump was close to securing the GOP presidential nomination. Candidate Trump promoted Paul Manafort to the role of Campaign Chairman around this time to corral delegates at the GOP convention, it was at this time where the Trump campaign pressured the GOP to make a specific change to the platform. An amendment proposed that the GOP commit to sending lethal weapons to Ukraine to fight Russian aggression was softened considerably at the request of the campaign. Furthermore it was at this stage of the campaign where Trump began to publicly change his policy towards Ukraine and Russia. Ukrainian authorities were cooperating with Special Counsel Mueller, but Ukraine's Chief Prosecutor has frozen all 4 investigations into Manafort for fears of angering President Trump. Ukrainian authorities stopped cooperating with Special Counsel Mueller after the Pentagon approved the sale of missiles to Ukraine.

Moreover, we know Paul Manafort offered to give a Russian billionaire private briefings on the campaign trail, the oligarch was Oleg Deripaska. [11] Paul Manafort used a campaign account for the aforementioned email correspondence. [12] Gates and Manafort's ties to Deripaska are deep and date back at least a decade. They partnered over a massive real-estate deal in 2008. [13] In 2006 Paul Manafort offered a deal to Russian oligarch Deripaska, Manafort expressed that he would offer a great service in pushing Putin's policies abroad. He was paid very handsomely by Deripaska. [14]

[2]

The International Criminal Court declared Russia's invasion of Ukraine a crime. [3] We can't forget the consequences of this conflict in Ukraine, including Russia's role in the 298 deaths from a commercial airliner that was shot down over Ukraine. [4] The European Commission has warned that Russia has been very successful at spreading disinformation across the European Union. [5]

So what are Western allies doing about online disinformation campaigns perpetuated by the Russian state that are meant to actively destabilize democracy in the West?

The European Union is fighting back against this disinformation campaign, as Russia is actively destabilizing democracy in the West. [6] The European Union's East StratCom Task Force was set up in response to Russia's disinformation campaign, they've done some great work. [7]

The Task Force's flagship products are its weekly Disinformation Review of pro-Kremlin disinformation stories, its social media accounts and its new website.

In the course of two years, the Task Force has, in addition to substantially improving the EU's outreach and positive eastward communications, developed a strong EU understanding of the tools, networks and objectives of disinformation, and raised awareness among millions, establishing itself as a leading international source of expertise on the issue. A network has been developed across the continent to identify and report disinformation, creating new channels to reach new audiences and track the most prevalent disinformation myths.

The EU vs Disinformation campaign has now identified over 3,500 disinformation cases in 18 languages. The team's research is regularly used and quoted by politicians, governments, state agencies, researchers, think tanks and journalists across Europe and beyond.

It has become evident that the pro-Kremlin disinformation campaign is an orchestrated strategy to broadcast the same false stories in as many languages as possible, through as many channels as possible and as often as possible. Russian authorities are explicit about this too, for example through the Gerasimov doctrine – the amalgamation of war and political activity – as well as in statements by top Russian generals that "false data" and "destabilising propaganda" are legitimate tools.

The aim of this disinformation campaign is to confuse, denigrate, weaken and destabilise the West by exploiting existing divisions or creating new artificial ones. Outright lies are often deployed, but another common strategy is to spread as many conflicting messages as possible, persuading the audience that there are so many versions of events that it is impossible to find the truth. Particularly obvious examples include the clear obfuscation over the downing of flight MH17, Boris Nemtsov's assassination and the bombing of a humanitarian convoy in Syria.

Canada, the country I call home, is also susceptible to Russia's disinformation campaign. A leading NATO expert has warned us that we must be prepared for Russian election interference during the 2019 Federal elections. In April Prime Minister Trudeau discussed cyber attacks, in particular Russian interference, with our 5 Eye allies.

Australian Intelligence agencies identified Russia as the state actor behind a series of cyber attacks that hit 400 Australian businesses as well as the UK and the U.S. [11] Great Britain is set to announce a response to Russia's aggression by proposing an international rapid response unit to counter Russian cyber attacks and assassinations. [12]

#### The President's attacks on democratic institutions and norms

The rhetoric and actions taken by the President - from continuing to berate the fourth estate by referring to the media as \*"fake news"\*[1] to calling his political opponents traitors[2] while he attacks the judicial branch of government without remorse, [3] are just a few examples of his egregious attacks on democratic institutions and norms.

President Trump has referred to the minority party as un-American, he had the audacity to call them traitors for not applauding his speech. [4] This is what autocrats demand, blind loyalty. President Trump recently made a joke about wanting to consolidate his power like his dictator colleague in China, President Xi Jinping. [5] President Trump has repeatedly praised dictators including Putin, Duterte, Erdogan, and el-Sisi; [6]

Trump's fondness for authoritarians may have more to do with how power is wielded than those who exercise it. It just so happens that Western governments have, for the past seven decades, mostly adhered to a system of the rule of law, which empowers institutions rather than individuals. Trump's apparent preference is for a system in which one individual, presumably him, wields that power.

Indeed, his fondness for strongmen and dictators isn't limited to Xi Jinping or any other individual in power now. He has praised Iraq's Saddam Hussein (while also criticizing him as "a bad guy") for killing terrorists. "He did that so good," Trump said in July 2016. "They didn't read them the rights. They didn't talk. They were terrorists. Over."

Trump also said in 2016 that Libya would be better off "if [Moammar] Gaddafi were in charge right now." He once tweeted a quote from Benito Mussolini, the Italian fascist leader, and later defended the tweet, saying: "Mussolini was Mussolini ... It's a very good quote. It's a very interesting quote... what difference does it make whether it's Mussolini or somebody else?"

Trump even said China's brutal crackdown on protesters in Tiananmen Square in 1989 "shows you the power of strength," contrasting the Communist Party's action with the United States, which he said "is right now perceived as weak." Trump made those comments in 1990. When asked about the remarks during the presidential debate in 2016, Trump defended himself and appeared to take the Chinese

Communist Party's view of the events at Tiananmen. He dismissed the deadly military response as a "riot."

President Trump has attacked Western allied nations<sup>[7]</sup> while he has repeatedly publicly admired and supported dictators including Vladimir Putin.<sup>[8]</sup>

Reminder that when Michael Cohen was raided the White House increased calls to fire Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein, this could inevitably lead to an end of Special Counsel Mueller's investigation.

### But why was President Trump spooked by the raid? There were tape recordings seized.

The White House told its allies to go on television and call for the President to fire Rod Rosenstein - an attempt to obstruct and put an end to Special Counsel Mueller's investigation. The rhetoric to fire Deputy AG Rosenstein has increased substantially since Rosenstein signed off on Southern District of New York led raids on the President's longtime personal attorney, Michael Cohen. Moreover, the manner in which a search warrant on an attorney's office being granted would require extraordinary circumstances. It would require signing off from a federal judge that would need to be convinced that investigators are likely to discover criminal activity. The search warrants would require consultation from seniors members of President Trump's Justice Department. At the time of the raid the White House and its allies were gearing up to fire Deputy AG Rosenstein as the White House fears investigators seized tape recordings of conversations between Cohen and President Trump.

### President Trump has attempted to fire Special Counsel Mueller multiple times.

President Trump asked an ally to go on television and call on the President to fire Special Counsel Mueller. President Trump's former lead Russia lawyer, who recently quit, called for an end of Mueller's investigation. In June of 2017 President Trump attempted to fire Special Counsel Mueller, he

was allegedly stopped by White House Counsel Don McGahn when he threatened to resign over the move. [8] In December President Trump wanted to fire Mueller and shut down the investigation again after investigators issued subpoenas for obtaining information about the President's business dealings with Deutsche Bank. [9]

### **Fox News**

Fox News is refusing to cover breaking news revelations with in depth analysis, instead they misrepresent events, obfuscate known information, and peddle debunked conspiracy theories endangering U.S. institutions. <sup>[1]</sup> On the day of President Trump's personal attorney's office raids, Sean Hannity went on Fox and disparaged Special Counsel Mueller claiming that investigators had \*"declared war on the President of the United States."\* <sup>[2]</sup> Then we found out that Sean Hannity was a client of Michael Cohen, he never disclosed this fact until it was discovered at a recent court hearing. <sup>[3]</sup> Furthermore, a report has come out alleging that Sean Hannity speaks to President Trump nearly every weeknight. <sup>[4]</sup> Moreover, when news broke that Trump's former Campaign Chairman Paul Manafort was indicted by Special Counsel Mueller, Fox News ignored the breaking news throughout the day and instead focused on a hamburger emoji. <sup>[5]</sup>

So it doesn't come as a surprise when Sean Hannity and Fox News push incredibly deceitful portrayals of events over the course of Special Counsel Mueller's investigation, omitting facts so that they create an alternate reality that doesn't actually exist. For example when news broke that President Trump attempted to fire Special Counsel Mueller, Fox News host Sean Hannity deflected and changed his story several times within an hour on his show; first by claiming the report was fake news, then defended Trump by claiming that he didn't do anything wrong omitting the fact that in doing so would be

obstructing an ongoing investigation, and finally Hannity cut to a video of a car crash instead of discussing pertinent breaking news. [6]

### **Sinclair Broadcast Group**

Surely Fox News can't be the only cause of this distorted reality millions of Americans are entranced by, can it? You're not wrong to ask this question, so I'll provide another example - Sinclair Broadcast Group. The FCC, under the direction of Ajit Pai, are relaxing regulations in an attempt to allow a pro-Trump news organization to buy out local news stations across the country. Sinclair forces local stations to run pro-Trump news segments. A government organization that is meant to be impartial is tailoring policy to push right-wing propaganda. [7]

Another cause for concern, and increased scrutiny, is what's seen as the company's pronounced political agenda. Sinclair forces its local stations to run pro-Trump "news" segments. In April, they hired Boris Epshteyn, a former Trump campaign spokesman and member of the White House press office, as its chief political analyst. His "must-run" 10-minute political commentary segments unsurprisingly hewed closely to the Trump administration's message. The news and analysis website Slate, referring to Epshteyn's contributions, said: "As far as propaganda goes, this is pure, industrial-strength stuff."

Jared Kushner has admitted that the Trump Campaign struck a deal with Sinclair for pro-Trump coverage during the 2016 election. [8] Sinclair requires stations to air segments that tilt to the right. [9] Just a reminder that 72% of Americans follow local news closely. [10] Keeping this in mind, Sinclair forced all its stations to recite the same script across the country that sounded like something out of a dystopian novel. [11] Sinclair forces stations to air segments created and presented by Boris Epshteyn, a former Trump White House official, 9 times a week. [12]

Sinclair Broadcasting has told employees not to talk to journalists about the prepared scripts. [13] And if you're wondering why more people aren't quitting, Sinclair makes their contracts too expensive to quit. [14]

## **The Gateway Pundit**

Lucian Wintrich, who works for *The Gateway Pundit*, was arrested while speaking at UConn giving a speech entitled "It's OK to be white". [1]

This Quartz article ^[2] explains how the 'It's OK to be white' campaign originated on 4chan and was created to be an intentional inflammatory campaign.

