Since the start of the "War on Terror", chaos and carnage have spread across the Middle East and beyond. Britain's aggressive foreign policy and desire for a place at 'the top table' have resulted in a decade and a half of continuous military intervention, initially in Afghanistan and Iraq but now also in Libya, Syria, Yemen, Somalia and Pakistan.

The UK government is also maintaining a close alliance with the US, whose unhinged President Trump has escalated the bombing in the Middle East, ratcheted up tensions with North Korea and provoked China.

A strong anti-war movement is needed now more than ever as tensions rise with the world's great powers competing for dominance.

At home, the government's 'counterterror' strategy has resulted in a huge rise in racial attacks on the Muslim community in the UK, echoing the scapegoating of minorities in the 1930s.

The government says they have no money for welfare and homes, but they always find the money when it comes

to investing in wars. The billions Britain currently spends on the military budget and on wars could be used to build tens of thousands of homes, to raise wages, to employ tens of thousands of nurses and teachers, and to fully fund A&E services.

Many trade unions are affiliated to Stop the War at national, regional and branch levels. The support of the labour movement is central to the existence of a powerful anti-war movement in Britain. Through greater unity we can advance our common struggle for peace and social justice. We have in turn always called for 'welfare not warfare', realising that the vision of a world without war is inextricably linked with the efforts to build a civilised and just society at home.

Help us to maintain a strong voice of opposition to the disasters of foreign intervention at home and abroad by affiliating your trade union branch or association to the Stop the War Coalition.
