An auto insurance appraiser salary can range from \$35,000 to \$130,000 per year. This depends on experience, company size, and industry. The top ten percent of this profession make more than \$100,000 a year, while the lowest ten percent make less than \$46,000 per annum. An auto insurance appraiser's hourly rate is approximately \$29. This salary is well below the national average. To get a better idea of how much you can earn, read on.

The average annual income for an auto insurance appraiser is \$62,520 per year. The highest-paid auto insurance appraiser makes \$88,074 per year. Those in the region earn about \$26 per hour.