The Gateway Pundit is responsible for writing stories calling the Parkland Student survivors "crisis actors" and spreading false information about the Las Vegas shooter [3]. Questionable "data" from The Gateway Pundit was used by Rep. Steve King to hold hearings concerning bogus right-wing censorship for internet pundits. [4]

Trump is using the Gateway Pundit as reliable source of information to try to undermine the Russia investigation

"SPYGATE is in full force!" Trump exclaimed, citing text messages between the FBI officials Peter Strzok and Lisa Page. "Is the Mainstream Media interested yet? Big Stuff!" But a CNN review of the text messages between Strzok and Page show no evidence to back up Trump's claims that the Trump-Russia investigation started in December 2015. And it appears that Trump was relying on a Fox Business host who suggested there were new, unredacted text messages. But those texts had actually been sitting on a Senate committee website for four months.

Trump tweeted roughly an hour after Fox Business' Lou Dobbs claimed on air that "the FBI May have initiated a number of spies into the Trump campaign as early as December of 2015."

That report came after the far-right website Gateway Pundit seized on a Twitter user and a Reddit forum posting the texts on Monday to claim the FBI was running spies into the Trump campaign in December 2015. [5]

Now, Twitter has received a subpoena for info on several right-leaning accounts pertaining to when they pushed a false narrative after Seth Rich's death.

In March, Aaron Rich filed a defamation lawsuit in response to various conspiracies that surfaced after the unsolved murder of his brother Seth Rich. Rich particularly sued Texas businessman Ed Butowsky, America First Media Group founder Matt Couch, Couch's company America First Media Group and the right-leaning newspaper The Washington Times.

The details of the June subpoena shows that Aaron Rich's legal team at Boies Schiller Flexner LLP is trying to get its hands on a lot of communications sent over various accounts. Attorney Michael Gottlieb listed "primary accounts" for the defendants named above, plus Julian Assange, WikiLeaks, Roger Stone, Kim Dotcom, the website Gateway Pundit and its current employee Cassandra Fairbanks.

The subpoena asked for communications ("tweets, re-tweets, likes or replies on Twitter"), direct messages, documents (including but not limited to video/audio recordings, email attachments, notes, calendars, diaries, etc.) and related metadata about the following "Topics" sent by or to the "primary accounts" mentioned above

The subpoena also asked for communications, directs messages and documents about topics mentioned sent by or to "secondary accounts" from Jan. 1, 2015 to present. A secondary account was one defined as "any Account that communicated with the Primary Account." [7]

The EU and other Western nations are trying to fight back against Russian disinformation campaigns. But it's not enough without U.S. support.

The European Union is fighting back against Russia's disinformation campaign, Russia is actively destabilizing democracy in the West. The European Union's East StratCom Task Force was set up in response to Russia's disinformation campaign, they've done some great work.

The Task Force's flagship products are its weekly Disinformation Review of pro-Kremlin disinformation stories, its social media accounts and its new website.

In the course of two years, the Task Force has, in addition to substantially improving the EU's outreach and positive eastward communications, developed a strong EU understanding of the tools, networks and objectives of disinformation, and raised awareness among millions, establishing itself as a leading international source of expertise on the issue. A network has been developed across the continent to identify and report disinformation, creating new channels to reach new audiences and track the most prevalent disinformation myths.

The EU vs Disinformation campaign has now identified over 3,500 disinformation cases in 18 languages. The team's research is regularly used and quoted by politicians, governments, state agencies, researchers, think tanks and journalists across Europe and beyond.

It has become evident that the pro-Kremlin disinformation campaign is an orchestrated strategy to broadcast the same false stories in as many languages as possible, through as many channels as possible and as often as possible. Russian authorities are explicit about this too, for example through the Gerasimov doctrine – the amalgamation of war and political activity – as well as in statements by top Russian generals that "false data" and "destabilising propaganda" are legitimate tools.

The aim of this disinformation campaign is to confuse, denigrate, weaken and destabilise the West by exploiting existing divisions or creating new artificial ones. Outright lies are often deployed, but another common strategy is to spread as many conflicting messages as possible, persuading the audience that there are so many versions of events that it is impossible to find the truth. Particularly obvious examples include the clear obfuscation over the downing of flight MH17, Boris Nemtsov's assassination and the bombing of a humanitarian convoy in Syria.

Australian Intelligence agencies identified Russia as the state actor behind a series of cyber attacks that hit 400 Australian businesses as well as the UK and the U.S. [3] Great Britain is set to announce a response to Russia's aggression by proposing an international rapid response unit to counter Russian cyber attacks and assassinations. [4]

We are also doing our part to stop Russian disinformation campaigns as they will target our 2019 Federal election. A leading NATO expert has warned us that we must be prepared for Russian election interference during the Federal elections. In April Prime Minister Trudeau discussed cyber attacks, in particular Russian interference, with our 5 Eye allies. Last year the NATO Secretary General warned of Russia being a cyber security threat as they pushed disinformation targeting Canadian soldiers in Latvia, moreover the Communications Security Establishments (CSE - Canadian intelligence agency) has found cyber threats to democratic processes are on the rise globally and that Canada is at risk. Prime Minister Trudeau has publicly called out Russia's disinformation campaign.

### What has President Trump done?

He suggested a joint cyber security unit with Russia to stop election hacking, he got the idea after meeting Putin at the G20 summit. He later backtracked on this ridiculous suggestion after facing harsh criticism.\*\*[10]

I think its a bit premature to equate Nazism and this administration, but it is obvious that this administration and the GOP are embracing authoritarian and Neo-Fascist policies/rhetoric which is absolutely terrifying.

### Unfortunately far right ideas are being normalized in the U.S.

Let's take a look at how the GOP and Trump's administration have normalized this behaviour. President Trump's National Security Advisor John Bolton tapped up an individual with deep ties to Neo-Nazis as the Chief of Staff of the National Security Council. <sup>[1]</sup> President Trump's administration and the Republican party are embracing the populist movement to the far right, we need not look further than the largest Conservative convention in America - CPAC. Sebastian Gorka <sup>[2]</sup> was invited as a guest speaker at this year's annual Conservative Political Action Conference (CPAC). <sup>[3]</sup> Marion Le Pen was too, the more extreme niece of Marine Le Pen. <sup>[4]</sup>

Maréchal-Le Pen displayed much of that paranoia and xenophobia during her 10-minute speech. "France is no longer free today," the 28-year-old said. "After 1500 years of existence, we now must fight for our independence." She went on to bash the European Union, earning cheers from the CPAC crowd. Her remarks echoed Trump's own blood-and-soil rhetoric over the past year.

The European Union, she said, was "an ideology without land, without people, without roots and without civilization." Maréchal-Le Pen soon clarified what she meant, suggesting France was turning "from the eldest daughter of the Catholic Church to the little niece of Islam." She decried what she called the scourge of immigration, bashed globalization, signaled a desire to quit NATO and cozy up to Russia, gestured at her opposition to same-sex marriage, and championed the "historical continuity" of her nation.

They invited the more extreme Le Pen, her aunt Marine Le Pen lost the election in France. The younger Le Pen, Marion, looks up to her grandfather who had been convicted for denying the holocaust. [5] She felt her aunt ran a campaign that was too moderate in France. Far right leaders were invited to speak at the biggest mainstream Conservative convention in America.

It's incredibly sad and frustrating that the alt-right promotion of racial division has been embraced by the mainstream Republican movement, the United States of America is being divided and Russia stands to greatly benefit.

While the GOP is embracing the far right ideology that will create further divisions in the United States, there is another benefactor - the Kremlin. Russia's geo-political aim is to weaken the West through destabilization by sowing division among the population and unfortunately the GOP embracing the far right plays right into the hands of the Kremlin's foreign policy. Policy that's influenced by Neo-Fascist ideologue Aleksandr Dugin's *Foundations of Geopolitics*. Russian operatives used social media to exploit racial and religious divisions during the 2016 election. Democrats in the House Intelligence Committee released 3500 facebook ads that were created by the Internet Research Agency, Russia specifically targeted racial tensions in America.

Russia is actively trying to divide the West and has been for quite some time, be aware that they use inflammatory language online and promote disinformation. [10] The Trans-Atlantic Alliance is under assault from the Trump administration, President Trump continues to alienate long standing allies and divides the West. [11]

The Atlantic alliance, built to contain the Soviet Union in the aftermath of World War II, began to die when the Cold War ended. What kept it alive over the last three decades has been less strategic necessity than a convergence of values — the values of the liberal postwar order. Now, the senior partner of the alliance, the United States, has lost interest in those values. The alliance was already a corpse, but Donald Trump drove the last nail into its coffin when he decided this week to withdraw from the nuclear deal with Iran.

...The American people, meanwhile, preferred to face home. They wanted a pivot to America, and they voted for the candidate who promised to deliver it. It has thus fallen to Trump to deliver the coup de grâce to the alliance that has defined the postwar world. The Iran decision followed his decision to impose tariffs on European aluminum and steel, which followed his decision to withdraw from the Paris climate accords. Trump is no more contemptuous toward European allies than Asian or Latin ones; the only opinion to which he defers is that of his base.

...As a simple matter of geographical proximity, Europe is threatened by conflict in the Middle East as the United States is not. The tidal wave of asylum-seekers from Syria in 2015 upended European politics and exposed a popular vein of xenophobia and illiberalism that has thrown a terrible scare into European elites. Europe simply cannot afford to follow the American lead if the United States is prepared to sow further chaos in the region.

Of course, Europe's old reputation for deference and submission to the United States was reinforced by the spectacle of French President Emmanuel Macron and German Chancellor Angela Merkel visiting the White House in the hope of propitiating the First Bully and then being dismissed with scarcely a "by your leave" — and oh, by the way, we're still coming after your steel industry. But perhaps Europe's leaders

needed the shock. Hours after Trump's announcement, Macron, Merkel, and British Prime Minister Theresa May issued a joint statement reminding the world that the deal had been "unanimously endorsed by the U.N. Security Council" and thus remained "the binding international legal framework" on Iran's nuclear program. European Council President Donald Tusk announced that Trump's Iran and trade policies "will meet a united European approach."

