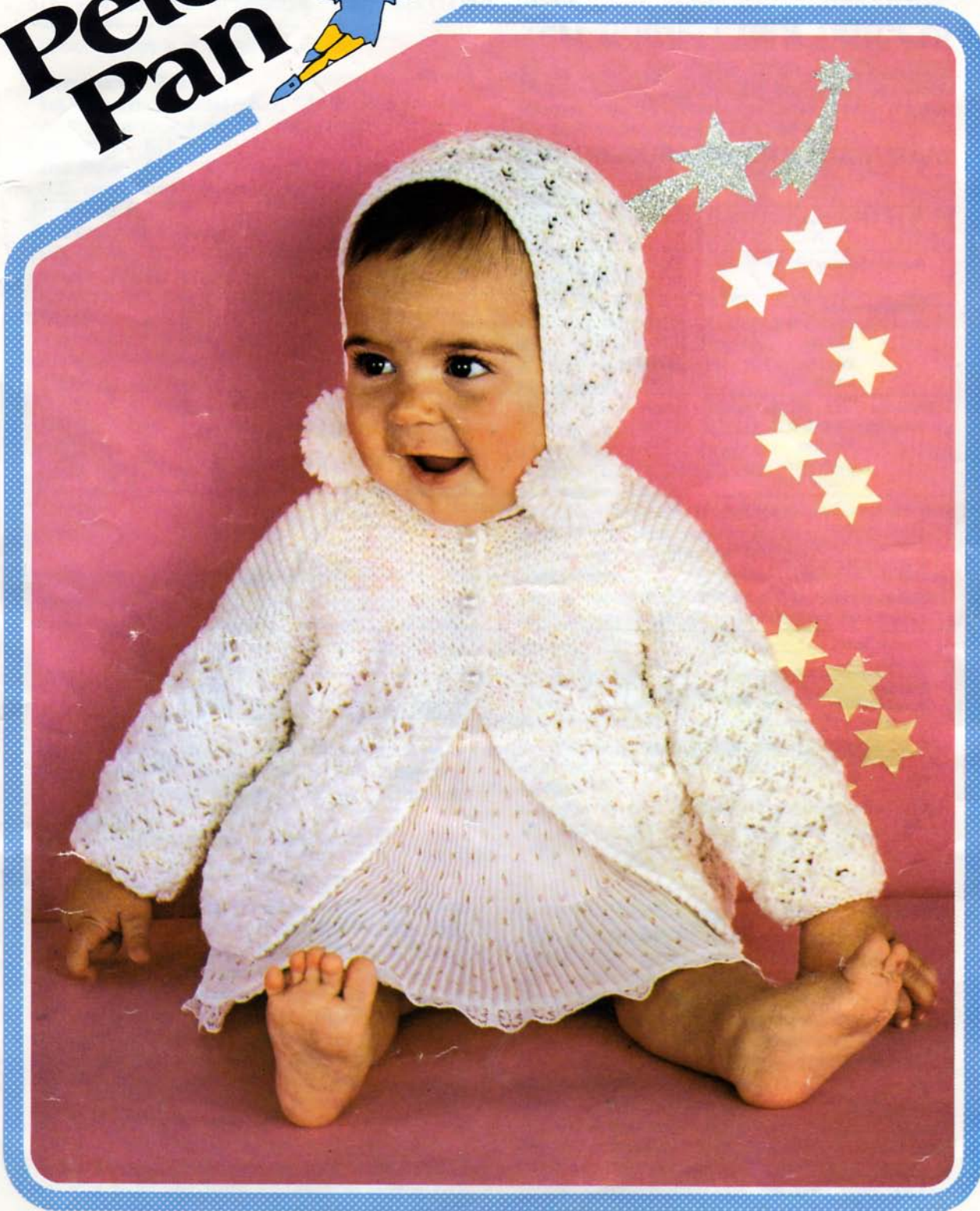

Instructions given for 46 cm. (18 inch) Chest, larger size given in brackets.
Where only one figure is given this applies to both sizes.

