MANAGER PREVIEW WITH JOHN ROBERTSON

Last week saw us battle out a dour 0-0 draw against Queen of the South, where both teams struggled to break down each other's defence. Whilst the overhead conditions made things difficult for the players, neither side really did enough to warrant all three points.

It's disappointing to draw at home, we can look at the progress we have made in that exactly a year ago we were delighted with a draw against Queens. It gave us a first clean sheet at home, lifted us on to 4 points and gave us something to build on, after a very poor start to the season as we set about rebuilding the team after relegation.

On Saturday we trudged off disappointed, and as we said to the players, that is a marker as to what they have achieved in the year that now they are looking to win every game that we play in and are disappointed when we don't. We just didn't seem to have that spark in the final third that we have shown most of the season.

As I said after the game, we could have kept playing all weekend and neither side would have looked like scoring. Today we must find that sharpness and clinical aspect to our game as we play a Morton side who capitulated late on after a very even 70 minutes against Ayr last week.


Jonathon will be determined to make sure his players are right up for this game and kick on after a very positive start to the season; we will need to be at our best to ensure that the points stay in the Highlands.

JOE CHALMERS

MIDFIELD MAINSTAY TALKS ABOUT THE SEASON SO FAR

Joe Chalmers started his Inverness career filling in at left-back for, at the time, injured Carl Tremarco and now he is a regular but he finds himself in midfield. Chalmers was a free agent last summer after being released by Motherwell, he had previously rose through the youth ranks at Celtic, from the age of 10 and all the way into their first team.

Chalmers is enjoying learning a new position which wasn't too familiar to him before he signed for the Caley Jags. The 24-year-old said: "I'm really enjoying my football up here, being in that midfield role for the first time in my career but I'm getting used to it now."

"The Gaffer likes me in midfield and I'm really enjoying my football and playing there. I think I still have more to come and I'm still working on it, there are things I need to get better at in being a midfielder. There is still plenty of things for me to learn but I'm working hard every day in training to try and get there, and I just work as hard as I can."

Chalmers has said one of things he is working on and practicing is free-kicks and set pieces. He said: "Taking set pieces is something that I enjoy doing and the Gaffer likes me being on them, it's just about practicing. It something that you have to practice, you can't just turn up and expect to do it."

"We do practice set pieces in training so it's just trying to get it right, of course there is





always going to be some bad ones but it's just about practicing as much as possible."

"Set Pieces are something that are very important for us though, as we have a big height advantage over some of the teams with some of the boys being very good at attacking the ball. So, the pressure is on me or whoever it is to put the right balls in as it's a good way for us to get some goals this season."

Chalmers had a brief loan spell at Falkirk while he played at Celtic with him working under current Livingston boss Gary Holt. This season, Livingston are among the top four in the Premiership after winning the play-off final against Partick Thistle last season.

Chalmers thinks Livingston are a source of inspiration as he said: "I loved my time at Falkirk when Gary Holt was the manager, he played some really good football too. He played me every week so I was grateful to him for giving me the experience when I was young and I'm delighted he is doing so well."

"I think Livingston are showing what can be done if you get on a roll, believe in what you are doing, stick to that and everyone gives one hundred percent. It just shows where it can take you."

Looking to today's game, Chalmers wants the Caley Jags to get back to winning ways at home after last week's goalless draw against Queen of the South. Chalmers said: "We were disappointed with our performance against Queen of the South, I don't think we really got going the whole game. We were pretty flat for some reason; Queen of the South were well organised and gave us a hard game, but we were disappointed. At the end of the day it's a clean sheet and another point so we can't be too down on ourselves." Chalmers is looking forward to this afternoon's match against Morton but expects a tough match against the Ton. He said: "We're looking forward to the game as we always do, Morton always gave us a tough game last season with all the games being pretty close. It's going to be pretty tight but we're looking forward to it and we know we need to try and improve our home form, we've had too many draws at home so hopefully we can start picking up the wins starting Saturday."

"We've come a long way since last season, we're sitting third in the table and unbeaten but we're still disappointed we've let some points slip, especially at home. We've have come a long way but overall it has been a good start, now we just need to keep the points ticking over and keep ourselves near the top of the table for the rest of the season."