### **Russian Oligarch Vekselberg**

Michael Cohen, President Trump's personal attorney and Republican National Committee Deputy Finance Chairman who is responsible for the bulk of the RNC fundraising efforts, [1] appears to have been soliciting companies for millions of dollars with the promise of access to the President. [2] Michael Avenatti has estimated a total of \$4.4 million in transactions occurred between companies and the President's personal attorney. [3]

A pharmaceutical corporation, Novartis, paid Michael Cohen's shell company \$1.2 million. These payments occured weeks before the new CEO of Novartis had dinner with President Trump during his visit to Davos. AT&T gave him \$600,000. A South Korean aerospace company gave him \$150,000, they claim they used Cohen's services on accounting, but a closer look shows us something much more nefarious was probable;

The arrangement came as the company, backed by state-owned Export-Import Bank of Korea, competes to sell trainer jets to the U.S. Air Force in an auction that could be worth up to \$16 billion.

## And a firm controlled by a Russian Oligarch Vekselberg[8] paid him half a million dollars.^[9]

The Times's review of financial records confirmed much of what was in Mr. Avenatti's report. In addition, a review of documents and interviews shed additional light on Mr. Cohen's dealings with the company connected to Mr. Vekselberg, who was stopped and questioned at an airport earlier this year by investigators for Robert S. Mueller III, the special counsel examining Russian interference in the 2016 presidential election.

Taken together, The Times's findings and Mr. Avenatti's report offer the most detailed picture yet on Mr. Cohen's business dealings and financial entanglements in the run-up to the election and its aftermath. Federal prosecutors in Manhattan are investigating Mr. Cohen for possible bank fraud and election-law violations, among other matters, according to people briefed on the investigation. Stephen Ryan, a lawyer representing Mr. Cohen, declined to comment.

...The payments by Columbus Nova occurred between January and August of last year. Andrew Intrater, the company's American chief executive and Mr. Vekselberg's cousin, donated \$250,000 to Mr. Trump's inauguration, campaign finance records show. He and Mr. Vekselberg attended the event together and met with Mr. Cohen there, according to a person briefed on the matter. Columbus Nova retained him as a consultant soon afterward.

Columbus Nova, the company controlled by a Russian oligarch that paid Michael Cohen, registered a number of websites aimed at white nationalists and the alt-right. [10]

A company at the center of widening questions involving President Trump's personal lawyer Michael Cohen is listed as the organization behind a string of websites targeted toward white nationalists and other members of the alt-right.

Columbus Nova, a company whose U.S. chief executive, Andrew Intrater, and Russian investment partner Viktor Vekselberg have both reportedly been interviewed by special counsel Robert S. Mueller III's team, is listed as the registrant behind a handful of domains for websites named after the alt-right that were created during the 2016 election.

...These sites include Alt-right.co, Alternate-right.com, Alternate-rt.com, Alt-rite.com, and other similar combinations, which were all registered in the two days following a speech given by then candidate Hillary Clinton in August 2016 in which she excoriated the far-right movement known for its extremist, racist, anti-Semitic and sexist viewpoints. The sites are not currently operational.

Moreover, the Russian Oligarch that controlled the firm that gave Cohen half a million dollars was interviewed by the FBI. It was initially reported that agents working with Special Counsel Mueller stopped Vekselberg at a New York airport and searched his electronic devices. Another interesting thing of note is that Vekselberg attended a 2015 dinner in Moscow celebrating RT's 10th anniversary. This gala is infamously known for the photograph of former National Security Advisor Michael Flynn sitting next to Vladimir Putin and his inner circle including high level government officials with incredibly close ties to Russian intelligence agencies. Vekselberg was seated next to the Putin/Flynn table.

### Collusion between Russia and the brother of Secretary of Education DeVos, Erik Prince

George Nader, an adviser to the Emirates and ties to the Trump campaign, is a cooperating witness with Special Counsel Mueller's investigation and has already testified before a grand jury. [1] Nader is well known for his work as an adviser to the United Arab Emirates, but the New York Times has discovered that he has ties to Russia too. [2]

George Nader used his ties to the CEO of a Russian sovereign wealth fund<sup>[3]</sup> to set up the Seychelles meeting between Trump adviser Erik Prince and Kirill A. Dmitriev to establish a Trump-Putin back channel.<sup>[4]</sup> Prince had told Congressional investigators and journalists that his meeting with the CEO of the Russia Direct Investment Fund, Dimitriev, was unplanned and that he just happened to run into him.<sup>[5]</sup> George Nader contests that testimony, Nader says that Prince planned the meeting well in advance.<sup>[6]</sup>

# It should also be mentioned that the wife of Dmitriev is close friends with Putin's younger daughter.^[7]

Kirill Dmitriev, CEO of the Russian Direct Investment Fund, is known to have met with Prince shortly before President Trump's inauguration, and Prince admitted to the meeting while testifying before the House Intelligence Committee late last year.

Six sources cited by the Financial Times say Dmitriev's wife, Natalia Popova, is close friends with Putin's younger daughter, Yekaterina Tikhonova, and also serves as the deputy director of her Innopraktika foundation.

It is likely that Erik Prince lied to Congressional investigators during his hearing. Last month we discovered that a plane linked to the Russian government landed in the Seychelles a day before Erik Prince met with Kirill Dmitriev. The plane is owned by sanctioned Russian oligarch and member of the Duma Andrei Skoch, 6 people arrived in his plane and checked into the same hotel where meetings between Erik Prince and Kirill Dmitriev took place. [8]

Erik Prince is the CEO of infamous private military contractor Blackwater, now operating under the name Academi. [9] Four former members of Blackwater were convicted by a U.S. jury for the senseless murdering of Iraqi civilians, known as the Nisour Square Massacre. [10] Erik Prince led a mercenary group that believed in a last crusade and tortured/murdered Iraqis in the name of Christ. [11]

This administration has done nothing to combat anti-government and extreme right-wing terrorism. On the contrary, they have rescinded previous programs and laws and have created a breeding ground for an increase of hate crime and domestic terrorism. Many of us have been warning that the current political atmosphere, from rhetoric espoused by the media and political figures to the actions taken by this administration, breeds extremity.

In 2009 and 2015 the Department of Homeland Security, as well as the FBI, warned us about the rise of right wing terrorism. Guess what President Trump and this administration did as one of their first acts? Cut funding to programs meant to combat far right terrorism. This action was taken when we know that there is a growing trend of anti-government terrorism. This is a problem for both sides of the political spectrum, for example the left leaning and pro-Bernie However, the majority of terrorist who shot at GOP Congressman Scalise at a baseball game as an example. However, the majority of terrorist attacks are perpetuated by the far right in America. This snippet from a NYT op-ed shows just how ridiculous the terrorism rhetoric has become while this administration ignores white supremacy terrorism. However I find it astonishing that this administration and the GOP/right wing media sphere completely ignore the largest perpetrators of terrorism in America. The frequency of far-right attacks is particularly significant in the United States, where white supremacist, anti-government and neo-Nazi extremists have been responsible for 73 percent of deadly terrorist attacks since Sept. 11, 2001, according to the Government Accountability Office. Also notable is that in many cases, Muslims have become the target of violence.

The United States of America is a victim of 300 violent attacks inspired by the far right every year. A recent example are the three men from Illinois who were charged with a mosque bombing, one of the men drafted a border wall plan for Trump. Ill include this small excerpt from an article by USA Today, I implore everyone to read how right-wing terrorism is rapidly accelerating in America. This all occurred in a single week in May of 2017 and yet President Trump is still waiting for all the facts before he does anything.

- May 20 Richard Collins III, an African American and Bowie State University student, was stabbed to death by Sean Urbanski, a member of a Facebook group called the "Alt-Reich: Nation."
- May 26 Three men in Portland tried to stop white supremacist Jeremy Christian from harassing two women who appeared to be Muslim. For their bravery, the three men were viciously attacked; two were murdered and the third was seriously injured.
- May 27 Anthony Hammond was arrested in Clearlake, Calif. for allegedly stabbing a black man with a machete, after yelling racial slurs. While en route to the Lake County Jail, Hammond threatened to kill the transporting officer and his family once he was released. Hammond was charged with committing a hate crime, among other charges.
- May 28 Two Native American men in Washington State were run over by a pickup truck driven by a white man shouting racial slurs and war whoops. One of the tribal members was killed and the other hospitalized.

All of these attacks were committed by extremists who appear to be inspired by a politically motivated ideology that posits racial, moral and religious superiority and demands violent action to advance it. People are dead or injured because of ideologically motived attacks. Where is the public outrage? Where are the calls for national unity and enhanced security? Why aren't we asking where and how these people were radicalized?

Helk, even National Security Adviser John Bolton tapped up a Neo-Nazi as the Chief of Staff of the National Security Council. [11]

# This administration and the Republican party are embracing a movement to the far right and are being galvanized by fascist ideals.

The GOP in America has embraced the far right and Neo-Nazis into the mainstream. Sebastian Gorka<sup>[1]</sup> was invited as a guest speaker at this year's annual Conservative Political Action Conference (CPAC).<sup>[2]</sup> Marion Le Pen was too, the more extreme niece of Marine Le Pen.<sup>[3]</sup>

Maréchal-Le Pen displayed much of that paranoia and xenophobia during her 10-minute speech. "France is no longer free today," the 28-year-old said. "After 1500 years of existence, we now must fight for our independence." She went on to bash the European Union, earning cheers from the CPAC crowd. Her remarks echoed Trump's own blood-and-soil rhetoric over the past year.

The European Union, she said, was "an ideology without land, without people, without roots and without civilization." Maréchal-Le Pen soon clarified what she meant, suggesting France was turning "from the eldest daughter of the Catholic Church to the little niece of Islam." She decried what she called the scourge of immigration, bashed globalization, signaled a desire to quit NATO and cozy up to Russia, gestured at her opposition to same-sex marriage, and championed the "historical continuity" of her nation.

They invited the more extreme Le Pen, her aunt Marine Le Pen lost the election in France. The younger Le Pen, Marion, looks up to her grandfather who had been convicted for denying the holocaust. [4] She felt her aunt ran a campaign that was too moderate in France. Far right leaders were invited to speak at the biggest mainstream Conservative convention in America.

"Marion is a far-right nationalist like her grandfather, and it's precisely because Marine tried to distance the party from the toxic image of Jean-Marie, to become more mainstream and attract working-class voters, that she opposed her," Haddad told Today's WorldView. "[Marion] distanced herself from her aunt because she thinks her aunt is too moderate, not the other way around."

## The consequences of President Trump's attacks against democratic institutions:

The rhetoric and actions taken by the President - from continuing to berate the fourth estate by referring to the media as \*"fake news"\*[5] to calling his political opponents traitors[6] while he attacks the judicial branch of government without remorse, [7] are just a few examples of his egregious attacks on democratic institutions and norms.

