
Critical Suggestions On How To Organize An Argumentative Essay |Guidelines 2021

If you want to make your argument convincing and persuasive then you have to work on its structure and format. There are three different methods that essay writers use to write their essays. We have discussed all three methods below with their major components. You can use any of them that is easier for you.

Classical Method

The first method is the classical method through which you can organize your argument points. It was first used by Aristotle and then later explained by Quintilian and Cicero. The basic components of the classical method are the definition of the issue and its relevant evidence. It is because; there was a belief that when people understand the problem in detail it becomes easier to find the solution. Below is the format of the classical method:

- **Exordium:** It means the introduction of the issue/topic and reason for choosing it
- Narratio: It is also known as the statement of the background to present historical information of the issue to the audience.
- **Propositio:** It is the component that shows the claim of the writer.
- Reuatio: It means a section where the writer addresses the anticipated counterarguments.
- **Peroration:** This is the last section that summarizes the whole essay basically known as the conclusion.

Toulmin Method

This is another method to organize your argument. You can use this method for your **argumentative essay** if you want to give a logical foundation to your opinion or main argument. This method was developed by Stephen Toulmin in 1958. Below is the format of the Toulmin method.

- Claim: This is the part of the essay where the writer presents his main argument.
- **Data:** It is the section of evidence that the writer uses to prove his argument.
- Warrant: It is the bridge in the essay that the writer uses to explain how the evidence supports the argument
- **Backing:** After adding a warrant, writers add more evidence or examples sometimes to support the bridge section.
- **Counterclaim:** It is important to explain the counterclaim of the argument to let the audience decide which argument is correct.
- **Rebuttal**: This component has to be added to prove the counter-argument wrong so that your argument can be justified.

Rogerian Method

This is the third and last method for organizing your argument. This method was developed by Carl R. Rogers who was an influential American psychotherapist. An <u>Essay Writer</u>

should use this method if he wants to find a common ground for his own argument and counter-argument. Below is the format for the Rogerian method.

- Introduction: It explains the issue and objective of the essay.
- Opposing view: It explains the counter-argument without giving your personal judgment.
- **Statement of validity:** It explains the logic of the counter-argument and then presenting your argument to convince the audience that your point is valid.
- **Statement of argument**: This section entirely covers your own stance.
- **Statement of context**: This is a further explanation of your position with the help of an explanation.
- **Statement of benefits**: This is the last section in which you summarize your essay and define the significance of your work.
