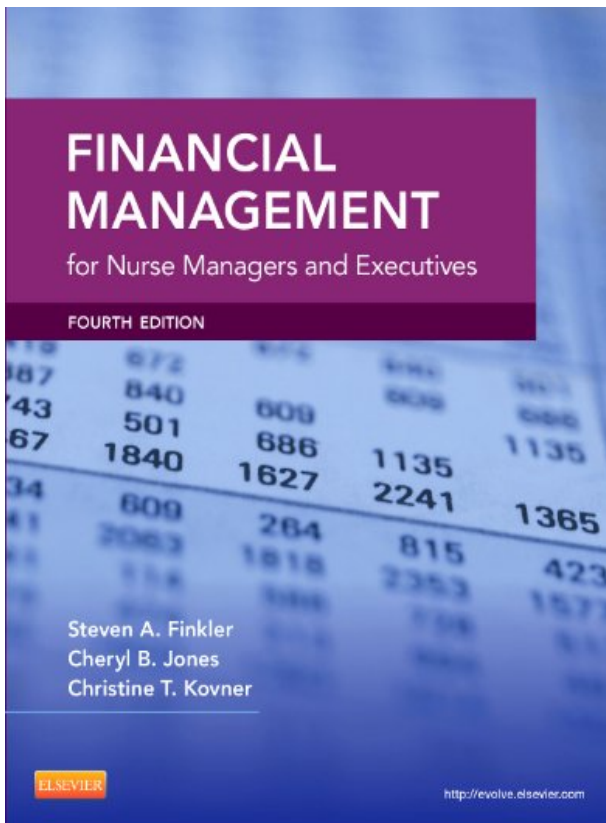

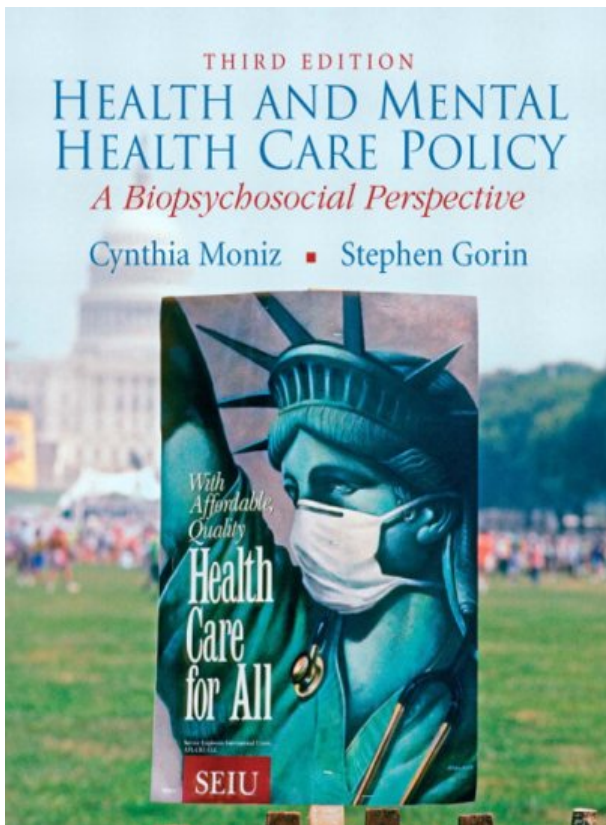


Financial Management for Nurse Managers and Executives (Finkler, Financial Management for Nurse Managers and Executives)

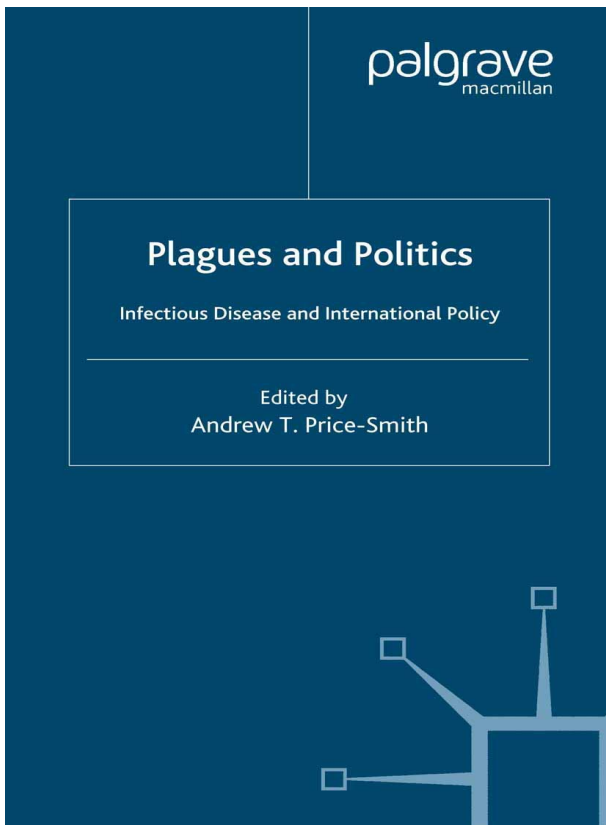
Health and Mental Health Care Policy