The U.S. Press Freedom tracker found that 34 journalists were arrested and 44 journalists were assaulted in 2017. [8] Helk, a Republican Congressman body slammed a journalist and then went on to win his election bid a few weeks later. [9] Last week we witnessed a senseless massacre occur when a gunman murdered 5 people inside the Capital Gazette newsroom in Annapolis. [10]

America is headed towards incredibly dangerous territory. In the 19th century violence against journalists in America ran rampant before the civil war, many abolitionist editors and newspapers faced mob attacks from the people if they wrote anti-slavery pieces. These mobs were supported by government officials spouting dangerous rhetoric and lies. [11]

President Trump and his administration's treatment of separating children from families that seek asylum in the United States.

President Trump planned to erect tent cities to house illegal immigrants since the start of his Presidency. One of the child detention facilities hired a child case worker that had previously been arrested for child pornography, he has since been removed from his position. One of the companies that operates illegal immigration detention facilities is a top donor for two Republican Congressmen. Democratic Congresswoman Nancy Pelosi has called out her Republican colleagues in the Capitol, while the GOP has claimed that they detest President Trump's actions they refuse to join a Democratic bill that was written to put a stop to the senseless removal of children from their families. Cory Lewandowski, former Trump Campaign Chairman, went on national television and mocked a child with Down Syndrome who had been separated from their family. While President Trump signed an Executive Order to stop the policy of separating families that his administration started as a deterrence, there is no plan to reunite the separated children with their families. Children as young as 3 months are being forcibly removed from their parents care and placed into detention facilities across the United States of America with no hope of being reunited with their families.

Moreover, President Trump and his administration changed their story on their children separation policy over a dozen times before ending it.<sup>[8]</sup> The New York Times fact checks a few of the reasons provided by the administration to justify the child separation policy.<sup>[9]</sup>

The President's hateful rhetoric, his referral to illegal immigrants as "infesting" the United States, is incredibly dangerous and it is not the first time he has alluded to white nationalist talking points. First he tweeted it [10] followed by him saying this as a statement during a speech later in the day. [11] Many have compared his statements to Nazi propaganda. [12]

Social commentators pointed out that history has shown, particularly before and during the Holocaust, that "infest" — a term almost exclusively used to describe vermin — dehumanizes a population and is often a precursor to murder or genocide.

"Democrats are the problem. They don't care about crime and want illegal immigrants, no matter how bad they may be, to pour into and infest our Country, like MS-13," the president tweeted. "They can't win on their terrible policies, so they view them as potential voters!"

One of the most notorious anti-Semitic films produced by Nazi Germany's Ministry of Propaganda was "Der ewige Jude" ("The Eternal Jew"), with input from propaganda minister Joseph Goebbels.

The US Holocaust Memorial Museum says that "One of the film's most notorious sequences compares Jews to rats that carry contagion, flood the continent, and devour precious resources."

# This administration was not prepared to reunite children that had been forcibly separated from their families by the American government.

While President Trump has ended his policy of separating asylum seeking children from their families at the border, thousands remain apart. This morning President Trump's own cabinet stated something horrifying - Human and Health Services Secretary Alex Azar said that no immigrant kids from separated families had been reunited yet. President Trump's administration is holding these children as hostages so that their parents can not legally seek asylum in the United States. Immigration officials have been instructed to ask migrant parents if they want to return to their country of origin with or without their children. In a morning tweet storm President Trump reiterated his position of deporting these families

that are suffering from his administration's monstrous policy of forcibly removing children as young as 3 months from their families without due process. [17]

Two<sup>[1]</sup> Roger Stone aides were subpoenaed a couple of months ago by Special Counsel Mueller.<sup>[2]</sup> During the 2016 Presidential campaign Roger Stone<sup>[3]</sup> made constant braggadocios statements about his ties to Guccifer 2.0, the DNC hacker, and Wikileaks. While Roger Stone has attempted to downplay his communication with Guccifer 2.0, he has admitted to have been in contact with the DNC hacking suspect.<sup>[4]</sup> According to a Daily Beast report, US investigators have identified Guccifer 2.0 as Russian Intelligence Officers that worked for the GRU.<sup>[5]</sup> The discovery was made after a Russian intelligence officer forgot to use a VPN while logging into Twitter and Wordpress.

We also know that Special Counsel Mueller has been asking questions about whether or not President Trump knew of the hacked DNC emails before they were released. They've asked about the relationship between GOP operative Roger Stone and WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange, and why Trump took policy positions favorable to Russia. WikiLeaks should be considered an extension of Russia's 2016 disinformation campaign, we knew that WikiLeaks shared material hacked by the GRU before The Daily Beast report was released.

Moreover, the leading counterargument against the reports of Guccifer 2.0 being a Russian intelligence officer is that they would be too intelligent to forget turning on their VPN. That line of reasoning is wrong. While the system the Russian hackers use is indeed genius, that doesn't mean it's impervious from human error. In fact here is a CSE report from 2011 that elaborates on that point. <sup>[9]</sup> The CSE, Communications Securities Establishment, is Canada's national cryptologic agency that collects foreign signal intelligence in order to inform and alert the Government of Canada to the activities of foreign entities outside Canada. <sup>[10]</sup>

But a 2011 presentation to the NSA and its foreign partners by Canada's signals intelligence agency, the Communications Security Establishment, undermines the notion of a foreign hacker so skilled that a victim would never know their identity. The document calls Russian hackers "morons" for routinely compromising the security of a "really well designed" system intended to cover their tracks; for example, the hackers logged into their personal social and email accounts through the same anonymizing system used to attack their targets, comparable to getting an anonymous burner phone for illicit use and then placing calls to your girlfriend, parents, and roommate.

Just a reminder that long time Roger Stone friend and former Trump campaign aide Sam Nunberg was having a melt down on multiple networks 2 months ago for being subpoenaed by Special Counsel Mueller. He wanted to refuse the court order so that he would not be forced to testify against Stone. He claimed that he didn't have the time to sort through his emails and go to the grand jury court order. [11]

The former Trump adviser made a succession of appearances on US news channels in which he – among many gaffes – called the president an 'idiot' and threatened to tear up a subpoena from Robert Mueller

He spent half a day on national television with the most ridiculous excuses, even going as far as to egg Mueller on to arrest him. He has since said he will cooperate. The subpoena of Sam Nunberg asks for all communications/correspondence with Carter Page, Corey Lewandowski, Donald J. Trump, Hope Hicks, Keith Schiller, Michael Cohen, Paul Manafort, Rick Gates, Roger Stone, and Steve Bannon dating back to 2015.

Roger Stone has been a target of this investigation for quite some time, he has attempted to get ahead of a potential indictment by claiming he is ready to be indicted and that the Russian collusion scandal is a hoax. [14]

A report by the Wall Street Journal confirmed that Roger Stone sought damaging information on Hillary Clinton from Julian Assange during the campaign. The liaison between Assange and Stone, radio host and comedian Credico, was subpoenaed by Special Counsel Mueller in Novermber of 2017.

On July 27 of 2016 at a Florida campaign rally candidate Trump implored Russia to hack Clinton's emails, these new indictments indicate that Russia attempted to hack the Clinton campaign after Trump's statement.^[17]

### This administration is consistently eroding the United States stature as a global leader.

President Trump's administration is exacerbating the decline of United State's influence abroad by destroying long standing relationships with its allies, the consequences of which could be severe. I will provide two examples below; the Trans-Pacific Partnership and the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action - colloquially known as the Iran Nuclear Deal.

First lets begin with America's decline in foreign diplomacy - Former Secretary of State Rex Tillerson completely gutted a formerly functioning State Department essentially crippling US influence abroad. [11] He systematically dismantled the State Department with major cuts to leadership roles, these are career diplomats who have served under different administrations and possess unparalleled experience. [2] I cannot stress enough how important soft power is in terms of maintaining a US sphere of influence. [3] He also shut down the State Department office that oversees sanction policies. [4]

Trump's administration has isolated, removed and failed to replace State Department leaders, as of right now there are 41 out of 188 ambassadors that remain vacant with no nominations. These vacancies include strategic countries such as Turkey, Egypt, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, and Jordan. There is no ambassador to South Korea and the special envoy to North Korea resigned. While President Trump has claimed a victory with North Korea, KJU most recently snubbed a meeting with Secretary of State Mike Pompeo. Instead Kim Jong Un visited a potato farm and when Pompeo left their state propaganda attacked America for "unilateral and gangster like" demands in regards to denuclearization on the Korean peninsula.

Moreover, the administration has indicated they want back in to the Trans-Pacific Partnership for a couple of weeks, they now realize it would have been a great way to counter China's economic influence across the region.^[9] The President's comments still project the *America First* mantra, he still refers to TPP as horrible.<sup>[10]</sup>

Consider the sum of these comments, and Trump is merely suggesting that the United States would be open to participating in a TPP whose provisions furthered the realization of the America First policy. This is not a "return to the TPP" by any measure; they are remarks that seek to jump on the bandwagon of the TPP-11 agreement while effectively calling for a renegotiation of its terms. Having led the TPP-11 negotiations, Japan probably made the right call in coolly describing the prospect of renegotiation as "practically impossible."

TPP was created for the purpose of cementing America's regional influence, its the largest regional trade agreement and does not include China. It was unfortunate that some stipulations favoured American corporations, however when the United States backed off we were able to make the trade agreement much better. The new iteration of TPP, known as The Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP), suspends the intellectual property provisions and mandates all countries adhere to strict labour and environment standards. While the original TPP would have been the largest trade agreement in the world, the total combined gross domestic product of CPTPP would be \$13.5 trillion, that's 13% of the world's GDP.

Over the last few months Treasury Secretary Steve Mnuchin has been open to returning to CPTPP and President Trump's chief economic adviser Larry Kudlow has said that the United States could lead a "trade coalition of the willing" to counter China's influence, which is exactly what TPP was.

Unfortunately for the United States, the 11 signatory nations are moving forward with the trade agreement and there is almost no chance of them re-opening negotiations with President Trump to allow the US back into the deal. [14]

Let's take a closer look at the consequences of pulling out of the Iran deal as an example of the deterioration of United States diplomacy under this administration.

