Cost & Space

These two factors are not only important when choosing storage options, but they also go together. The idea of renting more space than you require is not a good idea if you are in a financial crunch. If you do not have the space you need, then you will be unable to get the most out of the storage space you have at home.

Decide how much room you'll require. Take into consideration what you wish to store. Also give yourself some room to access the items that you have stored. If you're looking to access the boxes of winter clothing for example, you need to have the ability to access those boxes and that isn't possible if you've packed the unit completely top to bottom. You can often see the insides of storage units and determine the space that is there before you rent.

Find out the cost for the unit size you want. Are you able to afford the cost per month? The big question is: Can you afford the cost of a month? If you fail to pay the monthly fee the facility

could take your unit back and then sell your belongings. Don't agree to a rate you cannot pay for. Make sure you compare costs for that unit size. Shop around as monthly rates vary widely from one facility to another. If you are offered a low-rate during the initial few months, make sure to ask what the price will be after that time, too.

Amenities & Services

Price and location will probably aid in narrowing the list of options, but your final choice will be made by the additional features offered by a particular facility. For example, you may need climate controlled storage or extra security or 24 hour access or all three. Check out the features that are available and put greater emphasis on the ones you want. Remember you may pay a little bit more each month for the added services, but should they be of interest to you, and you value them, then it is worth it.