2-3¼ mm. (No. 10) and 2-4 mm. (No. 8) Aero Knitting Needles. Stitch Holder. 3 Buttons for Matinee Coat 1 Button for Bonnet			
Matinee Coat	26	26	cm.
Length from Back of Neck	10¼	10¼	ins.
Sleeve Seam	17 6¾	17 6¾	cm. ins.
Bonnet	26	29	cm.
Round face	10¼	11½	ins.

The quantities of yarn stated are based on average requirements and are therefore approximate.

ABBREVIATIONS

K. – Knit; P. – Purl; st(s). – stitch(es); g.st. – garter stitch; tog. – together; beg. – beginning; sl. – slip; inc. – increase; dec. – decrease; rept. – repeat; t.b.l. – through back of loop; y.fwd. – yarn forward; y.r.n. – yarn round needle; D.5 – drop 5, sl. next 5 sts. onto right hand needle dropping extra loops, sl. these 5 sts. back onto left hand needle then P.5tog., leaving sts. on left hand needle yarn round needle P.5tog., sl. all sts. off needle tog.; patt. – pattern; M.B. make bobble (P.1, K.1) twice into next st., sl. 2nd, 3rd and 4th sts. on right hand needle over first st; cm. – centimetres; ins. – inches.

Success will be assured if you...

Use ONLY the Wendy or Peter Pan yarn specified. (We cannot accept responsibility for an imperfect garment if any other brand is used.) Follow our instructions exactly, make certain you have the right tension. Measure (without stretching) to see you're knitting the right number of stitches as stated. Too many? – use larger needles. Too few? – use finer needles. Once the tension is right, the size will be right.

TENSION

11 sts. and 12 rows to 5 cm. (2 ins.) over patt. on 4 mm. (No. 8) Needles.

MATINEE COAT

BACK AND FRONTS (Worked in one piece to armholes)

Using 4 mm. (No. 8) Needles, cast on 129 (141) sts.

Work 4 rows g.st. (every row knit)

Commence Patt.

1st Row (Right Side) – K.1, * M.B., K.5 winding yarn twice round needle, rept. from * to last 2 sts., M.B., K.1.

2nd Row – P.1, * (P.1, y.r.n., P.1) into next st., D.5, rept. from * to last 2 sts. (P.1, y.r.n., P.1) into next st., P.1.

3rd and 4th Rows – Knit.

5th Row – * K.5 winding yarn twice round needle, M.B., rept. from * to last 5 sts., K.5 winding yarn twice round needle.

6th Row – * D.5, (P.1, y.r.n., P.1) into next st., rept. from * to last 5 sts., D.5.

7th and 8th Rows – Knit.

These 8 rows form the patt.

Continue in patt. until work measures 17 cm. (6¾ ins.) from commencement finishing on a 6th patt. row.

Next Row (Dec. Row) – K.6 (12), * K.2tog., K.3, rept. from * to last 3 (9) sts., K. to end. 105 (117) sts.

Knit 2 rows

DIVIDE FOR ARMHOLES

Next Row – K.23 (26), cast off 4 sts., K.51 (57) including st. on needle, cast off 4 sts., K.23 (26). Leave sts. on a spare needle. Break off yarn.

SLEEVES (Both Alike)

Using 3¼ mm. (No. 10) Needles, cast on 28 (30) sts.

Work 3 rows g.st.

Next Row (Inc. Row) – K.3 (2), * inc. in next st., K.1 (2), rept. from * to last 3 (1) sts., K. to end. (39) sts.

Change to 4 mm. (No. 8) Needles.

Commence Patt.

Continue in patt. as given for Back and Fronts until sleeve measures 17 cm. (6¾) ins. from commencement finishing on a 6th patt. row.

Work 2 rows g.st.