A top State Department official and expert on nuclear proliferation has resigned, <sup>[15]</sup> furthering weakening an already ailing State Department - American soft power diplomacy is in rapid decline as is their decline in stature as a global leader. Trump's administration has threatened European companies with sanctions if they do business with Iran. <sup>[16]</sup> The European Union has decided to release a package of measures to counter the U.S. sanctions as the EU continues to sustain an incentive for Iran's compliance with the Iran nuclear deal. <sup>[17]</sup> While President Trump supporters claim that they can cripple the Iranian economy through harsh sanctions, it is incredibly unlikely as the sanctions regime will be weakened and fractured if opposed by the International Community. The weakened sanction regime may push Iran out of the nuclear agreement as hardliners in Iran will push for a reopening of their nuclear program. This will cause further instability in the Middle East. <sup>[18]</sup>

# The President's attacks on long standing allies juxtaposed against his preference for dictatorships including Russia

Last month President Trump called Prime Minister Trudeau \*"dishonest and weak"\*[1] while he praised brutal dictator<sup>[2]</sup>Kim Jong Un calling him "\*strong, funny, and smart."\*[3] It's insulting that President Trump has cited Canada as a national security threat.<sup>[4]</sup> Its akin to spitting in our faces after the innumerable times we have supported one another. From *Operation Caper* where 6 Americans hid in the Canadian embassy in Iran for 3 months as the Canadian government worked with the CIA to help rescue Americans<sup>[5]</sup> to *Operation Yellow Ribbon* which saw a small Canadian town nearly double in population as they took in 6700 Americans from diverted flights as the tragic events of 9/11 were unfolding, risking our airspace and our country to protect our brothers and sisters south of the border.<sup>[6]</sup>

While he instigates a trade war with allies and denigrates long standing relationships he continues to support Russia. President Trump attacked allies during the G7 summit while he embraced Russia as he advocated for a return of a Russian delegation to the summit. During the G7 meeting President Trump claimed Russia would rather have Hillary Clinton as President of the United States because he's been "Russia's worst nightmare." He then went on to say Russia should be invited back to the summit table. It was formerly known as the G8 summit until Russia invaded a sovereign nation and was subsequently kicked out in 2014. The International Criminal Court declared Russia's invasion of Ukraine a crime. We can't forget the consequences of this conflict in Ukraine, including Russia's role in the 298 deaths from a commercial airliner that was shot down over Ukraine.

## **President Trump's praise for Putin**

President Trump has repeatedly praised dictators including Putin, Duterte, Erdogan, and el-Sisi.[12]

Trump's fondness for authoritarians may have more to do with how power is wielded than those who exercise it. It just so happens that Western governments have, for the past seven decades, mostly adhered to a system of the rule of law, which empowers institutions rather than individuals. Trump's apparent preference is for a system in which one individual, presumably him, wields that power.

Indeed, his fondness for strongmen and dictators isn't limited to Xi Jinping or any other individual in power now. He has praised Iraq's Saddam Hussein (while also criticizing him as "a bad guy") for killing terrorists. "He did that so good," Trump said in July 2016. "They didn't read them the rights. They didn't talk. They were terrorists. Over."

Trump also said in 2016 that Libya would be better off "if [Moammar] Gaddafi were in charge right now." He once tweeted a quote from Benito Mussolini, the Italian fascist leader, and later defended the

tweet, saying: "Mussolini was Mussolini ... It's a very good quote. It's a very interesting quote... what difference does it make whether it's Mussolini or somebody else?"

Trump even said China's brutal crackdown on protesters in Tiananmen Square in 1989 "shows you the power of strength," contrasting the Communist Party's action with the United States, which he said "is right now perceived as weak." Trump made those comments in 1990. When asked about the remarks during the presidential debate in 2016, Trump defended himself and appeared to take the Chinese Communist Party's view of the events at Tiananmen. He dismissed the deadly military response as a "riot."

President Trump has attacked Western allied nations  $^{[13]}$  while he has repeatedly publicly admired  $^{[14]}$  and supported  $^{[15]}$  Vladimir Putin.  $^{[16]}$ 

The Republican presidential nominee told the forum the Russian president "has been a leader far more than our president [Obama] has been".

..."I think when he calls me brilliant I'll take the compliment, ok?" added the businessman.

He said Mr Putin had "great control over his country".

Mr Trump also predicted that if elected in November, "I think that I'll be able to get along with him."

President Trump suggested a joint cyber security unit with Russia to stop election hacking, he got the idea after meeting Putin at the G20 summit. He later backtracked on this ridiculous suggestion after facing harsh criticism. [17] President Trump has repeatedly called the Russian election interference a hoax.^[18]

# **President Trump's ridiculous statements**

I'll never forget this statement from then candidate Donald Trump. He was elected President of the United States of America after incoherent ramblings like this;[1]

Look, having nuclear—my uncle was a great professor and scientist and engineer, Dr. John Trump at MIT; good genes, very good genes, OK, very smart, the Wharton School of Finance, very good, very smart—you know, if you're a conservative Republican, if I were a liberal, if, like, OK, if I ran as a liberal Democrat, they would say I'm one of the smartest people anywhere in the world—it's true!—but when you're a conservative Republican they try—oh, do they do a number—that's why I always start off: Went to Wharton, was a good student, went there, went there, did this, built a fortune—you know I have to give my like credentials all the time, because we're a little disadvantaged—but you look at the nuclear deal, the thing that really bothers me—it would have been so easy, and it's not as important as these lives are (nuclear is powerful; my uncle explained that to me many, many years ago, the power and that was 35 years ago; he would explain the power of what's going to happen and he was right who would have thought?), but when you look at what's going on with the four prisoners—now it used to be three, now it's four—but when it was three and even now, I would have said it's all in the messenger; fellas, and it is fellas because, you know, they don't, they haven't figured that the women are smarter right now than the men, so, you know, it's gonna take them about another 150 years—but the Persians are great negotiators, the Iranians are great negotiators, so, and they, they just killed, they just killed us.

Last week at a campaign rally President Trump went off on a tangent about Elton John, President Trump complained about how no one gave him credit for being a great orator. [2]

"I have broken more Elton John records. He seems to have a lot of records. And I, by the way, I don't have a musical instrument. I don't have a guitar or an organ. No organ. Elton has an organ. And lots of other people helping. No, we've broken a lot of records. We've broken virtually every record. Because you know, look, I only need this space. They need much more room. For basketball, for hockey and all of the sports, they need a lot of room. We don't need it. We have people in that space. So we break all of

these records. Really, we do it without, like, the musical instruments. This is the only musical – the mouth. And hopefully the brain attached to the mouth, right? The brain. More important than the mouth is the brain. The brain is much more important."

In an interview with TIME Magazine in 2017 President Trump slammed the new crown jewel of the U.S. Navy, aircraft carrier USS Gerarld Ford, for having a state of the art Electromagnetic Aircraft Launch System (EMALS) catapult and wanted the aircraft carrier to return to steam power catapult system. [3]

I said, "You don't use steam anymore for catapult?" "No sir." I said, "Ah, how is it working?" "Sir, not good. Not good. Doesn't have the power. You know the steam is just brutal. You see that sucker going and steam's going all over the place, there's planes thrown in the air."

It sounded bad to me. Digital. They have digital. What is digital? And it's very complicated, you have to be Albert Einstein to figure it out. And I said — and now they want to buy more aircraft carriers. I said, "What system are you going to be—" "Sir, we're staying with digital." I said, "No you're not. You going to goddamned steam, the digital costs hundreds of millions of dollars more money and it's no good."

And who can forget his incessant lie of having the largest inaugural crowd in history? [4] During his first day as President he visited the CIA headquarters and went on a tirade in front of a wall dedicated to the men and women who died in the line of service. [5]

"I love you. I respect you," said the president, who ten days earlier likened U.S. spies to Nazi Germany for their role in publicizing an intel dossier packed with allegations that Russian intelligence services have compromising information on him.

..."I have a running war with the media," Trump said. "They are among the most dishonest human beings."

He repeatedly referenced the magnitude of his election victory. "Probably almost everybody in this room voted for me," Trump said. "We're all on the same wavelength, folks!"

At one point, Trump regurgitated parts of his stump speech about how the United States "should have kept the oil" after invading Iraq. "Maybe we'll have another chance," he added. Aside from being physically impossible to sequester billions of barrels of underground oil, that would constitute a breach of international law. U.S. troops are currently embedded with forces of the country that Trump suggested again invading.

### President Trump defending a Neo-Nazi rally with video evidence

[2] The Intelligence Agencies heads unanimously agree that the Russians will attack the 2018 election. [3] The cyber security head of the Department of Homeland Security has stated that the Russians had successfully penetrated voter registration rolls in several states before the 2016 election. [4] President

Trump's administration has retaliated to these attacks on America's institutions and infrastructure by penalizing Russians, unfortunately President Trump did not mention the sanctions nor the election meddling during his statement on the nerve agent attack in Britain. President Trump has repeatedly called the Russian election interference a hoax. A bipartisan Senate investigation led by Republican Senator Burr found that Putin interfered in the 2016 U.S. election to specifically help Donald Trump.

# President Trump's administration has done little to mitigate the threat of Russia attacking the 2018 midterm election.

U.S. officials, including former National Security Advisor General H.R. McMaster, have claimed that this administration has not done enough to dissuade Russian meddling. Most recently President Trump put the brakes on new economic sanctions on Russia, a day after U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Nikki Haley laid out a preliminary plan to impose new sanctions. This decision by President Trump came after the Kremlin denounced the new sanctions plan as *international economic raiding*. Furthermore, NSA Director Admiral Rodgers testified to Congress that Trump has given no order to counter Russian election meddling. While former National Security Advisor General H.R. McMaster warned of Russian election meddling and publicly denounced their continued attacks, he was removed by President Trump and John Bolton took his place. National Security Advisor Bolton has been pushing to eliminate a top Cyber-Security position in the White House as he attempts to reorganize the National Security Council. Council.

## Russia's multi-pronged cyber attacks:

Russian cyber interference goes far beyond hacking election systems. The Department of Homeland Security and the FBI have accused the Russian government of a multi-stage intrusion campaign targeting the U.S. energy grid. These attacks included critical infrastructure in energy, nuclear, commercial facilities, water facilities, and aviation facilities. Here is the report by the United States Computer Emergency Readiness Team where analytic efforts undertaken by DHS and the FBI have found a multistage intrusion campaign perpetuated by the Russian state. This isn't fake news, the United States is under cyber attack from Russia.

This joint Technical Alert (TA) is the result of analytic efforts between the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). This alert provides information on Russian government actions targeting U.S. Government entities as well as organizations in the energy, nuclear, commercial facilities, water, aviation, and critical manufacturing sectors. It also contains indicators of compromise (IOCs) and technical details on the tactics, techniques, and procedures (TTPs) used by Russian government cyber actors on compromised victim networks. DHS and FBI produced this alert to educate network defenders to enhance their ability to identify and reduce exposure to malicious activity.

DHS and FBI characterize this activity as a multi-stage intrusion campaign by Russian government cyber actors who targeted small commercial facilities' networks where they staged malware, conducted spear phishing, and gained remote access into energy sector networks. After obtaining access, the Russian government cyber actors conducted network reconnaissance, moved laterally, and collected information pertaining to Industrial Control Systems (ICS).