It was a summer of considerable change at the Ton after Jim Duffy's departure and they have brought in Charlie Telfer (Almere City), Denny Johnstone (Colchester Utd), Connor Bell (ICTFC), Chris Miller (St Johnstone), Ryan Scully (Partick Th), Rory McKeown (Warrington Town), Jim McAlister (Blackpool), Reghan Tumilty (Ross County), Gregor Buchanan (Livingston), Kyle Thomson (Loyota Ramblers), Kerr Waddell (Dundee), Scott Tiffoney (Livingston) and Ross MacLean (Motherwell).

Morton suffered a heavy 5-1 defeat to Ayr Utd in their last match at Cappielow, the players will be looking for a response today. Michael Tidser has hit three goals this season for the Ton and is their current top scorer. The club currently sit 6th, after taking 9 points from their opening 7 matches.

THROWBACK MACKAY MAKES HISTORY

ICTEC 3-0 PETERHEAD 07.10.17, IRN-BRU CUP, CALEDONIAN STADIUM, INVERNESS

Almost exactly one year to the day, Daniel Mackay became the youngest goalscorer in the history of Inverness Caledonian Thistle at 16 years and 171 days.

Mackay also became the youngest player to ever play for the club as he came off the bench for Ricky Calder against Peterhead in the IRN-BRU Cup. Mackay beat the previous record set by Liam Polworth, who made his debut at 16 years and 211 days.

In the tie, Liam Polworth had the Caley Jags ahead after just 2 minutes and Ricky Calder extended the lead just after the break with a cool finish.

Mackay's moment come late in the match as he nodded in from close range to become the club's youngest ever debut scorer, beating the previous record set by Wayne Addicoat at 17 years and 166 days.

Inverness would go onto win the IRN-BRU Cup with Mackay setting up the winner for Carl Tremarco in the final. He would make 10 appearances off the bench during the 2017/18 season and also scored against Falkirk at The Falkirk Stadium.

Doran played through Tom Walsh in the box but he saw his effort blocked on its way to goal.

Stephen Dobbie was teed up by Gary Harkins from 30 yards and his effort came off the crossbar.

The draw puts ICTFC third in the table and only three points behind league leaders Ayr Utd.

The club is also delighted to announce that it is in the process of signing up to the Scottish LGBT Sports Charter.

The charter was developed in consultation with sports governing bodies (SGBs), other sports stakeholders and LGBT people.

The charter has five principles for those delivering sport in Scotland to sign up to.

1. Take steps to actively involve LGBT people in sport and visibly support LGBT inclusion and equality.

2. Challenge homophobic and transphobic behaviour and ensure a positive and welcoming sporting environment for LGBT participants.

3. Develop policies and practices that are inclusive, informed by a better understanding of the issues and barriers for LGBT people and by taking advantage of training.

4. Work to further include trans people in sport by understanding the differing needs for trans participants and begin to reduce the barriers which prevent trans people from taking part in sport in their acquired gender.

5. Strive to make continuous improvements to greater include LGBT people in Scottish sport.





ICTFC CODE OF CONDUCT

Inverness Caledonian Thistle FC will not tolerate unacceptable conduct at the Tullloch Caledonian Stadium or any away football stadia.

Unacceptable conduct is conduct which is deemed violent or disorderly.

Violent conduct is any actual, attempted or threated physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property. Disorderly conduct includes:

Conduct which stirs up or sustains or is likely to or is designed to stir up or sustain hatred or ill will towards people or groups of people based on their membership of the following categories:

- Gender, Race, Nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.
- Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.
- Sexual orientation
- Transgender Identity
- Disability
- Or against an individual who is perceived to be a part of such group
- Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct
- Displaying or writing anything which is abusive or insulting
- Using words or conduct or displaying any writing or other thing which indicated the support or affiliation to, or the celebrating of, or opposition to an organisation or group proscribed in the terms of the terrorism act of 2000

All persons entering the Tulloch Caledonian Stadium on a matchday are subject to these rules, including employees and volunteers of ICTFC whilst discharging their duties.

Any person who engages in unacceptable conduct will be liable for sanctions imposed by the club, which may involve possible criminal proceedings, ejection from the stadium, withdrawal of a season ticket and/or exclusion from future matches at the club.
