

# Types of English Riding Saddles

When choosing an English riding saddle, you must know the different types of saddles that are suitable for your horse. Generally speaking, the size of your upper leg determines the kind of saddle you require. The table below shows the different sizes, dependent on the length of your leg. To determine the proper size, sit in an armchair with your feet flat on the ground. Then, push your back against the seat. Find the distance between your tip to your buttocks to the seat.

A stirrup is a small buckle made of leather attached to an English saddle's exterior.