Furthermore, the FBI has attempted to thwart a sophisticated malware system that is linked to Russia's military intelligence agency, the Russian malware has infected hundreds of thousands of routers. [14] The Justice Department has announced actions to disrupt the advanced botnet malware system. It is recommended to restart your router as it may be infected. [15]

### **Special Counsel Mueller's indictment of 25 Russians:**

Last week the Justice Department indicted 12 Russian intelligence officers linked to Guccifer 2.0 and their role in hacking Clinton and the DNC.[1] The Russians had access to information on 500,000 voters.[2]

The Russians allegedly hacked America's election infrastructure, including state election boards and secretaries of state. The allegations in Friday's indictment went well beyond merely hacking the Clinton campaign and Democratic campaign committees. From one state election board, the Russians managed

to steal information on 500,000 voters, Rosenstein said, although he did not identify which state. Trump won the 2016 election by winning three key states by slim margins that added up to around 80,000 votes.

Earlier this year Special Counsel Mueller indicted 13 Russian nationals and 3 Russian entities for election interference. The Russian election meddling operation was a sophisticated attack against the West. This operation was funded through Russian fronts, including a catering company run by a close friend of Putin, Yevgeny Prigozhin. They used stolen American identities. Operatives bought political ads on social media sites. Operatives visited the United States, traveled across 9 states and discussed escape routes if they were caught inside the country. Operatives bought equipment including burner phones and SIM cards. The operation included hundreds of employees and millions of dollars, Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein put it best - the Russians conducted information warfare during the election. According to the indictment Prigozhin met Mikhail Bystrov, a leader of the Internet Research Agency (IRA), regularly in 2015 and 2016. Prigozhin funded the Internet Research Agency and their meddling of the American election. This was a sophisticated operation that spanned over several years. Prigozhin has been Putin's go to guy for under the table missions, including recruiting mercenaries for the conflicts in Ukraine and Syria.

I think the DNC should be ashamed of themselves for allowing themselves to be hacked. They had bad defenses and they were able to be hacked. But I heard they were trying to hack the Republicans too. But, and this may be wrong, but they had much stronger defenses.

The President of the United States does not care to protect Americans from ongoing Russian aggression. Russia is actively attacking America's infrastructure and elections while President Trump continues to ignore the issue. Trump's own Director of National Intelligence was sounding the alarm just last week. [2]

The U.S. intelligence chief warned on Friday that the threat was growing for a devastating cyber assault on critical U.S. infrastructure, saying the "warning lights are blinking red again" nearly two decades after the Sept. 11, 2001, attacks.

Russia, China, Iran and North Korea are launching daily cyber strikes on the computer networks of federal, state and local government agencies, U.S. corporations, and academic institutions, said Director of National Intelligence Dan Coats.

Of the four, "Russia has been the most aggressive foreign actor, no question," he said.

He lied again to cover for Russia. Russia did hack the Republican National Committee, they just haven't leaked anything about the GOP. [3]

Russia hacked into Republican state political campaigns and old email domains of the Republican National Committee but there is no evidence it successfully penetrated President-elect Donald Trump's campaign, FBI Director James Comey said on Tuesday.

Not only does he ignore the issues and blame Americans, he continues to protect Russia.

President Trump's response to Russia's multi-pronged cyber attacks, from their malware botnets to their attacks targeting the U.S. energy grid and election systems, has been near non-existent.

The United States Intelligence Agencies have confirmed that a foreign nation interfered with the 2016 American election process. [1] We know two dozen state's election systems came under attack. [2] The Intelligence Agencies heads unanimously agree that the Russians will attack the 2018 election. [3] The cyber security head of the Department of Homeland Security has stated that the Russians had

successfully penetrated voter registration rolls in several states before the 2016 election. [4] President Trump's administration has retaliated to these attacks on America's institutions and infrastructure by penalizing Russians, unfortunately President Trump did not mention the sanctions nor the election meddling during his statement on the nerve agent attack in Britain. [5] President Trump has repeatedly called the Russian election interference a hoax. [6] A bipartisan Senate investigation led by Republican Senator Burr found that Putin interfered in the 2016 U.S. election to specifically help Donald Trump. [7]

# President Trump's administration has done little to mitigate the threat of Russia attacking the 2018 midterm election.

U.S. officials, including former National Security Advisor General H.R. McMaster, have claimed that this administration has not done enough to dissuade Russian meddling. Most recently President Trump put the brakes on new economic sanctions on Russia, a day after U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations Nikki Haley laid out a preliminary plan to impose new sanctions. This decision by President Trump came after the Kremlin denounced the new sanctions plan as *international economic raiding*. Furthermore, NSA Director Admiral Rodgers testified to Congress that Trump has given no order to counter Russian election meddling. While former National Security Advisor General H.R. McMaster warned of Russian election meddling and publicly denounced their continued attacks, he was removed by President Trump and John Bolton took his place. National Security Advisor Bolton has been pushing to eliminate a top Cyber-Security position in the White House as he attempts to reorganize the National Security Council.

# Russia's multi-pronged cyber attacks:

Russian cyber interference goes far beyond hacking election systems. The Department of Homeland Security and the FBI have accused the Russian government of a multi-stage intrusion campaign targeting the U.S. energy grid. These attacks included critical infrastructure in energy, nuclear, commercial facilities, water facilities, and aviation facilities. Here is the report by the United States Computer Emergency Readiness Team where analytic efforts undertaken by DHS and the FBI have found a multistage intrusion campaign perpetuated by the Russian state. This isn't fake news, the United States is under cyber attack from Russia.

This joint Technical Alert (TA) is the result of analytic efforts between the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). This alert provides information on Russian government actions targeting U.S. Government entities as well as organizations in the energy, nuclear, commercial facilities, water, aviation, and critical manufacturing sectors. It also contains indicators of compromise (IOCs) and technical details on the tactics, techniques, and procedures (TTPs) used by Russian government cyber actors on compromised victim networks. DHS and FBI produced this alert to educate network defenders to enhance their ability to identify and reduce exposure to malicious activity.

DHS and FBI characterize this activity as a multi-stage intrusion campaign by Russian government cyber actors who targeted small commercial facilities' networks where they staged malware, conducted spear phishing, and gained remote access into energy sector networks. After obtaining access, the Russian government cyber actors conducted network reconnaissance, moved laterally, and collected information pertaining to Industrial Control Systems (ICS).

Furthermore, the FBI has attempted to thwart a sophisticated malware system that is linked to Russia's military intelligence agency, the Russian malware has infected hundreds of thousands of routers. The Justice Department has announced actions to disrupt the advanced botnet malware system. It is recommended to restart your router as it may be infected.

The DNC has received a lot of flack for not doing enough and I agree to an extent. While there are a number of things we can critique DNC Chairman Tom Perez for I think it's important to recognize what he and the DNC have said and done so far.

Tom Perez called Russia's attacks against the American democratic institutions an "act of war." He made it clear that Special Counsel Mueller's indictments are "not a witch hunt." He has repeatedly called out the GOP for being toothless, he found it appalling when the GOP were muted in their

response to Trump campaign aides being indicted. [3] Tom Perez has defended the DNC's decision to sue Russia, Wikileaks, and the Trump campaign. [4]

Appearing on ABC's This Week on Sunday, Perez said he was "not in the least" concerned by Trump's bluster.

"The beauty of the civil justice system," he said, "is that it's not trial by tweet. This isn't going to be a kangaroo court with [House intelligence committee chair and Trump backer] Devin Nunes. This is going to be a court where facts matter and justice is served. And if they want to relitigate all of their wild theories, there's this thing called rule 11 where you get sanctioned for trying to do things like that."

...Responding to a claim by Trump 2020 director Brad Parscale that the suit was merely a fundraising ploy by a "desperate, dysfunctional and nearly insolvent Democratic party," Perez told NBC's Meet the Press: "Those are almost the precise quotes we heard from the Nixon campaign in 1972."

He has called President Trump a "bully," he has claimed that Trump and the GOP do not represent American values and said that Trump and Paul Ryan "don't give a shit about people." Tom Perez shares many of our values, including the fact that the GOP must be held responsible for the Trump administration's agenda. [6]

Tom Perez, head of the Democratic National Committee, said he plans on tying every Republican to President Trump's message in the 2018 midterm, Politico reported Tuesday.

"On a basic level, this president is the antithesis of Martin Luther King," Mr. Perez said in Politico's "Off Message" podcast. "And more than that, Dr. King once said, 'To ignore evil is to become an accomplice to it.' "

Come midterms, if DNC Chairman Tom Perez's comments are any indication, the DNC will be holding the Republican party's feet to the fire. Tom Perez recognizes how dangerous President Trump is, comparing him to a proto-fascist from an Eastern European country. [7]

At the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day breakfast at the Mayflower hosted Monday morning by Al Sharpton's National Action Network, Perez let some more of that rip. "I don't know whether that was sincere ignorance or conscientious stupidity, but I think it's a little of both," he said of the House speaker. As for Ryan's counterpart in the Senate, "I don't know what Mitch McConnell said because he's in the emergency room getting the sock in his mouth removed."

In the podcast, Perez went with a line about how "our democracy as we know it is at risk," and compared Trump to the proto-fascist leader of a small European country in the former Eastern bloc. "You look at [Viktor] Orbán in Hungary," Perez said. "What did he do when he got into power? He cut the media off at the knees. He attacked the institutions of civil society. He attacked institutions within his own government that were supposed to be independent."

# July 27, 2016. Remember the date. Candidate Trump publicly asked Russia for their help to hack Hillary Clinton, Russia obliged.

During a campaign rally in Florida on July 27, 2016, President Trump called on Russia to help him find Hillary Clinton's missing 30,000 emails. [1] Special Counsel Mueller's new indictment against 12 Russian Intelligence Officers found that on July 27, 2016 Russian hackers known as Guccifer 2.0 hacked Hillary Clinton's emails. [2]

The Conspirators spearphished individuals affiliated with the Clinton Campaign throughout the summer of 2016. For example, on or about July 27, 2016, the Conspirators attempted after hours to spearphish for the first time email accounts at a domain hosted by a thirdparty provider and used by Clinton's personal office. At or around the same time, they also targeted seventy-six email addresses at the domain for the Clinton Campaign.

# June 9, 2016 - A month before candidate Trump publicly asked for help from a foreign adversary, his surrogates met with Russian operatives at the now infamous Trump Tower meeting.