Shape Top

Continue in g.st. Cast off 2 sts. at beg. of next 2 rows. (35 sts.)

Sl. sts. onto a spare needle. Break off yarn.

FRONT BANDS (Both Alike)

Using 4 mm. (No. 8) Needles, cast on 5 sts.

Work in g.st. until band is long enough when slightly stretched to fit up Front finishing on a wrong side row.

Sl. sts. onto a safety pin, break off yarn for Left Front Band only.

YOKE

With right side facing, using 4 mm. (No. 8) Needles, K. across 5 sts. for **Right Front Band**, 23 (26) sts. for **Right Front**, 35 sts. across **Sleeve Top**, 51 (57) sts. for **Back**, 35 sts. across **Sleeve Top**, 23 (26) sts. for **Left Front** and 5 sts. for **Left Front Band**. 177 (189) sts.

Next Row – Knit.

Next Row (Dec. and Buttonhole Row) – K.2, y.fwd., K.2tog., K.22 (25), K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.31, K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.47 (53), K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.31, K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.26 (29). 169 (181) sts.

Work 3 rows g.st.

Next Row (Dec. Row) – K.25 (28), K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.29, K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.45 (51), K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.29, K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.25 (28). 161 (173) sts.

Next Row – Knit.

Next Row (Dec. Row) – K.24 (27), K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.27, K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.43 (49), K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.27, K.2tog., K.2tog.t.b.l., K.24 (27). 153 (165) sts.

Next Row – Knit.

Continue to dec. in this manner on every alt. row until 97 (109) sts. remain working buttonhole as before on the following 5th row.

Next Row – K.7, sl. these 7 sts. onto a safety pin, K. to end. Sl. the last 7 sts. onto a safety pin, do not break off yarn, turn.

Shape Neck

Using another ball of yarn, rejoin yarn.

Dec. 1 st. at each end of the needle (neck edge) on every row **at the same time** continue to dec. at armhole shaping as before until 61 (59) sts. remain.

Continue to dec. at armhole shaping only until 29 (35) sts. remain. Sl. sts. onto a st. holder. Break off yarn.

BONNET

Using 4 mm. (No. 8) Needles, cast on 57 (63) sts. Work 4 rows g.st.

Commence Patt.

Continue in patt. as given for Back and Fronts of Matinee Coat until work measures 11 (14) cm. 4¼ (5½) ins. from commencement finishing on a 6th patt. row.

Keeping patt. correct, cast off 18 (20) sts. at beg. of next 2 rows. 21 (23) sts.

Continue in patt. until work measures 9(10)cm. 3½(4)ins. from cast off sts. finishing on a 2nd or 6th patt. row.

Cast off.

PRESSING

With wrong side facing, pin out all pieces to measurements given. Press as instructions.

MAKING UP

Matinee Coat Neckband

With right side facing, using 3¼ mm. (No. 10) Needles, K.7 sts. from right front band, pick up and K.6 (8) sts. up right front neck, K.29 (35) sts. from st. holder, pick up and K.6 (8) sts. down left front neck, K.7 sts. from left front band. 55 (65) sts.

Work 4 rows g.st. working a buttonhole as before on the 2nd Row. Cast off loosely.

Join sleeve and underarm seams by backstitching, join g.st. by top sewing.

Pin bands into position, sew on by top sewing. Sew on buttons.

Bonnet

Join seams by backstitching.

Neckband

With right side facing, using 3¼ mm. (No. 10) Needles, pick up and K.42 (52) sts. round neck edge.

Work 6 rows g.st.

Cast off loosely.

Chin Strap

Using 3¼ mm. (No. 10) Needles, cast on 23 (27) sts.

Work 3 rows g.st.

Next Row (Buttonhole Row) – K.2, y.fwd., K.2tog., K. to end.

Work 3 rows g.st. Cast off.

Sew strap to neckband.


Sew on button.

Make pom-poms. Sew to either side of bonnet as illustrated.

Press Seams.
