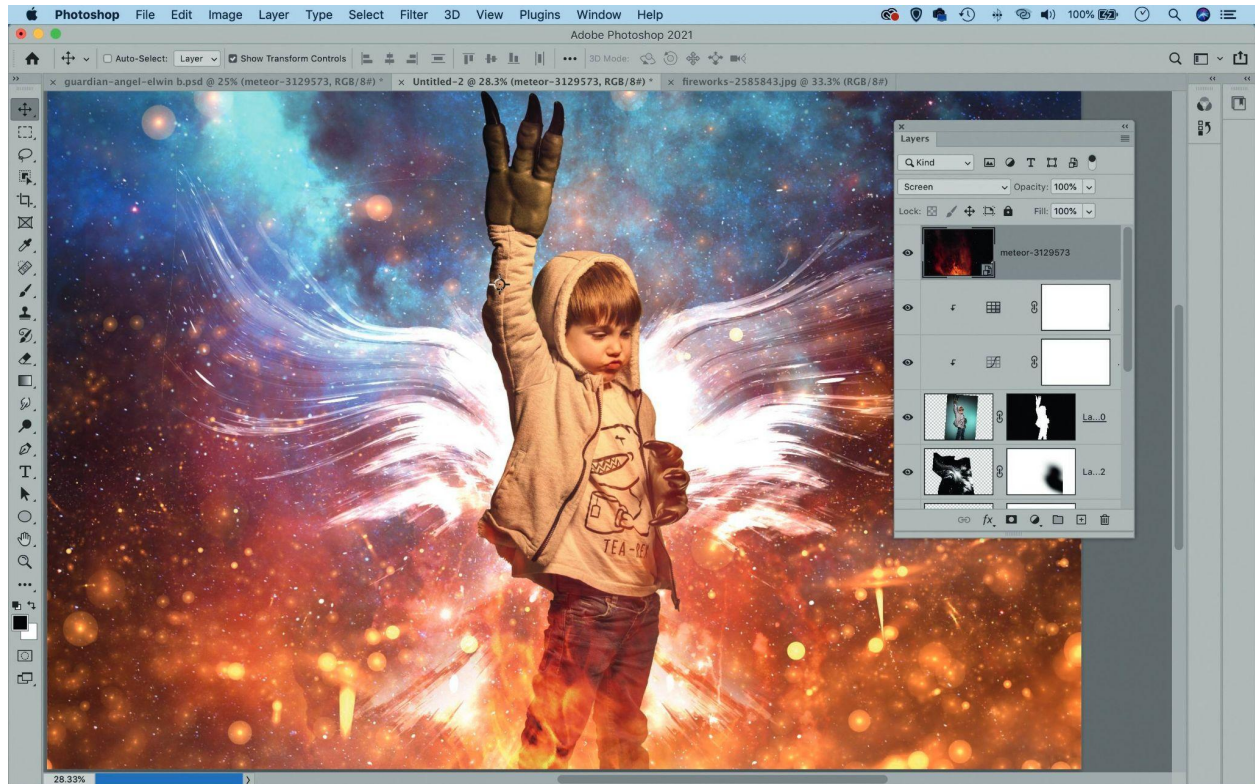


How to Hire a Freelance Photo Editor: The 7 Best Ways To Find the Perfect Person