One of the Russian operatives present at the infamous Trump Tower meeting, Rinat Akhmetshin, has ties to Russian intelligence and has a history of being embroiled in court cases related to hacking campaigns. He also has ties to Paul Manafort. [3]

He has an association with a former deputy head of a Russian spy service, the F.S.B., and a history of working for close allies of President Vladimir V. Putin. Twice, he has worked on legal battles for Russian tycoons whose opponents suffered sophisticated hacking attacks, arousing allegations of computer espionage.

Few episodes from Mr. Akhmetshin's past seem more relevant to Mr. Mueller's investigation than his work for two Russian billionaires accused of infiltrating their adversaries' computers during nasty legal battles.

The Trump Tower meeting in June 2016 took place less than a week before revelations that hackers had penetrated the Democratic National Committee's computers and obtained a trove of emails. Investigators have traced digital espionage to Russian spy agencies.

During the same period that Mr. Akhmetshin was accused of being involved in various hacking schemes, he appears to have been nurturing a relationship with Viktor Ivanov, once the deputy head of Russia's intelligence service, the F.S.B., and until last year a top aide to Mr. Putin.

Mr. Akhmetshin told journalists that he was a longtime acquaintance of Paul J. Manafort, who served as a high-paid consultant to Mr. Yanukovych for years before becoming chairman of the Trump campaign.

## August 22, 2017 Senate Intelligence Committee Testimony

The Senate Judiciary committee testimony of Fusion GPS CEO Glenn Simpson was released unilaterally by Senator Feinstein because Republicans refused. Simpson confirms that the Trump campaign likely received foreign intelligence aid during the 2016 campaign as Manafort had close ties to Russian Intelligence. [4]

A. I mean, one of the key lines here in the second paragraph says "However, he and his inner circle have accepted a regular flow of intelligence from the Kremlin, including on his democratic and other political rivals." So the issue with the Trump Tower meeting, as 1 I understand it, is that the Trump people were eager to accept intelligence from a foreign government about their political rivals and that is, you know, I would say, a form of interference. If you're getting help from a foreign government and your help is intelligence, then the foreign government's interfering. I mean, you know, I think that also -- of course, in retrospect we now know this was pretty right on target in terms on what it says. So anyway --

Q. In reference to you think that particular sentence?

A. I mean, it clearly refers to, you know, them being interested in and willing to -- it depicts them as accepting information. What we have seen to date with the disclosures this year is they were at a minimum super interested in getting information.

- Q. And when you're referencing the "disclosures this year," could you just be specific about that.
- A. The Trump Tower meeting.
- Q. So with reference to the June 9th Trump Tower meeting?
- A. Yes. Yes.

Earlier this year Special Counsel Mueller indicted 13 Russian nationals and 3 Russian entities for election interference. The Russian election meddling operation was a sophisticated attack against the West. This operation was funded through Russian fronts, including a catering company run by a close friend of Putin, Yevgeny Prigozhin. They used stolen American identities. Operatives bought political ads on social media sites. Operatives visited the United States, traveled across 9 states and discussed escape routes if they were caught inside the country. Operatives bought equipment including burner phones and SIM cards. The operation included hundreds of employees and millions of dollars, Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein put it best - the Russians conducted information warfare during the election. According to the indictment Prigozhin met Mikhail Bystrov, a leader of the Internet Research Agency (IRA), regularly in 2015 and 2016. Prigozhin funded the Internet Research Agency and their meddling of the American election. This was a sophisticated operation that spanned over several years. Prigozhin has been Putin's go to guy for under the table missions, including recruiting mercenaries for the conflicts in Ukraine and Syria.

### **Object of the Conspiracy;**

28.. The conspiracy had as its object impairing, obstructing, and defeating the lawful government functions of the United States by dishonest means in order to enable the Defendants to interfere with US political and electoral processes, including the 2016 US presidential election.

### Manner and Means of the Conspiracy:

- 29.. Starting at least in or around 2014, Defendants and their co-conspirators began to track and study groups on US social media sites dedicated to US politics and social issues. In order to gauge the performance of various groups on social media sites, the ORGANIZATION tracked certain metrics like the group's size, the frequency of content places by the group, and the level of audience engagement with that content, such as the average number of comments or responses to a post.
- a. KRYLOVA and BOGACHEVA, together with other defendants and co-conspirators, planned travel itineraries, purchases equipment (such as cameras, SIM cards, and drop phones), and discussed security measures (including "evacuation scenarios") for Defendants who traveled to the United States.

#### **Use of US Social Media Platforms**

32.. Defendants and their co-conspirators, through fraud and deceit, created hundres of social media accounts and used them to develop certain fictitious US personas into "leader[s] of public opinion" in the United States.

### **Use of US Computer Infrastructure**

39.. To hide their Russian identities and ORGANIZATION affiliation, Defendants and their co-conspirators - particularly POLOZOV and the ORGANIZATION's IT department - purchases space on computer servers located inside the United States in order to set up virtual private networks ("VPNs"). Defendants and their co-conspirators connected from Russia to the US based infrastructure by way of these VPNs and conducted activity inside the United Sates - including accessing online social media accounts, opening new accounts, and communicated with real US persons - while masking the Russian origin and control of the activity.

40.. Defendants and their co-conspirators also registered and controlled hundreds of web-based email accounts hosted by US email providers under false names so as to appear to be US persons and groups. From these accounts, Defendants and their co-conspirators registered or linked to online social media accounts in order to monitor them; posed as US persons when requesting assistance from real US persons; contacted media outlets in order to promote activities inside the United States; and conducted other operations, such as those set forth below.

## **Use of Stolen US Identities**

41.. In or around 2016, Defendants and their co-conspirators also uses, possessed, and transferred, without lawful authority, the social security numbers and dates of birth of real US persons without those persons' knowledge or consent. Using these means of identification, Defendants and their co-conspirators opened accounts at PayPal, a digital payment service provider; created false means of identification, including fake driver's licenses; and posted on ORGANIZATION - controlled social media accounts using the identities of these US victims.

## **Actions Targeting the 2016 US Presidential Election**

- 42.. By approximately May 2014, Defendants and their co-conspirators discussed efforts to interfere in the 2016 US presidential election. Defendants and their co-conspirators began to monitor US social media accounts and other sources of information about the 2016 US presidential election.
- 43.. By 2016, Defendants and their co-conspirators used their fictitious online personas to interfere with the 2016 US presidential election. They engaged in operations primarily intended to communicate derogatory information about Hillary Clinton, to denigrate other candidates such as Ted Cruz and Marco Rubio, and to support Bernie Sanders and then-candidate Donald Trump.
- 45.. Defendants and their co-conspirators also used false US personas to communicate with unwitting members, volunteers, and supporters of the Trump Campaign involved in local community outreach, as well as grassroots groups that supported then-candidate Trump. These individuals and entities at times distributed the ORGANIZATION's materials through their own accounts via retweets, reposts, and similar means. Defendants and their co-conspirators then monitored the propagation of content through such participants.
- 46.. In or around the latter half of 2016, Defendants and their co-conspirators, through their ORGANIZATION-controlled personas, began to encourage US minority groups not to vote in the 2016 US presidential election or to vote for a third-party US presidential candidate.
- 47.. Starting in or around the summer of 2016, Defendants and their co-conspirators also began to promote allegations of voter fraud by the Democratic Party through their fictitious US personas and groups on social media. Defendants and their co-conspirators purchased advertisements on Facebook to further promote the allegations.

### **Political Advertisements**

48.. From at least April 2016 through November 2016, Defendants and their co-conspirators, while concealing their Russian identities and ORGANIZATION affiliation through false personas, began to produce, purchase, and post advertisements on US social media and other online sites expressly advocating for the election of then-candidate Trump or expressly opposing Clinton. Defendants and

their co-conspirators did not report their expenditures to the Federal Election Commission, or register as foreign agents with the US Department of Justice.

A few weeks after President Trump launched his Presidential Campaign he was asked a question by a Russian activist on what he would do about Russian sanctions, Trump responded by suggesting that he would rescind the sanctions. <sup>[1]</sup> The Russian that posed the question was Maria Butina, a woman named in the Fusion GPS Congressional testimony.

Maria Butina is a protege of reputed Russian mobster and Putin ally Alexander Torshin, below I will explain who Torshin is and his extensive ties to the NRA;

We know powerful Russians have close ties to the NRA and are being investigated for funneling millions into the organization. This influx of money from Russia is being investigated by FBI Counterintelligence as the NRA's campaign contributions during this Presidental election doubled previous campaigns. [2] It was at an NRA convention where it was planned that the Trump campaign meet with Alexander Torshin, an ally of Vladimir Putin, a reputed mobster and deputy governor of the Russian central bank. [3] Alexander Torshin is wanted in Spain in connection to a money laundering operation for a Russian crime syndicate. [4] Alexander Torshin reportedly told a Trump campaign adviser that he could arrange a back-channel meeting between President Trump and President Putin. [5] The House Intelligence Committee testimony of Fusion GPS CEO Glen Simpson was released, in it he testifies that Russia had infiltrated the NRA and other conservative groups in America. [6]

MS. SPEIER: Okay. What is the interest of Russia with the National Rifle Association?

MR. SIMPSON: I think that most of what we have found is pretty much out there now. You know, it's been said by others, but, you know, what eventually - it appears the Russians, you know, infiltrated the NRA And there is more than one explanation for why. But I would say broadly speaking, it appears that the Russian operation was designed to infiltrate conservative organizations. And they targeted various conservative organizations, religious and otherwise, and they seem to have made a very concerted effort to get in with the NRA. And so there is a Russian banker-slash-Duma member-slash-Mafia leader named Alexander Torshin who is a life member of the NRA. And we spent a lot of time investigating Mr. Torshin. And he is well known to Spanish law enforcement for money laundering activity, and you have

probably seen the press articles. And I think the Spanish files on him should be available to you. And he, as you know, was supposed to have a meeting with President Trump after the inauguration. And somebody noticed that there had been some stories about him that weren't pretty good. So he is one of the more important figures, but, you know, another woman with whom he was working, Maria Butina, also was a big Trump fan in Russia, and then suddenly showed up here and started hanging around the Trump transition after the election and rented an apartment and enrolled herself at AU, which I assume gets you a visa.

MS. SPEIER: You said there were other conservative groups. Are there other conservative groups in the United States that they have infiltrated to your knowledge?

MR. SIMPSON: I think there's been -we have done some research on some religious groups having relationships with the Russians, having, developing, and pursuing relationships with various religious groups. The names of them escape my mind. But there has been a lot of that. And then there has been the independence movements, California independence, Texas independence. You know, it's a big operation.

### NPR did amazing piece uncovering the depth of Torshin's ties to the NRA.

This piece of investigative work is a must read. The National Rifle Association may have been compromised, Torshin boasts of his incredibly close ties to NRA executives including being invited by NRA leadership to be an election observer in 2012. A reputed Russian mobster was invited by the NRA to observe the 2012 Federal Election, this is how close his ties to the NRA are. [7]

On his verified Twitter account, Torshin talked about how he knew Donald Trump through the NRA, citing a connection at the group's 2015 convention. Responding to a tweet about comedian Larry David accusing Trump of being a racist, Torshin said he knew the businessman through the NRA, and defended him.

"I saw him in Nashville" in April 2015, Torshin added later, the date and site of the NRA's 2015 convention. Trump gave a speech at that convention, the outlines of which would become familiar as his stump speech throughout the 2016 presidential campaign. The White House did not respond to repeated requests for comment by NPR, but denied Trump has ever met Torshin to Bloomberg News in 2017.

Torshin has used his repeated trips to NRA conventions to cultivate relationships with top NRA officials. And his Twitter account documents that he has personally met with every person who has been president of the NRA since 2012.

On Twitter, Torshin portrayed these meetings as more than merely casual encounters. In 2017, he tweeted that he was bringing a gift to then-NRA President Allan Cors, and suggested he was familiar with Cors' hobbies.

In a public DropBox album that Torshin linked to from his Twitter account, he's seen meeting with former NRA president Jim Porter, as well as former NRA president David Keene.

His tweets suggest a longtime relationship with Keene, who repeatedly appears in photos as Torshin documents his visits, suggesting that their meeting was not merely coincidental. Keene did not respond to a request for comment.

Torshin has also met the current president of the NRA, Pete Brownell. Brownell was part of an NRA delegation that visited Moscow in 2015.

These relationships that he cultivated appeared to open another door. Torshin came to the United States in 2012 as an international election observer, and watched as ballots were cast during the Obama-Romney presidential contest in Tennessee. This was possible, he wrote, due to his NRA links.

"Tennessee resident Kline Preston requested Mr. Torshin to be an international observer in November 2012," Adam Ghassemi, a spokesman for the Tennessee Secretary of State, told NPR. The Washington Post reported last year that Preston, a Tennessee lawyer, was the one who originally introduced Torshin to former NRA president David Keene back in 2011.

# July 16, 2018 Justice Department charges and arrests Maria Butina for conspiracy to act as an agent of the Russian Federation.

Maria Butina has been arrested and charged, the affidavit had this interesting nugget; [8]

On October 4, 2016. U.S. Person 1 sent an email to an acquaintance. The email covered a number of topics. Within the email, U.S. Person 1 stated, "unrelated to specific presidential campaigns, I've been involved in securing a VERY private line of communication between the Kremlin and key POLITICAL PARTY 1 leaders through, of all conduits, the [GUN RIGHTS ORGANIZATION.].

### The Magnitsky Act & Bill Browder

Bill Browder is the reason the Magnitsky Act was enacted. [11] Sanctions against Russian Oligarchs allied with President Vladimir Putin were enacted specifically to put pressure on Putin's authoritative style of

governance. Putin cares about these sanctions because they hurt the relationships he's cultivated with corrupt, powerful officials in the country. He Magnitsky Act was discussed at the now infamous Trump Tower Meeting.

I recommend watching Bill Browder's recent Senate Congressional testimony. He paints an incredible picture of how the Russian government operates and provides a motive for the Russians to work with the Trump campaign. [5]

June 9, 2016 - A month before candidate Trump publicly asked for help from a foreign adversary, his surrogates met with Russian operatives at the now infamous Trump Tower meeting. They discussed the Magnistky Act. One operative has ties to Russian intelligence and has been accused of hacking.

One of the Russian operatives, Natalia Veselnitskaya, is an outspoken opponent of the Magnitsky Act. [8] Trump Jr. admitted to discussing adoptions, which means they discussed Russian sanctions. Moreover, in 2017 at the G20 summit Putin and Trump discussed adoptions and the Magnitsky Act. [9] The other Russian operative present at the infamous Trump Tower meeting, Rinat Akhmetshin, has ties to Russian intelligence and has a history of being embroiled in court cases related to hacking campaigns. [10]

He has an association with a former deputy head of a Russian spy service, the F.S.B., and a history of working for close allies of President Vladimir V. Putin. Twice, he has worked on legal battles for Russian tycoons whose opponents suffered sophisticated hacking attacks, arousing allegations of computer espionage.

The Trump Tower meeting in June 2016 took place less than a week before revelations that hackers had penetrated the Democratic National Committee's computers and obtained a trove of emails. Investigators have traced digital espionage to Russian spy agencies.

During the same period that Mr. Akhmetshin was accused of being involved in various hacking schemes, he appears to have been nurturing a relationship with Viktor Ivanov, once the deputy head of Russia's intelligence service, the F.S.B., and until last year a top aide to Mr. Putin.

July 27, 2016 Candidate Trump looked directly at the camera and publicly asked Russia for their help to find Hillary Clinton's missing emails, the Russian military intelligence (GRU) hacked Clinton thereafter.

During a campaign rally in Florida on July 27, 2016, President Trump called on Russia to help him find Hillary Clinton's missing 30,000 emails. Special Counsel Mueller's new indictment against 12 Russian Intelligence Officers found that on July 27, 2016 Russian hackers known as Guccifer 2.0 hacked Hillary Clinton's emails.

DoJ Indictment of 12 Russian Intelligence Officers Pg. 7 - 8

The Conspirators spearphished individuals affiliated with the Clinton Campaign throughout the summer of 2016. For example, on or about July 27, 2016, the Conspirators attempted after hours to spearphish for the first time email accounts at a domain hosted by a thirdparty provider and used by Clinton's personal office. At or around the same time, they also targeted seventy-six email addresses at the domain for the Clinton Campaign.

# August 22, 2017 Senate Intelligence Committee Testimony that the Trump campaign accepted regular intelligence from the Kremlin during the 2016 campaign

The Senate Judiciary committee testimony of Fusion GPS CEO Glenn Simpson confirms that the Trump campaign likely received foreign intelligence aid during the 2016 campaign. [13]

### Pg. 154 - 155 Senate Judiciary Committee Testimony

A. I mean, one of the key lines here in the second paragraph says "However, he and his inner circle have accepted a regular flow of intelligence from the Kremlin, including on his democratic and other political rivals." So the issue with the Trump Tower meeting, as 1 I understand it, is that the Trump people were eager to accept intelligence from a foreign government about their political rivals and that is, you know, I would say, a form of interference. If you're getting help from a foreign government and your help is intelligence, then the foreign government's interfering. I mean, you know, I think that also -- of course, in retrospect we now know this was pretty right on target in terms on what it says. So anyway --

May 10, 2017 President Trump meets with Russian Foreign Minister Lavrov and Ambassador Kislyak, we know thanks to the Russian press. Ambassador Kislyak is the reason why National Security Adviser Flynn resigned/plead guilty to charges, moreover Attorney General Sessions recused himself from the Russia inquiry due to his contacts with Kislyak during the campaign.

Russian Foreign Minister Lavrov met with President Trump a day after President Trump fired FBI Director Comey. [11] Sergey Lavrov and Russian Ambassador Kislyak entered the oval office, the American press were barred from entering the room. [21] Earlier in the day at one point Lavrov made a joke to the media feigning ignorance of Comey's firing, "Was he fired?" he sarcastically asked. "You are kidding. You are kidding." [31]

It was all smiles Wednesday when President Trump welcomed Russia's foreign minister and ambassador to the United States to the White House. Of course, we only know that thanks to photos from Russia's state news agency. Its photographer was the only one allowed in the meeting, while U.S. journalists were kept out.

That's right. Although the encounter between Trump, Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov, and Ambassador Sergey Kislyak took place in the center of American power, it was Tass, the official Russian news agency, that had the pictures.

...It was a curious choice for a meeting that took place less than a day after Trump fired FBI Director James B. Comey, who was leading the investigation into the Trump campaign's ties to Russian officials.

...Also in attendance was Kislyak, Russia's ambassador to the United States. Kislyak's presence was surprising — he's a key figure in the investigation of the Trump administration's ties to Russia.

## Former Russian Ambassador Kislyak

You may recognize Kislyak as he's at the center of Special Counsel Mueller's investigation. [4]

-One of the people at the center of the investigation, the former Russian ambassador to the US Sergey Kislyak, received \$120,000 ten days after the election of Donald Trump. Bankers flagged it to the US government as suspicious in part because the transaction, marked payroll, didn't fit prior pay patterns.

...Special counsel Robert Mueller's team, charged with investigating Russian election interference and possible collusion by the Trump campaign, is examining these transactions and others by Russian diplomatic personnel, according to a US official with knowledge of the inquiry. The special counsel has broad authority to investigate "any matters" that "may arise" from his investigation, and the official said Mueller's probe is following leads on suspicious Russian financial activity that may range far beyond the election.

-The Russian Embassy in Washington, DC, sent more than \$2.4 million to small home-improvement companies controlled by a Russian immigrant living not far from there. Between 2013 and March 2017, that contractor's various companies received about 600 such payments, earmarked for construction jobs at Russian diplomatic compounds. Bankers told the Treasury they did not think those transactions were related to the election but red-flagged them because the businesses seemed too small to have carried out major work on the embassy and because the money was cashed quickly or wired to other accounts.

### **Disgraced former National Security Adviser Michael Flynn**

National Security Adviser Flynn was fired after it came out that he met with Kislyak several times during the campaign and didn't disclose it. [5] Following this scandal Michael Flynn was charged with willfully and knowingly making false statements to the FBI, 6 he pled guilty and is cooperating with Special Counsel Mueller. [7]

# Attorney General Jeff Sessions Russia Investigation Recusal, Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein & Appointment of Special Counsel Mueller

Moreover President Trump's Attorney General Jeff Sessions met Kislyak during the campaign, [8] he was forced to recuse himself from the Russia investigation. [9] Deputy AG Rod Rosenstein took over the Russia inquiry and subsequently appointed Special Counsel Mueller. [10] Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein is a Republican, who appointed former FBI Director and Republican Robert Mueller as Special Counsel and was lauded by the Republican party, [11] Rosenstein was nominated by President Trump. [12]

While the investigation has led to a few dozen indictments, several arrests, guilty pleas, and President Trump's former Campaign Manager Paul Manafort's imprisonment, the GOP has completely changed their tune as they seek to impeach Deputy AG Rod Rosenstein even though the investigation continues to uncover crimes. [13]

# 4th of July, 2018 a group of Republican lawmakers travel to Moscow and meet Foreign Minister Lavrov.^[14]

Russian state propaganda brazenly asserted that "Trump is ours," and joke that the U.S. lawmakers traveled to Russia \*"to make deals with our hackers, so they can rig the midterms in favor of Trump's team."\*[15]
